Rockantics Move to New Stiller Construction on Business Park Builders Discover World War Memorabilia

The former Presswork Metals derelict factory on Durham Way South on Aycliffe Business Park, has been closed since 2008 and plans are in place to convert the building into a new leisure facility with indoor rock climbing as the main attraction. The 70,000 square foot facility will include one of the biggest climbing walls in the country, standing 20 metres tall to stage national tournaments. It will also be used by the British

team for training. Local construction firm Finley Structures purchased the site two years ago and a mixed-use licence was granted by Durham County Council. Finleys are spending £600,000 on building the new facility.

It will be leased to Rockantics, which has been operating from Newton Aycliffe Leisure Centre for the last 20 years. The huge steel frame has already changed the skyline and it's hoped the new Rockantics will be open for the 2015 Easter holidays. Rock climbing is one of the fastest growing sports in the country and Rockantics managing director John Crooks said: "This is a really exciting time for us and we can't wait for the new facility to open. We get around 15,000 people a year using Rockantics and we're expecting that to top 20,000 in this new facility. We're still looking at what else to put in, hoping to include a

'clip-and-climb' facility which is proving a popular sport." The new premises will include changing rooms, a cafe and private function rooms, and other attractions are being considered for the rest of the building. The building is one of the original World War Two munitions factories and during the re-construction there were a number of interesting historical discoveries. John Finley said: "We wanted to preserve as many of the original walls as possible, and as we scraped some of them back to the original brick we

found a lot of old signage relating to the War effort. "One wall had a sign saying '3.5 shells' and another: 'this is your air raid shelter'! "We also discovered an old railway line when we were digging the bases out, and we're assuming these would transport the ammunitions from the factory to the main national railway line. "It's really interesting and we feel it's important we preserve this important piece of Aycliffe heritage, so we're planning to create a permanent tribute to the munitions workers to be incorporated within the leisure facility for visitors to enjoy."

Aycliffe Tekmar Win Major Windfarm Contract


Aycliffe Church Prepares Xmas Hampers for the Needy

Schools Help Care Home's Remembrance Garden



It seems everyone has heard about the Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red at the Tower of London but now Newton Aycliffe has its own, albeit smaller version of the hugely successful poppy installation. The ceramic poppies in London totalled 888,246 and filled the Tower's famous moat, one for every fatality during the war. When Woodham Academy was approached by Defoe Court Nursing Care Home in October to produce some 3D artwork to brighten up their new remembrance project in the grounds of the care home the Art Department simply couldn't say no. The staff and residents at the home had been busy knitting their own poppies which they have been selling to raise money for the poppy appeal. The vision was to create a space where residents at the care home could go to

remember the fallen soldiers of war without leaving the grounds of the care home. Residents and care workers were over the moon with their new installation of 35 poppies hand crafted by the students during their lessons in the last few weeks of term. The acrylic poppies looked fantastic swaying in the breeze despite the rather cold and wet weather conditions when the poppies were unveiled. Woodham Academy Head of Art, Lynsey Tait, says "It is always great for students to work on external projects and it was especially nice to see all the people we were doing it for when the home invited us to a celebration morning on the 7th November." Students and staff from Woodham Burn Primary school who had also produced artwork for the home were also present when the Reverend

Christopher Pearson came to bless the garden and lead a small service for the residents before the main candle lighting service planned for Remembrance Sunday.

A group of Year 8 students from Greenfield Community College visited the International Slavery museum in Liverpool last week. They learnt about the horrors inflicted on enslaved Africans by white Europeans and Americans, and the legacy that leaves today. It was a moving and informative trip for these students as part of their history studies. The students said "It really brought to live the horrors of the Middle Passage (journey across the Atlantic), the subsequent slave auction and plantation life that was to follow".

One student found the hidden resistance of the Nigerian punishment masks particularly interesting; another was moved to tears

when she found out about a slave escape, and the punishment - to have their child taken away from them. The students were appalled at the treatment of the slaves, and the children in particular. Despite the horror, the students found the visit useful in a historic context, to find out more about this period in time, one said: "It was great to hear about things which we wouldn't necessarily hear about in the classroom." Overall it was harrowing but very interesting experience that greatly enhanced the understanding of slavery for both teachers and pupils alike. Educational visits like this form an important part of teaching and learning at Greenfield. This is an example of the many that have taken

place this term, with more planned for the new year to continue to enrich the learning experience of Greenfield students.



2015/16 BUDGET SETTING UPDATE

“FUNDING CUTS AND SPENDING PRESSURES LEAVE THE TOWN COUNCIL WITH NO CHOICE BUT TO INCREASE THE COUNCIL TAX NEXT YEAR”

The Town Council is currently in the process of setting its 2015/16 Revenue and Capital Budgets and the Council considered and agreed the draft budgets in October.

The Council's finances are currently in a strong position and in the short term the outlook remains fairly positive with a balanced budget in place, savings continuing to be achieved, and healthy levels of balances and reserves.

As a result, the Council will not need to make any reductions to services next year and the draft 2015/16 Revenue Budget has therefore been prepared in a way that maintains existing levels of service.

However, the Council must also keep a close eye on what is likely to be an increasingly challenging future, and try to plan ahead now, for the difficulties that lie ahead.

The Council is currently reliant on Council Tax Support Grant funding paid by the Government, via Durham County Council, of over a quarter of a million pounds and which amounts to nearly 20% of its Revenue Budget. It has been confirmed that this funding will be cut in the coming years by between 10% and 15% a year, and there remains a risk that it could be withdrawn altogether. The Council is also facing a number of significant spending pressures including the increasing move towards the payment of a 'living wage' for council staff, pension and national insurance reforms, and inflation on running costs.

Unfortunately, in order to maintain services, and absorb the cuts to funding and increases in costs faced over the longer term, the Council has been left with no choice but to consider making a small increase in the Town Council Tax next year.

This decision has not been taken lightly, particularly in light of the on-going cost of living difficulties being faced by local residents, and following on from the four year freeze in council tax delivered by the Town Council between 2010 and 2013.

However, by agreeing, in principle to limit the proposed rise to 2% next year, the increase in the Town Council Tax Bill at Valuation Band A would be limited to less than £3 per year or 5p per week.

This increase will ensure that all of the important services provided by the Town Council to the community of Great Aycliffe can be protected and maintained for at least another year.

Finally it is important to point out that it is still very early in the budget setting process and much could change between now and the final budget being set. The Council will need to keep a close eye on any further developments and respond to these as necessary.

The Council is due to set its 2015/16 Precept and the Town Council Tax in January and I will keep local tax payers informed of future developments via the Council website and in the local press.

Still confusion about the Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan!

Although there has been large amounts of publicity surrounding the Neighbourhood Plan it appears there is still some confusion about what the Neighbourhood Plan is and why we are doing it.

In a nut shell there is National Planning Policy which the whole of the country must follow. Then each district/county or borough will then have a local plan, in our case the County Durham Plan, which is in the final stages prior to adoption and considers the whole of County Durham. Then there can be Neighbourhood Plans which are very specific to an area. The Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan is concentrating on planning matters which are specific to our area. We must be in 'general conformity' with the County Durham plan and cannot say NO to development.

Therefore the Neighbourhood Plan is a PLANNING document which contains planning policies for land and business use for the next 20 years for the Great Aycliffe area. For example: if we write a planning policy about allocating a certain piece of land for a Community Building. The plan DOES NOT make that development happen, however it DOES make it an attractive option for developers to build here as the planning rules for that site have already been set.

Finally; the plan must be community led and backed by evidence. The town wide questionnaire is the first round of consultation and is where the plan begins. The vision for the plan is yours, the objectives for the plan are yours, the steering group and working groups will endeavour to turn your vision and objectives into planning policies. The final plan will be checked by an independent examiner, if there is not a clear thread from consultation to vision, to objectives and finally planning policies then this plan will NOT be valid.

Angela Corner states "While I have been engaging with the community and analysing some of the early responses it has become apparent there is confusion over the services which the Town Council provide. There have been a lot of issues raised which are the responsibility of Durham County Council but as they are both generally referred to as 'The Council' I believe this is where the problem begins"

POLICE COMMISSIONER TACKLES CRIME AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS

Ron Hogg, Police Commissioner, has set up the first ever external Rape Scrutiny Panel in County Durham and Darlington. This panel is a key priority in the regional Police and Crime Commissioners' Violence against Women and Girls Strategy. It aims to provide independent oversight of rape investigations to identify best practice and opportunities for improvement. Panel volunteers were welcomed by Mr Hogg at the induction meeting last Friday. Mr Hogg said: "This is a unique opportunity for us to introduce external scrutiny in police investigations. I want this panel to examine the way cases have been handled, so that we can learn lessons and improve investigations, provide better support for victims and improve the community's confidence." Mr Hogg hopes that by

shining a light on the investigation process for cases of rape, ultimately conviction will improve. Volunteers will challenge cases in a constructive way and provide invaluable feedback to the police, CPS and external agencies, helping them to improve how they respond to this type of crime. Deborah Barker, newly-appointed Chair of the Panel and CEO for the Rape & Sexual Abuse Counselling Centre (the Rape Crisis Centre in County Durham), said: "Opening up cases for external scrutiny shows a real commitment to improve performance and provide a better service to victims and the community. It is encouraging that the welfare of victims throughout the investigative process is a major aim of the Panel and I feel confident that this independent Panel will work hard to achieve this aim."

