# S.D.C. CLAMP DOWN ON UNRULY KIDS

#### PARENTS FACE PRISON AND FINES

Sedgefield District Council has obtained Injunctions preventing the children (two 15 year olds and one 16 year old) of two families from causing distress and harassment to other families at Bessemer Park, Spennymoor. Parents had costs awarded against them in both cases and they risk imprisonment and fines as well as losing their homes if they fail to comply with the terms of the injunctions.

Sedgefield District Council is currently investing millions of pounds to rebuild and refurbish Bessemer Park. Unfortunately, in recent months, the normal day to day life for some tenants on the estate, has been ruined by the anti-social behaviour of a small number of young people.

Council Leader, Brian Stephens, said, "There is a clear message here for all those who cause trouble to other tenants. The Council will do all it can to protect the interests of decent citizens. We have a duty to those people in our community who are faced with harassment and disturbance

The two cases which were heard yesterday (2nd November) at Bishop Auckland County Court, arise from disturbances over several months at Bessemer Park. Housing Committee Chairman, Anne Mumford said, "We are working with the Police, Community Force and other organisations to ensure that a small number of individuals are not allowed to spoil the quality of life for their neighbours. Our success shows that the Courts understand the problems - we will not hesitate to take similar action anywhere in the District - we must stamp out this disgraceful

# COUNCILS CAN HARNESS PRIVATE FIANANCE TO **UPGRADE** Local Government Minister David Curry today announced rule

changes to encourage investment by the private sector in local authority facilities. The changes will allow councils to harness private finance and management expertise in upgrading schools, leisure centres, libraries, theatres and other local facilities.

In addition Mr. Curry announced a new research study to help provide better understanding of the ingredients of successful joint ventures involving local authorities and the private sector. The study is designed to lead to the publication of a good practice guide for local authorities.

In reply to a written Parliamentary Question from Andrew Hargreaves M.P.(Birmingham Hall Green), Mr. Curry said:

'A year ago we announced a first package of measures under the Private Finance Initiative whose aim was to encourage joint ventures between local authorities and the private sector, and the disposal of surplus assets. We are continuing to implement and develop those proposals. Today I can announce another set of changes to the capital finance rules, to encourage further private sector involvement in the upgrading and, when necessary, replacement of local authority facilities. I am also announcing new research into the operation of joint public and private sector

"The rule changes I am announcing will increase from 50% to 90% the usable proportion of receipts from the sales of county farms for two years from 1st April 1996, as announced in Rural White Paper; increase from 50% to 75% the usable proportion of receipts from the sale of educational assets for two years from 1st increase from 25% to 50% from 1st April 1996 the usable proportion of receipts from the sale of shares in education companies; reduce the capital cost for authorities when they enter into "design, build, finance and operate" type contracts for the replacement or upgrading by the private sector of facilities such as schools, leisure centres and theatres; give authorities greater scope for financing the replacement of these facilities out of the proceeds of their sale, by a number of rule changes whereby authorities can take account of the cost of replacement assets in calculating set-aside, including relaxations in respect of the treatment of leased assets; remove disincentives to the dual use of such facilities by an authority and the private sector; reduce the capital cost of equipment replacement contracts, making it easier, for example, for authorities to use energy services packages which improve energy efficiency and reduce energy costs

'I hope to publish draft regulations embodying these changes within the next few weeks, and to lay them before the House, following consultation with interested parties, so that they can come into effect by 1st April 1996. In parallel with this consultation, 1 hope that further changes can be developed to extend the 'design, build, finance and operate' concept to virtually the full range of

local authority capital expenditure.

The new research into the working of the Private Finance Initiative, commissioned by my Department and to be carried out by Coopers & Lybrand, will establish the nature and extent of authorities' involvement in joint companies through a questionnaire sent to all English local authorities. This will be followed by an investigation in detail of the role of companies in a number of case study local

In addition to a report on the research findings, it is intended that the study will lead to the publication of a good practice guide, designed to help local authorities in developing private sector partnerships through the medium of companies.

Authorities responses to the Private Finance Initiative have been very encouraging. There is now much greater consciousness of what private finance can achieve in improving local authority facilities and services. The Treasury's Private Finance Panel have worked with the Local Authority Associations to prepare a consultation paper drawing authorities attention to the scope for such action. The setting up of the Local Government Public Private Partnerships Programme, with its own staff to help authorities find the most effective opportunities, is a welcome further step.

My honourable friend the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Education and Employment (Cheryl Gillan) is making a separate announcement about the specific implications for private finance in education. My right honourable friend the Secretary of State for Wales is also making an announcement"

# £8,000 BONFIRE NIGHT, WORTH EVERY PENNY says Councillor

Dear Sir,

In ancient times, bonfires were 'bone fires': holocausts of bones of sacrificed animals. The ancient Celts, whose terrifying New Year celebrations occurred about this time of year, made a huge wooden cage, filled it with people, and set it

on fire! In Tudor and Stuart times, bonfires were used to warn the country about invasions, and to burn witches, heretics and effigies of traitors such as Guy Fawkes.

So isn't it marvellous that, after such a catalogue of death and destruction, Great Aycliffe Town Council has turned history on its head, and runs a bonfire that actually SAVES lives. Reading in the news about another crop of children burned and hurt on Plot night justifies, I believe, the Town Council's policy. At the same time, when other communities are falling apart, the bonfire provides a successful focal point of town life. The bonfire is a major Town Council expense. Sunday night's display cost £8,000 - each one of the big starburst 'mortars' can cost up to £50 each - but it was worth every penny. An estimated 7,000 people went to the Oak Leaf Complex, hundreds of others watching the free display from their bedroom windows. At least this time the ratepayers were able to see where their money was going!
