## DISTRICT COUNCIL ACCUSED OF VANDALISM

Last weekend the large Willow Tree by the Town Centre Roundabout, opposite St. Clares Church, was hewn down without notification to anyone.

The Town Council staff knew nothing about its removal and it surprised a number of Councillors.

Town Clerk John Farquhar was even contacted at home over what one caller called "pure vandalism"!

"Newton News "has received many calls from irate conservationists enquiring why it was felt necessary to fell this beautiful tree which was part of the Town Centre environment, and was older than the town itself.

We discovered the tree was removed by Sedgefield District Council on the recommendation of their Tree Specialist.

The tree has been watched for two years, and as it was tilting dangerously towards the road, it was decided to chop it down before it caused an accident.

A very reasonable explanation which most people would accept, but might it not have been better explained before the act?

After all the SDC had 2 years to warn people the tree might have to be destroyed. Why wait for an outcry before giving reasons?

They have our newspaper, their own publication "Inform" yet fail to exercise good public relations in this matter. Come on SDC, introduce a policy which ensures all departments report sensitive issues which are likely to cause public concern, so that they may be published.

#### Shafto House Refurbishment

Dear Sir

Erroneous statements were made in Aycliffe Town Council as to the future of Shafto House residential Home, which I refuted.

County Durham Care Sub-Committee has agreed finances for rewiring and complete refurbishment costing nearly £500,000 and I am assured there will be no staff cut-backs either.

Residents will be fully catered for elsewhere while that essential work is done, then return to an enhanced modernised home environment. Residents, staff and relatives will be kept fully informed.

I hope this may relieve any anxiety that might have been created by any erroneous statements made. I have delivered the petition to D.C.C., signed by 341 Ward Residents, calling for urgent action about traffic problems on Agnew/ Woodham Way and I'll report on responses. Our gratitude to the Organiser and all concerned residents petitioning for that.

As to petitions for an access path to the rear of Woodham Comprehensive School, bogged down in political mud since May 1989?: Town Labour members insist the county Council must first put in a high security fence and internal paths BEFORE they will give way leave for the burnside path. They also insist that the path MUST be to adoptable standards and the County Council then to adopt it!

This may exclude help offered by the District council and some funding to a Groundwork Trust standard? (not adoptable) Costs are now forced up to a prohibitive £17,900 for path pupils, parents and governors asked help for in 1989. The County Council costs go to the Budget for next year and if more cutbacks are forced on them, prospects are poor for the path.

Even if volunteer cash of £3,700 was raised for the path, it could not be put in unless the County find their cash first!

An insoluble "Catch 22" situation bogged down in Town Council Labour

### HISTORICAL ARMY PARADE IN TOWN AS UNITS **AMALGAMATE**

Ever since the days of Florence Nightingale, the Army Medical Services have provided medical cover for the Armed Forces of this country.

And this is so important to the welfare of the fighting forces and also to their morale.

Well to the forefront of these providers, from the Boer Wars to the Gulf Conflict, have been the part-time Territorial Army 'medics' of 201 (Northern) General Hospital, RAMC (V) and 223 (Durham) Field Ambulance RAMC (V) based at Greenwell Road, Newton Aycliffe.

Now, in a changing world with different demands and priorities it has been decided that, in order to provide continuing cover for the reorganised Modern Army, the two units are to amalgamate into one under the banner of '201 Field Hospital (V)'.

This does not mean that the Officers and soldiers of 223 are to cease to function, rather, they now become Alpha Squadron of the new Field Hospital.

To commemorate this important event the two units are to hold an Amalgamation and Celebration Parade onTuesday 31st October at 8 p.m. which will take the following form:

All personnel of 223 Field Ambulance will assemble and parade for the last time under this title and then ceremonially march out of the barracks under their Commanding Officer. Once outside the gates the troops will be welcomed by their new Commanding Officer who will be handed the ceremonial key to the barracks. The unit will then be marched back to their new title.

The men and women on parade will also be under the close scrutiny of all former Commanding Officers of 223 who are able to attend.

As both units are very much a part of their local communities the evening is planned as a family celebration and will prove to be of some considerable historical significance.



## £35 MILLION TO HELP SMALL BUSINESSES

Calls made by Stephen Hughes Durham's Euro MP three years ago for special Euro aid to help small businesses cope with E.C law have lead to the creation of a £35m Fund.

The Fund will specifically help small and medium sized companies understand and put into effect the seventeen major E.C. Directives on Health and Safety in Work Places introduced over the last six years. These cover a wide range of subjects such as Personal Protective Equipment, Working with Computers and Word Processors, Construction Site Safety and organising Work Places for Safety. Stephen Hughes called for the creation of the Fund -and even named it: SAFE (Safey Actions for Europe) -- to provide practical help on training, information, guidance and assistance on best practice. His meetings with senior European Commission figures in each of the last two budget rounds have now borne fruit. The

European Commission has published a four year Action Programme on Health and Safety which includes an extensive SAFE Programme with an initial budget of £35m for the next four years.

Commenting today
Stephen Hughes said:
"The E.U. is often accused
of legislating without
regard for the difficulties
which businesses might
have in coping with that
legislation. This is a
practical example of how
Europe does care.

This money will be available to management or unions or both working in partnership to help them put the basic requirements of E.U. Health and Safety Law into practice in the work places. I could not be more confident that the £35m cost of this Fund will be paid for many times over in reduced costs in deaths and injuries in small and medium sized companies all over Europe that meeting the requirements of this legislation will bring



## £30,000 FUNDING FOR SPECIAL NURSE LED BED SCHEME AT

continue the Nurse Led Bed scheme at Sedgefield Community Hospital. The funding has been provided jointly by County Durham Health Commission, Social Services and Sedgefield District Council and a local GP fundholding practice, Dr. Jones and partner in Sedgefield.

Sedgefield is one of ten areas in the county chosen by the Department of Health to trial the scheme which will hopefully be expanded in the future to include more areas.

The scheme is unique in allowing nursing staff rather than doctors, to admit patients who need short term hospital care for ailments such as pressure sores. The scheme acts as an important half way measure for patients needing respite care, rather than full time hospital care. There are three teams totalling eight nurses who can admit patients into two new beds at the hospital. In the six months it has been running the scheme has treated 12 patients

The main benefits of the scheme are that it provides

nursing staff and locally based care. By treating patients promptly their conditions are often prevented from deteriorating and needing more long term health

Irving, Paul Commission's acting locality director for Sedgefield said: "There is potential for broadening the scheme in the future, and we are very pleased that together we could offer the vital funding needed to continue the scheme for another year. There is a real partnership between the different parties to help prevent people from becoming more seriously

Colin Miller, practice manager, Dr. Jones and Partner said: "This is a very worthwhile scheme and we wish to see the community hospital flourish by providing such beneficial services. The scheme provides important easy access to health care for local people. We have found that we were sing the facility a lot for our patients and are glad to help it continue by

providing funding." Julia Gilroy, facilitator of the Nurse Led Bed Scheme said: "The scheme's success is still being evaluated questionnaires going to all patients who have used the service and staff to see whether it is promising for the future. So far the feedback is encouraging, and patients have really benefitted."


The Nurse Led Bed scheme also frees up Community hospital beds for use by other patients, and can also admit patients recommended by District Nurses, GP's or Social Services.
