### Dear Editor

I read with great interest the letter on Elmfield school site, closed in 2009 and when I read Durham County Council's 10 year plan this site was included. As requested I emailed my comments in November 2013 to the CDP consultation on behalf of the West Ward in Newton Avcliffe for a new Primary School to be built.

School Elmfield was demolished due to shortage of children, yet the County Council have put land up for sale to build houses, along with a public building that local councillors are trying for, but the people in the area do not want.

This is Education Land and a new primary school is what is required as there are primary schools in Newton Avcliffe that have asbestos and this is not safe. Now is the time to rectify the problem and build a new school before we have no land left!

The County Council are building new schools elsewhere so why not in the forgotten town of Newton Avcliffe?

I attended a public meeting on the County Durham Plan Examination in July 2014 chaired by the inspector Harold Stephens. The meeting was very well attended by people that had complaints about the plan but I was the only person there from Newton Aycliffe.

It must be that Aycliffe are happy with this plan but a lot of our Green belt is being taken for housing.

I had the chance to speak with Stuart Timmis Head of Planning and Assets also Councillor Neil Foster who requested I email

him all the information. To date I've had no reply! Stuart Timmis arranged for one of his managers to meet me 4th September 2014.

"We knew we were from a long line of hairdressers and barbers but were surprised to unearth the Burns family who were in the trade 300 years ago," said Keith, who is also a photographer and has exhibited his work in the region and London.

We have decided to mark the discovery with a family tree on the wall of the newly refurbished Chilton Salor detailing the generations of

hairdressers. Keith paid £50 for his first salon, a tin shed just yards from his current business in Chilton, when he was just 19. After studying at Durham and Leeds Universities and Cleveland College of Art and Design, he has traced the history of hairdressing back to Egyptian times analysing hair dressing techniques, body image and its

impact on society. Hairdressing remains in his blood and that of his family. Mark, who has painted the family tree in the salon. returns home every six weeks to conduct training seminars. Mark works as a hairdresser, and his work has appeared in Vogue, Elle, Marie Claire and has many famous friends

and clients including Kylie

Minogue. Jemma, who trained as a hairdresser, gave up a top job with Cadburys, to join the family firm as business

development manager. 'I am researching a range of products not currently available in the North-East,"

she said. "I would like to introduce the idea of hair bars where you can come in and use the salon to blow dry your hair." Mark said: "We are also

looking at holding model and consultation days." Keith added: "It is so rewarding to see my children as passionate about hairdressing as I am and with so many great ideas. to my tender and protruding appendage? Won't the heat from the burning candle damage one of my most important senses? What important senses? is the pain potential and more importantly, my pain threshold? Lots of unanswered questions I pondered for myself. But rest assured there was no need to have any fears or worries as I was guided through my treatment by Helen

In fact it was one of the pleasurable and most comforting experiences I have experienced. When you think candle don't think your usual kind of wax coated stick. Nothing of the sort. It's linen coated, hollow and with a tiny filter part way down. Inserted carefully just inside the ear, once lit, the heat

draws up any excess wax and unwanted elements into the lining of the candle; a rather less daunting prospect than having your ear syringed. The candles are about 22cm long and have a burn time of 10 to 15 minutes and have


