"EXECUTIVE **HOUSES AND** HOTEL NOT NEEDE

I was very surprised this week not to find any letters on the subject of Stan Robert's arrogant views expressed the previous week.

Ouite correctly the planning department have refused permission for the extension of Newton Aycliffe on Mr. Robert's land. Woodham already has plenty of housing land, and does not need more "executive houses" - there are many on the market at present.

Mr. Robert's refers to "his stretch of the C35" - I was not aware he had a proprietorial interest in the road. In any case, the traffic problem lies in the exit junction of this road, and would be made worse, not better, if it had to serve a hotel and "25 executive houses"

Just where does he propose to put this hotel? this further development on his land at Woodham? Do we need hotel another at Woodham? We have many hotel developments around the area already. And he proposes to "complete all public paths

and bridle paths over his land". If paths have been designated footpaths or bridle paths, it is the legal duty of the landowner to keep these clear so that the public have free access. If they are blocked, he is in breach of the law. So this part of your "offer" is worthless,

Mr. Robert's. He refers to the land scornfully as "derelict land". It may be land unused by him, and neglected by him, but it is "deserted abandoned" or "falling into ruins"

Mr. Robert's wishes to force the Council into allowing him to ride roughshod over the countryside, to his profit. In exchange he offers

four local companies to exhibit there for the first

Three companies from Aycliffe Industrial Park: Oncad Engineering. Oshino Lamps and Whessoe Varec exhibited along with DLI Seals of Trimdon Grange, who also exhibited at Hanover. There is an area on the stand, where Sedgefield District was also being promoted, as a leading location manufacturing

companies. Approximately 500 companies exhibited at Manufacturing Week 95 and over 20,000 visitors were expected to attend. The exhibition took place from 10th-12th October and covered a wide spectrum of manufacturing related products and services. These ranged from lasers and computers to motors, drives and control systems, rapid prototyping, mechanical components and subcontracting activities.

At the Hanover Trade Fair, companies that exhibited with Sedgefield District Council received a total of 357 enquires from customers as far away as China, India, Brazil and Turkey. Contracts worth over £1M were agreed at the exhibition.

M.O.T. **INCREASE**

New maximum fee levels for the MOT test will come into force on 9th October 1995. The revised fees will be as follows: Solo motorcycle (class I) will rise from £11.14 to £11.52; motorcycle combination (class II), from £18.78 to £19.42; three wheeled vehicles (class III), from £21.98 to £22.74; cars and light vans (class IV), from £26.10 to £27.38; non public service vehicle buses (class V), from £33.04 to £34.18; light goods vehicles (class VI), from £28.84 to £29.84.

The increase in test fees takes account of both inflation and of the introduction of new emissions testing equipment.

The new equipment is necessary to fulfil the stricter emission testing standards to introduced early in 1996 as part of the Governments commitment reducing pollutants.

Town Council Plan To Upgrade Bus Shelters

Various bus shelters in the town are to be demolished, repaired or replaced in the 1996-97 Town Council budget. Where bus shelters are demolished, pedestrian barriers will be installed Shelters at Greenfield, Meadowfield Way and Staintondale will be replaced at a cost of £9,500. The Greenfield/ Alston shelter is to be demolished with a replaced pedestrian barrier. Emerson way bus shelter is to be repaired and the one opposite Staintondale is to be removed, but may be replaced subject to demand later.

The whole programme including installation of barriers is estimated to cost £12,000.



Limited free travel for M.P.'s staff between Westminster and the constituency. Up to nine return journey's a year for such staff of each member.

Whilst I cannot comment on any individual member's claims, on average, including a 20,000 miles travel claim, at £9,200, an M.P. could be entitled to: £85,143.00 (Office staff included) Plus any other entitlements allowed for, as above. Ministerial Allowances, Sheet 31, Appendix D. Lists as follows:
