The Young Engineers Club at Bishop Auckland College have once again answered a call for help from Pat Smith. Pat is a keyworker for Barry a local cerebral palsy sufferer. This time the group of students have developed and builkt a head switch which allows Barry to buzz for Pat whenever he needs assistance. When barry moves his head against the switch a buzzer will continue to ring until his keyworker switches it off.

Pat has also asked Robin Laycock (course tutor) and the young engineers if they would develop and build a portable frame for the devise so Barry can use it when lying in bed or on a bean bag, at present it clips to his wheelchair. Pat said "The gadget is wonderful, Barry has very limited movement and you don't realise how much this means to him, thank you all very much"

As much as I love animals I believe people come first and those with serious illnesses such as Multiple Sclerosis, Muscular Dystrophy and Cystic Fibrosis should be more vocal in defending future medical progress. Heighington **Parish Council** Certenary cele tions

On Sunday 11th mber 1995, a celebration of Heighing a Parish Council was held in the Village Hall. Parishioners of Heighington and Redworth were cordially invited to partake of a slice of Centenary Cake and Centenary Wine.

Cllr. Mrs Rosemary Boynton, Chairman, welcomed everyone and explained that this was an open invitation.

The Parish Council was, in fact 100 years of age in January, but this was unknown to Councillors, who only discovered this fact in August and decided there and then to organise a suitable celebration.

Mrs Boynton showed everyone the brass plaque, inscribed :

Heighington Parish Council Centenary 1895-1995", which Mr Foggo has kindly agreed to affix to the Village Pump, Thirty oak half barrels for Heighington and 15 for Redworth have been purchased as a way of marking the Centenary of the Parish Council and some have already been planted ready for Spring flowering.

It has been suggested that parishioners may wish to adopt a barrel.

Vice Chairman Cllr Peter Smyth, spoke of his pride in the village and how Heighington, who won second placer in the County Durham Tidy Village Competition, was a village which helped itself. Cllr Smyth praised Mr Arthur Boynton for his daily help in keeping the village tidy and Mrs June Davison who for years has provided disinfectant for cleaning out the bus shelter.

Cllr Smyth presented Mr Lou Bedocs, chairman of Village the Association, with the framed runner's up certificate for the Tidy Village Competition in the hope that it would be hung in the lower hall. Mr Bedocs thanked Cllr Smyth and assured him it would be done.

The Centenary Cake was cut and Mr Andy Muckley, scout leader, took photographs. Wine and cake was served by Mrs Libby Smyth, Mrs Val Bedocs and Mrs Ruth

More photographs were taken of the Parish Councillors and then the gathering filed out into the winter sunshine to admire the beautiful Christmas Tree which Cllr Joe Sewell had collected for on behalf of the Parish Council for the village.

Cllr Sewell had also installed the tree and hung the lights on it. The Clerk to the Parish Council, Mrs

Ann Le Druillenec, was given the honour of switching on coloured tree lights.

A report of this event is to be preserved in a time capsule, built into the roof of the Parish Church.

Local Labour Euro MP Stephen Hughes, issued a warning to small businesses in his constituency to beware of "consultants" offering European grants for a

Stephen Hughes, Euro MP for Durham and Blaydon, is worried that local small businesses are going to be targeted unscrupulous consultants - already operating in some parts of the UK - who for a fee of around £300 offer to find and apply for a European grant for the business.

Stephen Hughes warned businesses "Small should be very wary of anyone offering Eurc grants for a fee. Often the information offered is publicly available - most Councils have a European Officer who FREE give

information on European grants. Most small businesses are not eligible for European grants - and if they are it would usually be for things like training: not building on extension or expanding the business as some of these consultants claim"

He added "I would be pleased to hear from anyone who has been approached by a Euro grant consultant. But would strongly advice against using their socalled services.

Labour Euro MP's raised the issue recently in the European Parliament but the European Commission told Labour that it was up to Britain to sort out the problem. Stephen Hughes has already alerted Durham Council's County Services Consumer Department.
