## AND MORE

In replying to the Council's request for Woodham Golf Club to donate Agnew Wood to the Town, Director Stan Roberts says he has already offered it, and a lot more, if the planners allow him to build executive houses on unused land he owns.

His proposal to provide an executive exclusive Hamlet comprising 25 houses on third of an acre plots has been refused.

In return for this development, which would help him build a new Hotel for the town, he would upgrade and improve his stretch of the notorious C35 road, hand over the 20 acres of Woodland and complete all public paths and bridlepaths over his land which were left unfinished by Development Corporation. "It seems a good deal to me just for a few houses on derelict land" said Stan Roberts who maintains the land in question was designated for

development in original plans, and should have been re-introduced at the same time "Eldon Whins" was opened for house building.

According to Mr. Roberts the Town cannot lose as any profits made would be ploughed back into improving the area especially the C35 which is danger

inconvenience to motorists caught up in traffic jams "The town would also have

a new Hotel, bringing prestige and increased business to the town" said Stan.

On the face of it one has to agree with Mr. Roberts. It would cost the authorities nothing and the town gains are indeed very attractive so what is the problem? Other instances of green field development have been allowed to bring prestige and jobs - why not at Woodham?

We spoke to Richard Atly at the SDC who told us the main objection was that the proposed development would be in the countryside half a kilometre from the nearest estate.



## COUNTY SCHOOL TRAVEL **PROVISION**

Statement by Keith Mitchell,

Durham County Council's Director of Education The County Council must provide free home to school trav for pupils aged under eight who live more than two mil from their nearest suitable school.

For pupils aged over eight, the distance is three miles, be in fact, the County Council has used its discretion a decided to provide transport for those living more than to

If parents do not send their children to the nearest suital school but prefer to choose another, the County Coundoes not have to provide them with home to school trav When the Government decided to extend parental choice it did not make any more money available to local authorit to pay for home to school travel and the County Coun does not have the resources to provide travel for all pup who do not attend their nearest suitable school.

We write to parents asking them to express a preference I a school and at the same time explain which is the near suitable school and if free home to school transport

The letter also explains that home to school travel is r normally available if they choose to send their child another school. When parents decide not to send their child to the near

suitable school, they presumably take into account how th child is to get there. Travel is provided by way of a seat on a contract vehicl

known as the school bus - or by a contract ticket for use a scheduled passenger service. Where there are spare seats on a school bus, they are offer

to parents a s concessionary travel.

Parents who request concessionary travel complete application form which details the conditions and the ba on which it is made available.

Parents are reminded again that the County Council has duty to provide home to school travel for these pupils. Prior to 1994, the County Council used to take into account the number of entitled and concessionary travellers wh tendering for school buses. In January, 1994, t Government reminded the County Council that it could it provide or arrange transport for pupils who don't qual for free home to school travel.

This means the County Council can't arrange to provi transport for pupils who use concessionary travel. It c only offer them a surplus place on a bus if one exists. The number of entitled travellers varies from year to y and it follows that the number of surplus places concessionary travel also varies from year to year.

No commitment can be, or is, given to parents the concessionary travel will be available in any one year a certainly not for the entire school life of the pupil. Pare are advised of this when they apply for concessionary trav and even sign a form to say they have understood conditions attached to concessionary travel.

It is an inescapable fact that there are insufficient sp places on school buses this September to accommodate requests for free home to school travel.

We are unable to provide concessionary travel for all pare who have requested it, especially having been reminded the Government that we cannot provide or arrange transp for pupils who do not qualify for free home to school trav From September, 1995, it is estimated that over 650 pur will be provided with concessionary travel, and the Cour is pleased to be able to help as many youngsters as possi where genuinely "spare" seats are available.

I have noticed that a number of Taxi companies seem to think that the general public do not notice how bad some of their vehicles are and that some Taxi's are in a very bad state of repair and condition, badly painted, rusty and holed bodywork, dents and various damaged body panels. The interiors are no better, holed carpets and seats, dirty windows and seat coverings damaged and broken door handles etc.

On speaking to various Taxi drivers, I have been told, that licensed Taxi's are tested twice a year and that the Council employs an Inspector to control the condition of these vehicles. I would like to know how

the Council can allow these vehicles to operate in this condition.?

I would also like to mention that not all vehicles are as I have described above and that most Taxi owners keep their vehicles in excellent condition.



## REME TA RECRUITS PASS-OUT