THRILLING LAST SECOND WIN FOR DURHAM WILDCATS

Big time players make big time plays at the right time, and that is exactly what Ralph Bucci did on 16th November. With the game tied at 67, the ball left the seasoned veterans fingers from the three-point line, only two seconds left on the clock and everyone in the Newton Aycliffe Leisure Centre holding their breath. The ball splashed the bottom of the net, snapping the Wildcats' three-game losing streak and the exuberant crowd nearly snapping the roof off the arena. Durham's thrilling win ended a frustrating string of three losses, the first of which coming when the Manchester Giants visited back on 26th October. Bucci's buzzer beater improved the Wildcats to a 4-5 record.

Filling more drama to this wild game was the fact that Durham was missing the help of two of their top three scorers. Odira Attah and Panos Mayindombe were unable to perform and were taken off the active roster due to injuries they suffered in Saturday's training session. Durham's captain stepped up and led the charge with 16 points, 13 rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block. Making an impact in the paint was Fran Urli who again led the team in scoring for the second match in a row with 18 points and he had 10 rebounds and two assists. These performances earned Bucci and Urli a spot on the BBL Team of the Week. Chris Jones was honoured on the BBL's Off the Bench team with his contribution of 15 points, nine rebounds, seven assists and two steals. The hero of the night however had nearly handed the honour to a Manchester player after a late turnover by the Durham captain allowed the Giants to attempt their own moment of triumph.

The game was tied 67-67 with 45 seconds left to play. Jones took the half court inbound pass from David Buchberger and carried it to the right wing. Bucci ran off a John Puk screen set low in the paint and popped up to receive the ball at the top of the three-point arc. Bucci drove left and was met by a couple of defenders, leaving Puk open a few feet away. Bucci saw him, jumped and attempted to feed the big man the ball. But the long arm of Manchester's Ben Eaves anticipated the pass, deflecting the ball to his teammate Stefan Gill who led the charge down to the other end, setting up Manchester's offence with just over 25 seconds to go. Manchester's co-leading scorer Callum Jones had the ball and was looking for some options. He eventually found a small bit of space at the free throw line. His shot rattled off the left side of the rim and into the waiting hands of Durham's Jones. With about 10 seconds left in the game, Jones took off, cutting across the court. Jones crossed paths with a Manchester defender who made significant enough contact to stumble Jones. He was able to keep his balance and his dribble and continued on towards the key, four seconds to go. Jones found Bucci awaiting outside the three-point line, off centre to the right. Bucci pulled the trigger, the ball finding nothing but net. The captain ran with arms spread wide and he and his squad court met their mates on the bench for a frantic celebration.



Bucci said of the final sequence: "Chris had the ball, and I saw that much of the defence was collapsing on him, so I tried to find a little opening. Luckily, Chris saw me, and I was due to make one. Fortunately, the shot went in." He added that it was planned to not call a timeout after the final Manchester shot so they could set up their own final play. "It was one of those times where it was best not to run a set play." Buchberger came back to action for the first time since 19th October and contributed with crucial three-pointers in the first half and two steals in the second half. He finished with six points. Puk contributed eight points to the winning total whilst Joel Madourie had four and Sam Martin nailed a three-pointer. Not much separated the two teams throughout the match. Durham's largest lead came

midway through the second quarter with the score 33-24. Manchester's briefly held a six point lead in the third quarter. There were 11 lead changes during the night. Durham again won the rebounding battle, snatching 41 boards to the Giants' 32. The Wildcats did lose in

turnovers, finishing at +8 with 20 turnovers to Manchester's 12. The Giants gained 14 points from Durham's turnovers. The Wildcats will now look towards a double-header this weekend, first on the road and next at home. Durham will travel to face the 1-8 Leeds Force on 21st November. The Wildcats dominated Leeds in their home opener back on 28th September with an 80-46 victory. On 23rd November the Wildcats will return to Newton Aycliffe to take on the London Lions during Durham's Community Basketball Day. The BBL match will be preceded by a central venue league tournament competed by local primary school and academies in the area. Eight teams will compete on the home court of the Wildcats beginning at 12:00pm on the 23rd. The championship match of the tournament will take place during halftime of the Wildcats-Lions battle.
