

The National Animal Sanctuaries Support League based at Newton Ayeliffe accuse S.D.C. complacency in respect of the destruction of unwanted, stray and abandoned dogs.

Chairman, Ray Mackinlay said they are patronising Kevin and Linda Forsyth, who run Deerness Kennels who despatch dogs by means of electrocution. This method is not used by any responsible authority or condoned by Charities such as ours.

The S.D.C. have no policy to discourage breeding by tenants in properties owned by the Council.

N.A.S.S.L. have recently dealt with a family who admitted breeding one hundred and fifty puppies from one bitch over a period of twelve years.

The birth having two litters every year. (The last two puppies were brought to us too late to be saved).

Little wonder that County Durham us the worst County in England and Wales for animal abuse.

Dogs runs loose on the town without any identification contrary to the requirement in law.

When N.A.S.S.L. approached the Council with a view of running a spaying and neutering scheme by way of fund-raising in Ayeliffe Market the offer was met with indifference. The charity has supplied seven thousand engraved identity discs to owners

AVENUE SITE WILL PROMOTE TOWN CENTRE

The District Council has agreed that the site of the Avenue School is a major opportunity for the promotion of Newton Aycliffe Town Centre.

The SDC commissioned a planning study jointly with the County Council and this has been completed.

The 'Local Plan' which sets the policy for the area, is now the subject of a Planning Inspector's Report which will be published this Autumn.

Redevelopment will be integrated with the exisiting Town Centre and guidelines include partly open space use, and where the school buildings stood - new buildings for retail, community recreational facilities.

The site is owned by Durham County Council, while Sedgefield District Council is the Planning Authority.

There have been some enquiries from developers, but the timing of development proposals will depend on ensuring that the conditions for the release of the site, in planning or marketing terms, are correct.

The SDC's role is to ensure that the correct planning framework is in place, so the local community and Town Centre traders can get the full benefit from the site's availability.

Justice and Fairness at Woodham Elections

I HAVE replies from our M.P., the Dept. of Environment, and the Local Government Commission, on my call for an Electoral Review for Woodham Ward.

Our M.P. agrees it is important and has referred it to Tony Blair for his action as well.

The D.O.E. writes of further reviews of the Shire Districts. And that the Secretary of State would need to direct the Commission to undertake a full electoral review of S.D.C. DISTRICT in order address under representation of Woodham Ward.

The Govt. Local Commission have my request on file, to follow up, if directed. The D.O.E. WILL bear Woodham Ward in mind when discussing future workloads of The Local Govt. Commission, and any acceleration needed of reviews.

That is needed urgently to redress the marked imbalance and under representation of our Ward on S.D.C.



CAN YOU ACCOMMODATE A FOREIGN STUDENT?

CAN AYCLIFFE help? 25 Students arrive in England on Sunday with no family to go to at the end of their intensive language and culture course which finishes at the end of August. They each need a family to offer a bed to sleep in and food at the family table, for a school year i.e. September to the end of June. If families aren't found quickly they could have to return home. Have you got space in your family for another person. I did and have enjoyed hosting Students from E.F. ever since. I saw an article like this seven years ago and I rang Gloria who came to my house with a number of portfolios for me to choose the Student that I thought would suit my family. He was called Motohiro, (Moto for short), and he went to Q.E. Sixth Form in Darlington because I worked in the town and felt comfortable with that arrangement. He liked reading and going to the cinema. He was very quiet about the house and very tidy (I'm the opposite of both). He came back for a holiday before he started University in Japan and may come again now that he has finished his Law

I've had four boys up to now and am hosting another next year. They're all been smashing and very different from each other. We've made friends of the other host parents we have met from all over the North East, as well as the Aycliffe area, who have been super people from all Walks of Life. There is a well organised support service for both families and Students so that any little queries can be sorted out quickly, usually by a phone call.

Boys fit most easily into our household, but most of the Students wanting host families are girls. One girl is interested in birdwatching, another is into sewing and craftwork. Could you host someone who enjoys cooking and

wants to learn more? Mujuki has specifically asked for a host in the North East because we are so friendly up here. Another Student is skilled in Ballet, having performed in Glasgow in 1994.

