## YOUTH CENTRE'S £40,000 APPEAL GETS UNDERWAY

Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre are sprinting towards the £40,000 they need to refurbish the Gymnasium and shower rooms.

Already they have received grants totalling over £10,000 with promises of further help in the pipeline.

The Appeal is capturing the imagination of a lot of people, based on the success of Co. Durham's most used Youth and Community premises.

Over 40,000 people use the Centre each year and the demand is growing - particularly now that the Youth Centre has use of the ex-Avenue School playing fields adjacent, where they intend to promote outdoor sporting and community activities.

There has been a lot of interest from town organisations wanting to use the land which has an all-weather pitch, with potential for football, cricket and tennis etc. The Management Committee want to see lots of activity on the land and will be holding big events there themselves to raise funds for the appeal.

One such event is a "Genuine" Car Boot Sale to be held on 12th August, admission free. Sellers from a car boot pay £5 and another £5 if they have a trailer as well. Traders will definitely not be allowed on the site.

Application for space should be sent to Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre, Central Avenue, Newton Aycliffe along with the fee.

A big public launch day for the appeal is on 9th September, when some major attractions are being staged at the Youth Centre. ## 10 SCHOOLS WIN BIDS FOR TEC FUNDING

Ten Comprehensive Schools in the area have successfully bid for funds from County Durham Training and Enterprise Council to show the benefits of a university education to pupils and their families who would not normally consider higher education.

The project will be managed by Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form College and will involve visits to universities, activity days and publicity materials for 14 to 16 year olds with the aim of raising their expectations and motivation to get good qualifications and to progress to university. The scheme was first piloted at Greenfield school and the success had led to the formation of a local project group

of ten schools. Longfield, Haughton, Branksome, Eastbourne, Hummersknot, Hurworth, Sunnydale, Bishop Barrington, Staindrop and Greenfield are involved plus Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form College, Darlington College of Technology and representatives from local universities. Bob Tuddenham, Vice Principal, said "We are delighted that County Durham TEC have agreed to provide substantial funds to enable this initiative to go ahead. Over the three years we anticipate that more than one thousand pupils will have a better idea of life in university and the advantages of further study to achieve high qualifications."

## OPEN LETTER TO THE ENVIRONMENT MINISTER

### "WOODHAM REPRESENTATION ON DISTRICT COUNCIL IS UNFAIR" says Local Councillor

**Average ratio: 1 Councillor for 1,400 Electors**  
**Woodham Ward: 1 Councillor for 2,629 Electors**

Dear Sir  
I am advised that in the circumstances, as described below, that matter of concern must firstly be referred to yourself for initial consideration, rather than the local Government Commission. Assuming that to be the case, I respectfully submit the following for your considerations, in the hope that you may agree that the Local Government Commission may undertake an Interim Review to remedy the current under-representation of the Woodham Ward on Sedgefield District Council.

expanding, developing Ward, currently the designated prime development area within the Parish of Great Aycliffe, formerly subject to the Aycliffe and Peterlee Development Corporation, The New Towns Commission, and currently in the Sedgefield District. As confirmed in their consultative Local Plan. In the recent Local Elections for The District Council, the Woodham Ward returned Two Members to represent 5,258 Electors. A Ratio of 1:2,629. An Electoral imbalance on the average ratio of 85%. As I understand it, a Plus or Minus 10% is acceptable, we in Woodham Ward exceed that by far the greatest variation in the Council. As I understand it, such imbalances should only be accepted in 'Exceptional Circumstances.' None exist that I am aware of? Previous calls to redress the imbalance

have been to no avail to-date. Moreover, as the Ward is, as above, developing apace with Private Housing New Build all the while, that imbalance increases accordingly, without hope of redress. Unless an Interim Review may be granted to address that undemocratic, unacceptable level of Ratio excess, and representative imbalance endured to-date? I enclose the figures I have of the representation on the District Council by Wards, to demonstrate that without a review the electorate of the Woodham Ward will continue to be seriously under-represented, quite dramatically until 1988/9? May we in the Woodham Ward hope that you may consider the circumstances sympathetically, with a view to alleviating the imbalance and unacceptable level of ratio excess? And the extreme variation endured to-date made subject to a speedy resolution to the benefit of our electors, by increasing Ward Members by one? Given the composition of The Council that would be fair and equitable, achieving a balance rather than an excess of imbalance?

On behalf of The Ward, we hope and trust you may consider sympathetically the creation of a democratic balance and recommend an Interim Review to The Commission to achieve that beneficial increase as speedily as possible? Yours faithfully,

# OPTIMISM MOUNTS FOR RE-OPENING OF VOLUNTEER BUREAU

Dear Sir  
Since the Volunteer Bureau had to temporarily close due to lack of funding, it is still receiving requests for help from other voluntary organisations and individuals who are not aware of their plight.

For example: Oxfam have written to them specifically appealing for local volunteers to help with their recycling project of books and music.

