PROMISES ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT CHANGES NOW EXPECTED

David Curry sets the agenda for better local government

New Unitary Councils must now deliver on the promises for better local government, Local Government Minister David Curry said today. At the same time, he added, County Councils which promised a more effective two-tier government had to turn their commitment into firm action.

Speaking at the Society of Chief Personnel Officers Annual Conference in Brighton, Mr Curry said: "The outcome of the local government review is now largely decided. Supporters of unitary status for local authorities and those who favour keeping the two-tier county system both made claims during the review about how things would be improved under their preferred options. Now is the time for councils to deliver on the promises."

"In unitary authorities, I expect to see clear evidence from day one that with a single tier government you are making better use of resources improving services through better co-ordination and providing clearer accountability and local identity."

"Those of you who pressed for the retention of counties claimed that you could improve the current system in a number of ways. I expect to see more partnership agreements for joint funding arrangements; more local agreements for particular functions to avoid duplication; better co-ordinated access points for customers; and more local consultation."

"We have set the framework which local government has told us can be the basis for the way to carry out tasks in the most efficient and effective way. The promises for future performance which have been made are demanding. The basis on which local government will be judged will be whether or not these promises are met."

"30 YEARS ON AND WE ASK WHAT'S NEW"

O.K. let's be fair, we have swimming baths and sports halls, but... We've lost two community halls, the Boys Club and two schools!" said Marjorie.

"It used to be a pleasing thought that Newton Aycliffe was different from most new towns in that it stood alone and was not an appendage to an already existing community. Now I think we would have been better off as an appendage to Darlington. More than 90 organisations need accommodation and these do not include the people who prefer ready-made lighter entertainment. They are even worse off.

For them we can offer a fortnightly film show in the Beveridge Hall during the winter and spring months.

(Ed. Note we still have no facilities for showing films and no Beveridge Hall)

The one good thing about Carnival Week I am told by the young folk is the fair. It was somewhere to go even if it did cost money.

Not everyone wants so-called culture and clubs. I would suggest the ADC makes a start to combat the boredom of those for whom there is nothing, by converting the Clarence Hall not into a Youth Centre as planned, but an Amusement Arcade.

There must be many more like me who are tired, after a number of years in this town, of hearing nothing but talk on sports centres, youth centres, assembly halls etc. when, whether these people with good intentions like it or not, there are equally as many people and children who prefer the lighter side of life with its cinemas, dance halls, bowling alleys, and one-armed bandits.

It has been this town's unhappy lot to be the victims of backward planning."

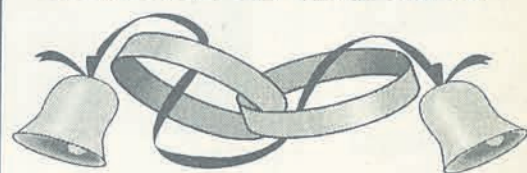

YOUTH CENTRE'S SUCCESSFUL ANNUAL MEETING

GUEST SPEAKER HOLDS AUDIENCE SPELLBOUND!

STEVE HARNESS, guest speaker at Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre's Annual General Meeting, put the President "back on his heels" with a speech, which held everyone spellbound.

He hit out at the establishment and society generally for their attitude and treatment of children today.

"We don't listen to them, and we allow them to be educated in poor conditions and with a lack of resources. Parents are uninterested in their development and I believe the problems we presently encounter with the youth of today is a form of pay back for our neglect and inattention to their needs," said Steve. As Head Teacher at Woodham, Mr Harness was able to speak from experience and authority, and what he had to say created much discussion afterwards.

President of the Youth Centre, John Dormer, proposed the vote of thanks for what he described as the most interesting and thought provoking speeches he had heard for a long time. "As a County Councillor and a member of the Local Education Authority it certainly set me back on my heels and made me think" said John. Earlier the AGM dealt with the annual reports and the election of a new Management Committee.

During the Treasurer's report a £20,000 Appeal was launched for the refurbishment of the Centre's Gymnasium.

To give the Appeal a good kick-start Richard Llewellyn, a Manager at Woodridge on the Industrial Estate, presented almost £800 in sponsorship money which he had collected from his recent London Marathon run on behalf of the Centre.

Richard presented the money to the President, who thanked him most sincerely for his efforts and for being the first donor to the Appeal, which he hoped would meet its target in a year. The Chairman, Syd

Howarth, was able to report another successful year in terms of attendance and activities, though operating costs showed a £700 deficit on the year.

He put the success of the Centre down to the dedication of its staff and volunteers. "Their hard work has brought Newton Aycliffe to the top of the league in service to the community" said Syd.

New Leader, Mike Horne, at his first AGM also paid tribute to the quality of staff whose efforts had contributed to a 13% increase in numbers using the Centre.

Long serving Committee member, Jack Dobson received a gift on his retirement, presented by Syd Howarth who thanked him for his wise contribution to debates.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the County Council had agreed to the Youth Centre's request to use the vacant ex-Avenue School playing fields adjacent to the premises. "We will be allowed to allocate usage of the field for community, recreational and sporting activities until such time as it is decided what development will take place on the whole site," said Syd.

It was a lively and interesting AGM with no shortage of volunteers for positions on the Management Committee.

The evening was rounded off with an excellent buffet prepared by Dawn Hartfree and her young helpers from the Centre.

The first meeting of the Management Committee will be held on the Monday 5th June at 7pm.

WOODHAM CAMPAIGN FOR NEW SCHOOL SUSPENDED

The campaign for a new Primary School at Woodham Village has been suspended as the organisers do not wish to jeopardise the future of existing schools.

Whilst they have 200 signatories and could petition the Secretary of State, to impose an Order on the Durham County Council to provide a school; they are concerned such an action could seriously affect other schools.

"What the people at Woodham requested was additional school places or a new school. Many of the Government Departments involved with our campaign have admitted that they are concerned about size of classes and a new school

at Woodham would release places elsewhere, but there was no money left to build a new school" said a spokesperson.

Counc. Don Fraser has been helping and advising the campaigners and he feels there is little point in carrying on at this time as there was little chance of success in the present circumstances.

"If we pursue a course of action to have a school built now and that failed, due to present circumstances, which I believe it would, it would then consolidate the argument not to provide one at all. I can't think of any Body we could refer to who might uphold our argument just now, when schools may close to take out the 16,500 places the Govt say DCC can cut out of schools, and save money on.

We cannot deny that DCC face extreme difficulties over 'spare places', and Govt policy is that DCC must take them out.

We could hold the issue over or attempt to pursue it. If we try to pursue it and fail, it could be a 'write-off' for the future? If we keep it alive, on hold, we can always try later?

I have to admit that just now is about the worst time ever for trying to get our case through, while closures are more than likely to comply with Govt policies on council savings and Teacher's Pay rise funding. Given all that I believe it might serve our cause best to 'hold' rather than lose completely? Currently, I do not believe we stand a reasonable chance of winning the argument, I'm not being defeatist, just realistic, while Education is in flux?" said Don.