All of them are between 16 and 18 years old and have been carefully chosen for their adaptability. They will attend ordinary English Schools and expect to make teenage friends, and integrate into our local life. They come from all over the world with 'homeless' (at the moment) Students from Canada, France, America, Japan and Hong Kong waiting to be chosen. Please help them experience a year that you and they will remember forever, and its fun too!

I'm sure Aycliffe and Heighington families have room for some Students who are worried that they will have to return to their home countries without having found a family. Ring Gloria Williams on 0191 4107948 if you can help.



EXHIBITION AUCKLAND CASTLE

A SPECTACULAR exhibition which served as the flagship event of Durham Cathedral's 900th anniversary celebrations two years ago is to reopen on permanent display next week (Tuesday 1st August) in Auckland Castle - the historic home of the Bishops of

The exhibition, which traced in vivid and lively style the history of the Cathedral and its role and importance through the ages, was commissioned by Durham County Council.

Situated in the north side of the Cathedral cloisters, it was opened in March 1933 by the then Bishop of Durham the Rt. Rev. David Jenkins and Durham County Council Leader Don Robson, and was intended to serve only as temporary attraction for the duration of the anniversary celebrations.

However, it proved so popular and so durable that it was carefully dismantled, given to the Durham Diocese, and kept in storage hopefully for future use.

On August 1st, the present Bishop of Durham, the Rt. Rev. Michael Turnbull will officially reopen the exhibition which has been found a permanent home in the former medieval kitchens of his official residence at Auckland Castle, Bishop Auckland.

A spokesman for the Bishop said: "The Diocese and the County Council were both keen that the exhibition should not be broken up and scrapped and shared a wish that it might one day be open to the public once again.

"The old kitchens in the Castle were virtually redundant space and it seemed a logical step to put them to better use.

"Thanks to support from the Church Commissioners and the County Council, it will become an added attraction for visitors to the

The exhibition comprises a lively, informative and three dimensional display which traces the origins of the Cathedral, its construction, the important role it played in history and the focus which it has provided for the community.

St. Cuthbert, the charismatic figure who was the inspiration for the Cathedral, and the importance of Christianity in Northumbria also figure prominently.

"We are delighted that his fascinating exhibition, which proved so popular with visitors to the Cathedral, has been found such an impressive and appropriate new home, and we hope it will be seen and enjoyed by many more people for many years to come", said

Tracey Jane Salkeld and her boyfriend Stuart McMurray were both killed in a collision with an articulated vehicle on 30th April 1994, on the Newton Stewart By-Pass in Scotland. As Tracey was a registered donor, two of her heart valves were used to save the lives of two young children, one a 10 month old baby and an 8 year old girl from Holland. Both are now doing fine.

A few months ago, Dr Ivan Consultant Gibson, Pathologist at Dumfries Infirmary, held a meeting of all the relatives of the people who have donated organs. At this meeting it was decided to erect a "GROWING TREE OF LIFE" in memory of the people, who have died and left their organs to be used to save the lives of others. This tree will be sited in the foyer of Dumfries

Infirmary, and will have the names of the donors printed on the leaves. Each time someones organs are donated, a new leaf will be added, (hence the, (GROWING TREE) of Life).

Dr Gibson has already raised money towards this in Scotland, he has authorised me to raise funds in this area, I have already received donations for the Homograph Memorial (Tree of Life), Greenfield School,



WARNING - MORE CHILD CYCLISTS ARE KILLED IN AUGUST!

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS have started, but lessons in road safety should continue throughout the summer, says the AA.

"More than 40 per cent of pedestrians killed or seriously injured are children, and parents and teachers cannot emphasise enough the potential road dangers that youngsters face", says Andrew Howard, the AA's Head of Road Safety.

"Child cyclists are more likely to be killed or seriously injured in July and August than in any other month, and young pedestrians are also at high risk during summer". The AA also urges motorists to be on their guard.

"Areas near schools will be quiet over the next few weeks, but parks and play areas are likely to be awash with children", says Howard. "Drivers must also take special care and stick to speed limits on urban roads - particularly where there is on-street parking.

"We know that one third of children do not stop at the curb or by a parked vehicle before crossing, 37 per cent don't check that the road is clear before walking across, and 20 per cent look in only one direction before they cross".


