If you are a carer or a person with a disability and need help to attend the meeting, Sedgefield Locality Health Alliance can provide transport or a volunteer sitter while you are away from home.

Ken Frankish, Director of Economic Development at Durham County Council, has been appointed Managing Director of the Council's inward investment and trade development arm, County Durham Development Company.

Almost 250,000 applications for emergency safety net social security loans have been turned down during the last three years because applicants were deemed too poor to be able to repay them it was revealed today.

The publication of the figures, which show all regions being hit by application refusals, will intensify concerns that further planned government cuts to social security spending will force more people into deeper poverty.

LOANS REFUSED

The Labour MP publishing the information today accused social security secretary Peter Lilley of betraying his pledge to target benefits help to the most needy.

Darlington Alan Milburn, a member of the Public Accounts Committee, obtained the figures from Ian Magee former Chief Executive at the Benefits Agency after questioning social security ministers in Parliament.

The figures show that between 1992/3 and

1994/5 almost 247,000 applications for social fund loans were refused on the grounds of inability to repay.

In the last year alone over 116,000 such applications have been turned down by social security offices.

Macho drivers in County Durham are clocking up a grireputation for killing their friends and passengers. Thirteen per cent of passengers injured by show-off your

male drivers are killed or seriously hurt.
In the three years from 1992 male drivers aged between 1

and 26 who lost control of their vehicles, killed seven an injured 231 of their passengers.

In the same period, five drivers killed themselves and 26

showing off behind the wheel and emphasise the need read the road ahead.

In one commercial, the driver has to confront the grievir mother of his best friend whom he has killed and come terms with spending the rest of his life in a wheelchair. In another, a high flying office worker tries to close h mind to the fact that he is responsible for killing a youngste But a 10 year driving ban and hefty fine hammer home threality.

David Holland, Durham County Council's senior road safe officer, said male drivers in the target age group accounts for half of the total male driver casualties in single vehic accidents during the three year period.

"All lost control of their cars and ran off either straight road or at bends," he said.
"The accidents appear to have been caused by the wron

attitude, lack of concentration, failing to think and planead, and driving too fast in the wrong place.
"Even when they have a near miss, these drivers don't see

to take it as a warning that they are driving badly. There always an excuse.
"We need to try to remove the macho, boy racer image as

get these young drivers to look and think ahead and g their speed right. In other words, to read the road ahead

"It's no use appealing to their social conscience becauthey don't see that the message is for them.
"Telling them what they are doing is risky is no use becau

many of the manoeuvres are intentional not just errors.
"They aren't even worried about killing themselves be research shows that what does get to them is the thought spending the rest of their lives in a wheelchair or being responsible for inflicting that fate on a friend.

"Really, the only things which will influence them to char their driving habits are the thought that they might end crippled, losing their driving licence for a long time, facthe family of the friend they have killed or maimed, having to endure the disapproval of their girlfriend

"They have got to realise it takes only a split second to from fast car to a lifetime in a slow wheelchair." he said
