County Durham-based microwave oven manufacturer Sanyo is creating 150 new jobs to cope with demand for products incorporating new technology.

They were a lively and

inquisitive group who showed great interest in the manufacture of printed products.

Newton Press received letters and essays from all the pupils and we publish a selection

On Thursday the 23rd of March, me and my class went on a trip to the Newton Press. We went into the shop part were they sold felt pens and

Then a man called Stuart came and he showed us around the factory. First of all he took us to see the computers, he showed us the pictures what they copy of a CD-Rom. We walked out to a door and we went in to the turny door into a room called the dark room. We were shown a big camera that had cost £12,000. They



called it the dark room because it had the camera in it and if there was any light, it would not take properly. It had a red light what had costed £80 for one bulb, then we went back out 2 or 3 at a time. I went with Kimberley and Stephanie, this time. Then we went were all the machines were, first we saw a machine that when the paper came down it went over a roller, inked then printed. Then we went to a machine what was a bit the same as the other machine but a bit faster and bigger. Then we saw the cutting machine, it lifted the paper up and sets it down and gets cut. They need it the same size so that it can go to the paper. They fit it together and the newspapers are ready to be delivered. For being good we got a scrap pad and a note book Kirsty Briggs

A man took us on a trip on a bus, it looked like a holiday bus. It had curtains. When we got there a man called Stuart showed us around the


