Eaton Corporation Chairman William E. Butler has named Nora Brewster as a recipient of the company's James R. Stover Award for excellence in servivce to the Aycliffe community. Brewster was one of eight Eaton employees recognised company-wide.

Office Administrator at the company's Transmission Operations in Aycliffe, was cited for her help in raising funds to build a hydrotherapy pool at the Aycliffe Adult Training Centre in Aycliffe.

The pool is the only facility of its kind in the are and provides physical therapy and recreational activities for mentally and physically handicapped people served by the Centre. Nora organised fund raising events among her fellow employees at the Aycliffe plant and formed a group of volunteers in the town, to raise additional funds from the community. In total £100,000 was raised to complete the hydrotherapy pool.

The award was established in the name of former Eaton Chairman and Chief **Executive Officer James** R. Stover, and is given annually to employees who have made an exceptional effort to improve their communities and the lives of their neighbours.

Winners received a commemorative crystal featuring an etching of Stover and £1,000 cheque payable to nonprofit community service organisation of the winners choice. Recipients were also invited to attend an award ceremony at the company's Cleveland Ohio headquarters last month.

"We are firm believers that volunteer service benefits everyone, and ultimately creates better communities for Eaton employees and their families" said Butler.

"Nora has a sister and brother, both mentally handicapped and she helps her mother care for them".

"They attended the Aycliffe Training Centre with my daughter, who later died, and Nora became involved with me in the idea of providing the special

"With Nora's bubbly personality persuasion the project started and she involved Eaton employees who became a vital cog in the organisation" said Matt. The project took 7 years and £1000,000 to complete.

"We encountered many frustrations and I came close to abandoning the idea, but Nora and John Teesdale (another Eaton

Dispensing a prescription seems, on the face of it, a straightforward task. But take a look behind the scenes at the checks and expertise that start from the time your prescription is handed in to when you receive your dispensed medicine - and beyond. - Read and interpret correctly what's on the form sometimes
- Check the prescription is legally correct strict rules apply

He had suffered from a nervous breakdown and decided to keep pigeons to help his recovery.


Finding the pigeons in such a bad state has set him back and he admitted to feeling



TROUBLE BREWS OVER HOSPITAL CASUALTY DEPT. CHANGES

A report has been produced by health service consultants, Newchurch and Company, on behalf of County Durham Health Commission to examine the key factors determining future patterns of acute services in Co. Durham and identify a strategy for the 21st century.

The independent report was requested to identify how County Health Durham Commission could maintain and improve access to services and also provide a range of services in the future to

meet local needs in light of advancing medical technology, such as key hole surgery, increasing specialisation and national recommendations about clinical staffing.

The report will be used

as part of the process to advise the Commission as to the way forward for maintaining and improving acute services in the County for the next century, giving maximum support to development of new hospitals in Durham Auckland.

The report was carried over a three month period from March to May with much of the information contained having been submitted by the County's Acute Hospital Trusts who have assisted with the study.

County Durham Health Commission is considering findings of the report and believes it is important to take into account the specific characteristics of the people living in different parts of County Durham, such as their age, their health needs and how they obtain health services.

Newchurch recommend that a number of clinical departments such as Consultant Accident Emergency services should ideally be concentrated at no more than two sites within the County in order to enhance the quality of services, especially in view of the changing medical staffing requirements nationally.

Over the next few weeks the Commission will be working intensively with doctors and management of the hospitals concerned with the aim of enabling as many services as possible to be provided locally.

SCANDAL OF TOP PAID BOSSES

Britain's low paid are forced to work years to earn what the bosses of Britain's utilities are earning in a month, figures released this week reveal.

The figures, compiled by Shadow Employement Minister Ian McCartney MP as part of Labour's campaign to expose the scandal of low pay in Britain, shows that:

* the average monthly pay for a top water company boss is £18,704.16 - more than the 1.3 million people in Britain earning less than £2.50 per hour could earn in over three and half years.

* the average monthly pay for a top paid electricity company boss is £21,485.16 - more than someone who earns £2.50 per hour earns in four and a quarter years. * the average monthly pay for a top paid boss across all utilities is £21,741.08 per month more than someone who earns £2.50 per hour earns in almost four and a half years.

Commenting on the figures, Mr. McCartney "Conservative policies have created a country where a handful of utility bosses earn more in a month than over a million of their fellow citizens earn in four years".


