WOODHAM HOTEL PROPRIETOR FACES £1/2MILLION LEGAL BILL

Bob Porter at Woodham Hotel is still in business despite rumours to the contrary following the end of a long-standing battle with the former A.D.C. which ended in a 3 week Court case which Bob has lost.

His solicitors will be looking at the Court Judgement, which found for the Aycliffe Development on the Corporation, and could cost Bob Porter £1/2million in legal fees etc.

Bob Porter now waits to

see what he can do next, but he is resigned to the fact that he may face an astronomical legal bill. CONFUSION OVER THE FORMATION **OF ANOTHER** TOWN DEAF CLUB

Letter to the Editor

On Friday 10th November I attended a meeting along with other members of our committee, that was called by the Social Services Dept, to look at the possibility of setting up a Deaf Club in Newton Aycliffe. As a result of that meeting it appears that such a club would be wanted by deaf people in the area. Whilst we would like to take this opportunity to wish them all the best for the future, and hope that their club is as successful as ours, we would like to inform the people of Newton Aycliffe that they have nothing to do with our club, even though their members may decide to call it the Newton Aycliffe Deaf Club.

Over the last few years we have built up a very good relationship with the local community, in particular local businesses to whom we have approached on several occasions for help with different projects. We would hope to continue that relationship, and that they don't confuse our club with this new club in the future. Finally I would like to put an end to some unfavourable rumours that I have heard about our club. As our name suggests, we welcome deaf members of the community into our club. In fact ever since we started we have had deaf members actively getting involved with the committee. We used to arrange an interpreter for our committee meetings, we held a sign language course so that we could learn to communicate with the deaf members. We tried to involve them in all aspects of the club, even when we had general knowledge quizzes we would write the questions down for the deaf members, whilst we read them out for those who could hear. We have never deliberately excluded deaf members from taking an active role within the club.

However we do have rules that apply to all the members of the club, and if some deaf people who have been members of the club have been made aware of them and left because they felt these rules have excluded them from the club, or we have not done things that they would have liked us to do then they were always welcome to air their views. As I said earlier, the new club has yet to decide on a name, but if the name is in any way similar to ours, and we have to change it in order to save any confusion, we will announce it at the appropriate time.

New members are always welcome whether they are disabled or deaf, or even voluntary helpers, we meet every Wednesday evening between 7pm and 10pm at the Southerne Social Club.

Durham's archives and Ranger Mike Ord takes footsteps through history in a 10 mile walk starting from Sadberge on 30th December.



DANCE TEACHER'S APPOINTMENT AS BOARD EXAMINER





HINTS FROM TOWN'S CRIME PREVENTION OFFICER

During the last few weeks there has been a large increase in burglaries in the Newton Aycliffe area. These break ins normally occur between 6-9pm and access if usually gained through the rear of the house either by patio door or by forcing any existing downstairs doors or windows. We are asking members of the public to be more aware of suspicious persons or unusually noises and report anything of this nature to the police or phone Crimestoppers free on 0800 555 111, you won't be asked your name, address or phone number.

Some hints on looking after your property: BURGLAR ALARMS AND SAFES

If your possessions are worth a lot of money or you live in an area with a lot of burglaries, you should consider a burglar alarm or a safe. Ranging from inexpensive DIY kits to sophisticated systems costing hundreds of pounds, there are scores of burglar alarms on the market. Quality fitted alarms will certainly be a deterrent to burglars.

LIGHTING
Good lighting can deter a thief. Some exterior lights have light sensors or infra-red sensor that switches the light on for a short time when it detects something in its range. Sensors can be bought separately to convert an existing

outdoor light into a security one.

If your front and back doors are not strong and safe, neither is your home. First of all, make sure the doors themselves are of strong, solid core construction, 44mm thick. Glass panels are especially vulnerable. If any of your doors seem flimsy, replace them with solid core as above. If you are a council tenant, call the housing department about it. Fit back and front doors with a five-lever mortice deadlock to BS3621 or equivalent (seek advice from your local master locksmith). A deadlock can only be opened with a key, so a thief cannot smash a nearby glass panel to open the door from the inside. If the thief enters the property through a window they can't carry your belongings out through the door.

PATIO DOORS

You should get specialist advice on fitting locks to patio doors. They should have special locks fitted top and bottom unless fitted with a multi-locking system. Also install an anti-lift device to stop a thief simply lifting the door off its rail. Fir security mortice locks to french doors, and mortice bolts to the top and bottom of both doors. With all security, consideration must be given to the risk of fire, and means of escape, fir a smoke detector, conforming to BS5446.

SECURED BY DESIGN

If you are buying a new home, look out for the Secured by Design symbol. This scheme has been developed to help homebuyers identify builders who have consulted the police to incorporate crime prevention measures. Standards cover estate design, home security measures and security lighting and alarm systems.



Education **Standards**

Robin Squire MP, Schools Minister, speaking to the Tynemouth Conservative Association, Tynemouth recently warned that any reversal of the Government's education policies and the resultant decline in standards would betray our school children because they will lose out against other children across the world.

Mr Squire said "The Conservative Government has been consistent in its emphasis on raising standards in education. It was our party that had the ideas, took the painful decisions and fought the hard bitter battles by introducing the National Curriculum, the regular testing of school children, independent inspection and the publication of league tables.

At long last we have found a response from the opposition politicians who now claim to be the advocates for raising standards. But we should not be fooled by their rhetoric. Labour have friends with a strong voice in the education establishment who will expect Labour to dilute our measures beyond recognition, or even scrap

School inspections are highlighting serious failings in the education of our children, which some local education authorities have, for many years ignored. I welcome the way that many councils have now responded to challenge of turning round schools in partnership with the governing bodies but it clearly needed the impact of the independent inspection coupled with the possibility of an Education Association

being created. The truth is that since 1979, this Government has actually increased spending per pupil by 50% in real terms. Even if we had not increased spending, reports by the Chief Inspector of Schools make it clear that it is not the amount of money spent that matters, but the way resources are used. In a recent case, where a London school had a pupil-teacher ratio of 8-1 and spending per pupil was three times the national average, standards were still well below what was expected. It is the quality of teaching and the ethos and discipline of a school that distinguishes the good from the poor. This is the view of the independent Ofsted report published last week which says that teaching and class organisation have a greater impact than the size of the class. That is also why the Government is giving particular emphasis to the training of head-teachers".
