

COLDWATCH HINTS

Following these few simple tips can help older people stay warm and well this winter, without running up huge fuel bills.

- Try to keep a constant temperature of 21°C (70°F) in all rooms. If this isn't possible, try to keep one room warm and warm up the bedroom before you go to bed. Close your curtains and use draught excluders to keep the heat in. Wearing a vest or T-shirt under your clothes and a thin scarf or neckerchief indoors will protect you from draughts.

- If you go out, always wear gloves and cover your head with a hat or scarf as a lot of your body heat is lost through you head. Several light layers of clothing under your coat are better than thick bulky layers. Warm insoles in your shoes will keep your feet warm.




