DISTRICT COUNCIL FILL DOCTORS **PRESCRIPTION**

Doctors in Sedgefield District will soon be prescribing exercise as well as medicine, in a new pilot project -"Exercise On Prescription".

This six month scheme, run by Sedgefield District Council and supported Health by the Commission, is being tried out at Addan House surgery in Spennymoor. It aims to improve the health and well-being of local residents.

Councillor Robson, Chairman of the Recreation and Amenities Committee, Sedgefield District Council, said "This is an exciting new development in the area of health and fitness which will enhance the work already going on throughout district"

Under the current schemes patients are urged to go to a leisure centre where a trained member of staff will work with them on an exercise programme. This new scheme encourages those prescribed with exercises to involve a partner or close friend. These couples are then formed into a set of about 20 who can then be introduced as a group to a range of indoor and outdoor activities.

"Not everyone enjoys organised leisure

centre activities, but by introducing the groups to different forms of exercise it is anticipated that patients and friends will find a fitness routine that suits their lifestyle, be it walking or weight training added Councillor Robson.

"We are also working closely with all secondary schools in the area to involve pupils in physical activity sessions and health related issues. This is proving to be a major success and other school year groups rescheduling timetables to take

GREENLINK CAMPAIGN INVOLVES SCHOOLS

Groundwork East Durham is to continue to forge partnerships between schools and businesses in the local area, as part of the "National Esso Greenlink Campaign". Esso Greenlink is a lasting link between business and education built around a shared concern for the environment. It encourages co-operation and mutual understanding. 
She has asked the Police to intervene as there are definite cases of obstruction, but they do not have the manpower to deal with the situation.

4 Star in Aycliffe is between 58.9 and 60.9p per litre compared with outside garages ranging from 56.9 to 57.9p.

We spoke to local garage owner, John Hardy, who denied a cartel exists between garages in the town. "Quite the opposite, we watch each other like hawks, reporting weekly to our respective suppliers on any changes in local prices, and any subsequent loss of our petrol sales. If they show a downward trend prices are altered to compete." said John.

"The situation is changing daily in the oil industry. Next week Newton Aycliffe could be cheaper than Darlington - it is just the luck of the draw." he added.

WINTERTON SITE NEEDED FOR JOBS HOUSING

Dear Sir

The Northern and Yorkshire Regional Health Authority are currently objecting to Sedgefield District Council's wish to see the Winterton Hospital site developed for a business park and housing as part of its Local Plan.

The Health Authority want to be able to sell off most of the site just for housing, as a "Garden Village". Well, they would, wouldn't they? The land values for a purely housing site could be double that for a business park. It is clear that the Regional health Authority are motivated purely by money.

The Government's "Internal Market" health system obliges the Health Authority to pursue maximum returns from land assets in order to finance health care. On this occasion, it is at the expense of the wider social objective of wealth creation through expanding employment opportunities.

When the Winterton Hospital was at its peak in the late 1960's it

employed 2500 people, numbers are now less than 400 and declining. With its eventual closure, many of these job opportunities will be lost forever. Villages in this part of East Durham already have high levels unemployment and would benefit from new job opportunities brought by a business

park. It is vital that the future of the Winterton site provides for the job needs of local people. All the local authorities development agencies are agreed on the strategic role of a

business spark on this

If the Regional Health Authority get their way, they say that 250 houses would be built. However, they do not suggest any restriction on actual numbers.

This could mean up to 400 houses being crammed onto the site, damaging its character. No doubt this would give them a handsome profit, I doubt very much that this would be reinvested in the locality to redress the job losses.

CAR BOOT SALE SAFE AT U.M.M.


Rumours that the Car Boot Sale and Market, held weekly at the old UMM Factory, was to close have been rejected by John Noble the organiser.
