SDC JUSTIFY BUILDING ON GREEN SITE

Sedgefield District Council and Durham County Council welcome the opportunity given by the editor of the "Newton News" to give further publicity to the proposed development of land at Heighington Lane West as an extension to the Business Park.

The proposal was first put forward in the Draft Sedgefield District Local Plan which was published over 3 years ago (in June 1992). Public Meetings were held in Newton Aycliffe to discuss the contents of the Plan and people had the opportunity to make comments.

There was a second opportunity when the Local Plan was amended and people again had a chance to comment during a 6 week consultation period in the Spring of 1994. There were no objections to the development of the site. The only formal objections to the Local Plan were on matters of detail such as access and landscaping. These have been considered by an Inspector appointed by the Department of Environment and his report is expected soon. The objections to the development at Heighington Lane West were as follows:

Darlington Borough Council commented that a bridge to this site from Fujitsu Way should be required as part of the development. Sedgefield District Council agrees that the provision of a bridge is necessary to make the site attractive for developers and this will be dealt with in the planning application. Darlington Borough Council has, therefore, withdrawn this objection. In all other respects the Borough Council agreed with the proposal and have, furthermore, included development of part of the site in their Local Plan.

Another objection to the Local Plan allocation related to the need for planting and landscaping around the development site. The District Council agrees that this will also be a condition of development being

granted planning permission.

The Economic Development Strategy prepared by Durham County Council and Sedgefield District Council identify the need to provide sites for prestige business use by major inward investors. Heighington Lane West has been identified for this purpose and already there has been interest from European, Japanese and American companies. The site is to be reserved for one or more large prestige developments. There are other sites available on Aycliffe Industrial Estate and elsewhere in Sedgefield District that are attractive to firms wanting to expand and it is important that there is a range of sites and buildings to buy or rent, to meet the needs of different companies.

Sedgefield District Council and Durham County Councils have commissioned specialist consultants to prepare an Environmental Assessment of the Heighington Lane West site so as to ensure that any development will take account of important environmental aspects. The report suggests, for example, that some of the hedgerows, mature trees and ponds should be retained in the proposed development.

Sedgefield District considers that this development site is necessary for the continuing important role that Newton Aycliffe has in attracting jobs to the District and County. The development proposal has been openly discussed in the Local Plan consultation process but the Councils are always pleased to hear the views of local people.

AYCLIFFE SHOW MAY BE CANCELLED

There may not be a Great Aycliffe Show next year if the Town Council decide it needs a rest and a new approach.

The Recreation Committee will debate the issue at their next meeting amid comments that the biggest event in Newton Aycliffe has become jaded and is losing the interest and support of the public.

Bob Fleming, Leader of the Council believes it is time for a full review of the event and it may be cancelled, relocated or changed in some way to give it new life.

"We also have to consider the build up to the town's 50th anniversary in 1998 and it may be necessary to build up reserves to make this a major event" said Cllr. Fleming.

The show costs about £30,000 including officers and employees wages. There is no criticism of council staff who work very hard, nor the organisation, which is as good if not better than similar events held in the area.

"We just want to take a good long look at the whole situation before coming to a decision on the 1996 Show" said Bob Fleming.

High rents, poor mix of shops, lack of good car

parking and fierce competition from retail parks is slowly killing off our town centre.

We should try to help our remaining shops, particularly the small private businesses who are caught in long leases and must continue to pay high rents despite the low level of trade.

SCHOOL AYCLIFFE LAND SALE CAN GO AHEAD

The long running saga over the sale of a strip of land to 9 adjoining houses at School Aycliffe has been resolved.

Sedgefield District Council have given planning permission, following a site visit, and the land owned by the Town Council, can now be sold to the residents who wish to extend their gardens.

The land in question was originally a tree belt separating the Water Tower field and identifying the edge of School Aycliffe.

The owner of the field, Mr. Ridley, objected to the sale of this public amenity land claiming that if it was available it should have been open to public tender. He also claims it unfair to allow this land to become "residential" when his own application to build houses on the Water Tower field was refused.

He states also that the residents have illegally "occupied" the land since 1989, destroyed his fence, removed trees and dumped rubbish into his field.

All these allegations have been strongly denied by the residents who have kept the Council land neat and tidy at their own expense since getting an indication from the Town Council that they could purchase the land six years ago. The Ramblers Association have voiced some concern over the loss of open space and possible obstruction of a public footpath.

Planning permission was given subject to certain conditions whereby no out-buildings be erected, no trees be affected without consent and that more trees and a hedgerow be planted before a new stock fence is erected at the boundary of the field.

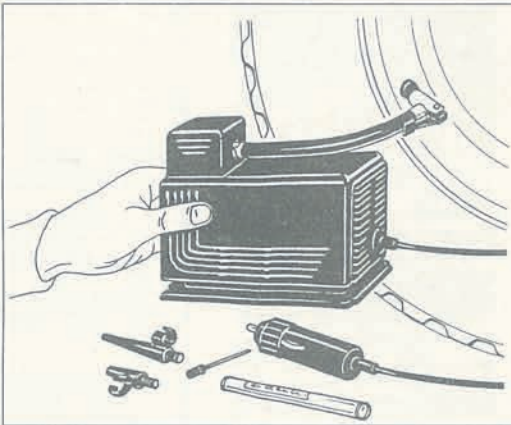
