Dr Jon Helliwell, director of the Centre for Process Innovation, for a debate on the future of UK manufacturing. which was chaired by Graham Robb, North East Chairman of the Institute of Directors.

An audience drawn from the business world and regional community witnessed the event, and heard how new product lines being launched by Ebac were helping to create up to 200 new jobs at its two sites on Aycliffe Business Park. Ebac bought the Norfrost brand and equipment in 2013, and has set up the new factory, on Heighington Lane, Aycliffe Business Park, to breathe new life into the popular brand. The

freezers are already available to buy through Argos and Amazon.

Pamela Petty, Managing Director of Ebac, said: "It was fantastic to not only have Digby back, but also to welcome people from across the regional community to witness the start of a new era for Ebac.

The revival of the Norfrost brand is the start of our move into domestic appliances, with washing machines coming next year.
"In the UK, we need to

acknowledge and support the public's belief in British made products by manufacturing more of them and making them available to buy. The positive effect this can have is widespread, and the jobs such manufacturing would create will improve the lives of those involved and the economy as a whole.'





Hillprint Saved from Closure - 12 Jobs Lost

An eleventh hour rescue deal has saved 30 jobs at Hillprint the Aycliffe-based HPM&ADDO, which was formed earlier this year when HPM and Darlington-based Addo entered a working partnership, fell into administration last Friday. HPM had endured years of decline amid tough conditions in the sector but looked to

in the sector but looked to have turned a corner when Addo agreed to join forces with it and relocate to Newton Aycliffe in March this year.

Aycliffe in March this year. Although the businesses did not formally merge, they brought their operations together under one roof to help inject more revenue into HPM. However, with HPM still reeling from a number of major contract losses – including its longstanding deal including its longstanding deal to produce Middlesbrough FC's match day programmes

— its turnaround proved an impressible took.

impossible task.
On Friday administrators
were called into HPM and the business looked certain to close, with the unfortunate loss of 42 jobs. Previous efforts to find a funder to

assume control of HPM's banking facilities had been fruitless.

fruitless.
But, managing director and former Addo boss Keiran Bayley found a last minute solution by securing the finance needed to enable Addo to acquire the assets of HPM. The move saved 30 jobs across the group and has jobs across the group and has put the business on a strong foothold for recovery and

growth.

Bayley said: "When we found out HPM were in trouble earlier in the year we felt if we put both operations under one roof we could turn the business around and save all the jobs in jeopardy. "It was unfortunate we couldn't shake off HPM's struggles and, with significant pressure from the bank, it eventually meant the end of what was a print company with real heritage.

"Unfortunately the business model for staffing levels in relation to turnover simply didn't stack up. Ultimately we were faced with the difficult choice of making 12 redundancies. HPM was saved from the brink of closure in the late 1990s by then director Richard Mortimer, who built it into what was at one point a thriving success.

He ran the business up until the end of September when he officially retired and declined to comment. Reflecting on the changing fortunes of the business, Bayley said: "Print was a lot easier 10 years ago, but those who have adapted best to the changing market conditions have great businesses now. Those who didn't are no longer here. It really is that simple."

Jones finished the game with 10 points, five assists and one steal. Panos Mayindombe led the team in steals with two.

Bucci again led the Wildcats in rebounding with eight, all from the defensive end of the court finishing the game with 7 points and 3 assists. Madourie had seven rebounds with his eight points. The Wildcats edged Cheshire in rebounding, the leading team in the BBL in this category, 39-35.
The Wildcats will again

Greenfield College to Incorporate Sunnydale

Changeover 1st January 2015

Proposals for Greenfield Community College and Sunnydale Community to College become one school are being recommended

Both approval. are governing body and are just over two miles apart. Durham County Council proposals would mean the

closure of Sunnydale but pupils would continue to be taught on both sites just as they are at present to minimise disruption to any pupils or families.

A report to Cabinet says, agreed, Sunnydale Community College would close as a separate school on December 31st 2014 with the enlarged Greenfield Community College starting January 1st 2015.

Sunnydale was judged to be inadequate with serious weaknesses after an Ofsted inspection in April this year. Although it has capacity for 954 pupils there are currently only 402 enrolled, meaning 57 per cent surplus places.

Greenfield was highlighted as a good school by Ofsted in 2012. Most recent GCSE results show Greenfield to be above the national average and Sunnydale below. Greenfield has 658 pupils on roll currently capacity for 800.

Consultation has shown generally strong support for the proposals with many parents seeing the advantage of pupils having access to a wider range of resources by bringing the schools together under the same management.

This includes the sports facilities at Sunnydale and performing arts at Greenfield.

Having considered the need to act quickly following the current position of Sunnydale in terms of low attainment progress, these proposals are seen as giving students in the area better opportunities for educational improvement. There is already good evidence of improvement in the lead up to the decision on the proposal. The current admission number for Sunnydale is 130 and 160 for Greeenfield.

Under the single school the admission number in the future would be 240. The report goes to Cabinet on 19th November.
