An application to move to former Moore's factory is at present being considered by the Planners and will be decided in January. Rumours on the "grape-vine"

indicate more opposition this time round, and many will wonder why, given the fact that the event is so popular and has operated quite successfully from UMM for a long time.

A petition has been started to keep the Car Boot Sales in Newton Aycliffe and the numbers putting their signatures to the document will run into thousands. It is difficult to understand

how the Council can even consider turning down this application after allowing Nobles to use the UMM site. What is the difference? If anything the Moore's site is better, as it will take traffic away from St Cuthberts Way where cars are being parked. Nobles have offered to tidy up the Moore's building which is starting to look quite dilapidated and is a target for

vandals and other uses. They would work under the same conditions as UMM; stepping aside if an industrial user wanted the site, so why possible is there inconsistency in planning policy? Great Aycliffe Town Council

have objected but they opposed the use of UMM on the grounds that retailing should not take place on the Industrial Estate.

At least they have been consistent whereas the SDC will find it very hard to give good reasons for refusing this application.



DON'T LET THIEVES SPOIL YOUR CHRISTMAS

Thieves are traditionally active over the Christmas period, with December a peak month for burglaries in the home.

Although there is probably little you can do to thwart the determined professional thief, the majority of household crime is carried out by opportunists, so it is still important to take precautions.

According to one of the UK's largest home contents insurers, Cooperative Insurance Society (CIS) even the most obvious and sensible actions such as locking doors and closing windows, which can help deter a thief are sometimes overlooked.

CIS has the following advice for homeowners to

ensure a happier Christmas:

* Make sure every outside door has a good strong lock fitted, preferably a mortice deadlock (to British Standard BS3621 - look for the kitemark) or a rimlock with a deadlock facility.

* Ground floor windows are often a source of breakins, but locks can usually deter. To find out about suitable fittings, contact your local police stations Crime Prevention Officer or your local DIY shop.

* Make sure the back door and rear windows are as secure as the front. Most forced entries are made from the back of the house, as there is less risk of being

* If you are not at home during the evening, leave one or two lights or table lamps on timer switches, not just the hall light. Local DIY shops will have a selection of timers and adapters that switch on when it gets dark.

"Above all, remember that it takes a thief only minutes to climb through a window and make off with your video or jewellery. So lock up, whether you are just popping next door, down to the shops or flying off to Tenerife. Otherwise it may not just be Santa that you'll find trying to get" says CIS's communications head,

Remember to cancel milk, papers and any other

* Tell your neighbours or neighbourhood watch contacts how long your property will be unattended so they can keep an eye on it. Better still, get someone to pop in from time to time to check that everything is alright. * Arrange for someone to push any free papers or mail

through the letterbox and out of sight.

* If you are not taking your car, make sure it is locked

and secure.

* If a cold snap is forecast and you are worried about burst pipes causing damage to your property or contents while you are away, turn off the water before you go or leave central heating timed on a low setting. Last, but not least, remember to make sure your insurance is sufficient and reflects the true value of replacing stolen or damaged items.

"It is wise to update the cover from time to time and increase it every time you add something to the value of your home contents, like new TV, carpet, jewellery or good quality clothing" says David Mott.

S.D.C. OFFER **ADVICE ON NEW FOOD** REGULATIONS

Safety Food Regulations came into force in September this year - the first major change in legislation since 1970.

Food proprietors need to familiarise themselves with the new requirements and Sedgefield District Council recently held a seminar giving guidance to 250 people from local food businesses.

PARENTS **ALARMED AS** REPORTS OF **MENINGITIS INCREASE**

Seven cases of suspected meningococcal infection in residents of county Durham have been reported in the last week though only four have so far been confirmed by laboratory testing. One of the patients has since died. There is no reason to suspect that the cases are connected.

Two of the patients attend schools in the County and one attends a school in Stockton. One patient attends a nursery in South Durham and another attends a college in the County and works two days a week at a nursery in North Durham. Parents of all children attending the schools have been sent letters to reassure them and offer them advice. The individual who died worked at a company in South Durham. The South Durham. organisation has been informed and has received reassurances and advice. The seventh patient is a two year old child who does not

attend a nursery.
Meningococcal meningitis and septicaemia are uncommon. The chances of developing the illnesses through contact with an infected person are very small. People who have been in recent. Very close, prolonged and regular contact or who have had mouth kissing contact with any of the patients have the greatest chance of developing the infection (eg: someone living in the same house or a boyfriend or girlfriend of the patient). Even in this instance the chances of developing the infection are small and these people have been offered a short course of special antibiotics as a matter of routine.

It is usual for there to be cases more meningococcal meningitis and septicaemia at this time of year and most patients make a complete recovery. So far this year there have been 59 suspected cases of meningococcal infection in the County and three patients have died.

Durham's County experience is reflected nationally. There has been an increase in reported cases across the country. Part of this has been due to increased alertness and reporting of clinical cases meningococcal meningitis and septicaemia. More recent cases are thought to be due to seasonal increase.

The infection is caused by bacterium called meningococcus. It lives naturally at the back of the throat in many people without causing any problems.

The signs and symptoms of meningococcal infection may include headaches, temperatures, vomiting, neck stiffness, joint pains, drowsiness, bright light hurting eyes, fits and coma. In very young children they may include fever, fretfulness refusing feeds, vomiting or high pitched screams develor Some may (blood septicaemia infection) which is shown by red/purple spots or rash. If anyone develops these symptoms or is the parent of a child who appears to develop them, they should contact their GP. The National Meningitis Trust has a 24 hour helpline.