Residents of a local residential home have asked the Volunteer Bureau to find volunteers who would be prepared to push a wheelchair on their day-trips out; and a disabled gentleman has asked for help with his gardening. Several local charities have asked for typing to be done, which was a service the Volunteer Bureau were able to provide when it was open.

People have also been calling in or telephoning the Volunteer Bureau to

offer their services as a volunteer and the Council of Voluntary Services in Darlington have reported an increase in enquiries at their office from the Newton Aycliffe area which also proves there is a need for this type of service in our town.

Rosemary Raine-Howe who is involved in the present campaign to raise approx. £17,000 said "These examples of enquiries are clear evidence that the work of the Volunteer Bureau is essential to our community. If we had been in operation, we could have helped everyone of these people with their problem". The Volunteer Bureau are in the process of making three major grant applications for core

funding and the Management Committee are starting to feel very optimistic. If core funding is secured for at least two years, Aycliffe Town Council have agreed in principle to continue supporting the Volunteer Bureau. Rosemary said "This decision by Aycliffe Town Council is particularly encouraging. It is a positive demonstration from representatives of Newton Aycliffe residents, that we are needed and wanted in the town".

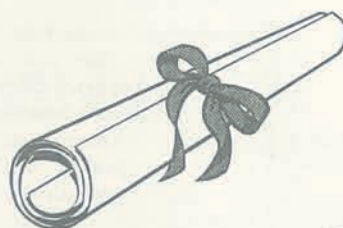

## 22% INCREASE IN CANCELLED HOSPITAL OPS

In the week Labour is expected to launch its health policy document, Margaret Beckett has published new and embarrassing figures showing a 22% increase in the number of cancelled hospital operations in the last quarter of 94/95.

The information is published within a hard hitting dossier of "Killer Facts" and amounts, claims Labour's health spokesperson Margaret Beckett to "evidence of a failed Secretary of State and a failed set of Conservative health reforms".

In the three months 1st January to 31st March 1995, 14500 patients had their operation cancelled at the last minute, a 22% increase on October 1st to December 31st when 11,874 were cancelled. The number of patients not re-admitted within 1 month (as promised by Patients Charter) increased massively from 1,343 to 2,005 or 49%.

In total 48,163 operations were cancelled on the day of, or even the day after, admission to hospital in the year 1994/95 (1-4-94 to 31-3-95), 6161, 13% were not re-admitted within one month.

These cancellations occur against the background of

a sharp reduction in the number of acute hospital beds - down 6% between 1990/91 and 1993/94 from 116,788 to 109,875 - beds the government claim are not needed.

The Rt Hon Margaret Beckett, Shadow Secretary of State for Health, said: "Every cancelled operation is a personal ordeal of considerable inconvenience - they must be kept to an absolute minimum and the trend should be towards less, not more of them".

"It is quite clear that the huge reductions in hospital beds accompanied in some areas by actual hospital closures are placing a tremendous strain on the NHS".

"The Conservative Health 'Reforms' have not only led to greater bureaucracy and ever more privatization but also more cancelled operations and record waiting lists".

"Labour believes it can create a new NHS for a new century. Labour will restore the confidence of patients, doctors and nurses in a National Health Service which we can all once again be proud".

## S.D.C. LAUNCH HUNT FOR PHANTOM FIR TREE DUMPER

A HUNT is being launched by Sedgefield District Council to find the area's phantom fir tree dumper. Piles of old conifer clippings have been found dumped throughout the district. Several roadside spots have been spoiled by the mounds of rotting vegetation. Sedgefield District Council says it's had enough of the constant tidying up and it wants local people to help catch the culprit.

There are various sites throughout the district

where the clippings have been dumped. Favourite haunts include Eldon Bank at Shildon, the road from Rushyford to Bradbury, West Cornforth and lay-bys along the A177.

"This is costing the ratepayer a lot of money," said Bruce Adams, the Council's District Technical Officer. "Every time the clippings are dumped we have to go out and clear them away."

"If we leave rubbish in any one spot for too long, people assume it's a dump

and it draws more waste there like a magnet."

Sedgefield District Council says it wants to hear from anyone who may be able to identify who's responsible for the illegal dumping.

And don't forget that there's no need to dump anything in a lay-by or a field. There are civic amenity sites close to most people. They are open seven days a week. They are at Heighington Lane, Tindale Crescent and Coxhoe.

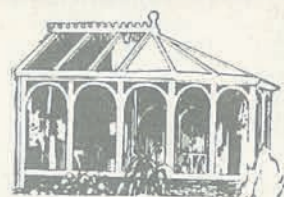

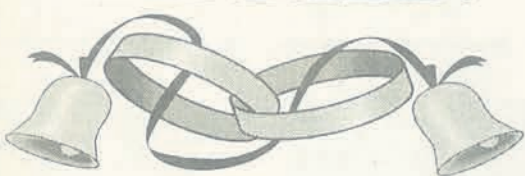
