Greenfield Excellence at National Conference

Two groups of pupils and staff from Greenfield Community College were invited to share excellent practice with educational professionals from around the world at the SSAT National Conference in Manchester last week.

Teachers Ellie Barnes and Emma Curran were joined by students Nicole Todd and Lucy Roberts to share Greenfield's vertical tutoring programme "Time 4 Success" with their audience on Friday morning. The students spoke

eloquently and confidently about the importance of reading, mentoring and intervention within T4S, and explained how their Tutors put the system into practice. They gave an insightful pupil point of view on how T4S has helped their personal and group skills and the benefits of working in a mixed age group.

After the talk, the students and teachers led an enquiry session with their audience, mimicking a Time 4 Success



session. This provided a great talking point, inspiring even the international teachers present about the ways to encourage students to achieve and promote independent learning.

The presentation was very well received, prompting questions from teaching professionals about how to introduce the programme into their own schools. After their presentation the students had the opportunity to join staff at a presentation about how iPads can be used in school for learners to lead learning. The girls were really interested in the presentation; it has given them a lot to think about and to use in their own learning. This is just one of the two fantastic experiences Greenfield had at the SSAT conference last week, where students were a credit to their school and the work of the staff and students

at Greenfield Community College was celebrated and recognised – well done Greenfield!

Honest John Raised Over £102,000

15000 Sign up for Garden Waste Collection

The number of County Durham residents signed-up to the extended garden waste collection scheme has already topped the 15,000 mark. Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, Cllr Brian Stephens, said: "These are early days but the initial feedback is hugely supportive. There is still plenty of time for others to subscribe and it is really good that we are able to offer the service to even more households."

By signing up for a £20 annual fee, residents receive 16 fortnightly collections

between spring and autumn. Anyone opting to take up a three year subscription will get a discounted rate of £50. Rotters will continue to work in partnership with Durham County Council in Teesdale in 2015 and the same annual fee applies. Residents are reminded they need to subscribe by February 1 to get all garden waste collections in 2015. COUNCILLOR'S BEDROOM TAX PROPOSAL REJECTED

Deasr Sir,
Readers may remember that, shortly after I was elected as a County Councillor, I submitted a proposal to the government to help victims of the bedroom tax who found themselves in the 'can't-pay-can't-move' trap. The Council, unanimously, agreed to submit a proposal under the Sustainable Communities Act that, for a period of two years, tenants might be exempt from the bedroom tax until suitable

alternative accommodation could be found. At the end of last month, Kris Hopkins MP, Minister for Local Government, wrote to me to inform me that our bid had failed. In a polite letter, Mr Hopkins argued that 'to apply a two year exemption would remove much of the fairness that removal of the spare room subsidy has brought back to the system, with hard-working people again having to fund empty bedrooms and tenants less motivated to

move to appropriately sized accommodation'. He also cited the fact that in County Durham the number of tenants affected by the bedroom tax had fallen from 8167 to 6885 as proof that the government's policy is 'already producing the type of results that the Government is hoping to see'. I am very disappointed by the government's decision. Our proposal was not a full demand that the bedroom tax be abolished but a request

merely for some mercy in its implementation. Mr Hopkins' letter indicates that it has been the government's intention all along to use the bedroom tax as a 'motivation' to force people out of their homes. I am particularly worried that we do not know where those 1282 displaced households have gone. A few, indeed, may have gone to smaller social dwellings, and some to decent private landlords. My fear is that many vulnerable people have been forced to

sleep on the couch of family or friends, or – unable to pay a bond – to move to poor quality landlords. Councils and social landlords have implemented a suite of measures to help people and, as far as I am aware, there is no one yet in County Durham who has been evicted solely as a result of the bedroom tax. I am also aware that some people reading this letter will approve of the bedroom tax. But I think it is typical of this Tory-led government that it

should insist on acting without mercy. What the bedroom tax has done in County Durham, effectively, is to force more than a thousand households – too poor to find £14 a week – OUT of the social housing sector which is designed for them, into the private sector whether suitable or not (no one knows) ... and then to boast about what a success their policy has been. 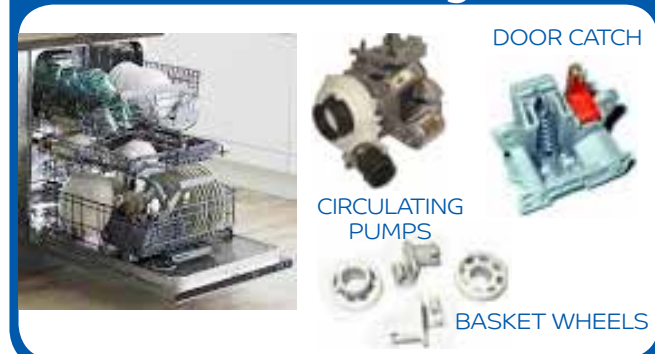

Council Leader Named in Most Influential List

The leader of Durham County Council has been named as one of the most influential people in local government.

Cllr Simon Henig is included in the Local Government Chronicle's LGC100 list, published today.

Cllr Henig, who has been leader of the county council since its formation as a unitary authority in April 2009, is also chair of the North East Combined Authority.

He is the only North East-based elected politician



included in the list and one of only two combined authority chairs.

The list includes national and regional politicians, government ministers, civil servants and think tank representatives.

Cllr Henig said: "It is absolutely vital that nationally, the voice of County Durham and the entire North East is heard and that there is an understanding of the area's needs and aspirations."

"I am pleased to be at the forefront of delivering lasting and tangible benefits to the county and region and I will continue to make that my priority for the future."

The LGC100 is compiled by first gathering nominations from LGC readers. A panel of judges then selects the final 100.

Earlier this year, Durham County Council was named Council of the Year by the Local Government Chronicle.

Self-Guided Northern Walks

Leaflets to guide you on walks along the region's limestone landscape have been launched this week.

The Geotrail guides detail how the rocks and fossils, some dating as far back as 300 million years ago, were formed and have since influenced the area's natural habitats, industry and lives of local people from South Shields to Hartlepool. They also include ancient sand dunes and coastal reefs.

County Council Make Savings of £137 Million

An update on council finances in County Durham outlines how difficult decisions about spending priorities look set to continue for several years.

Durham County Council's Cabinet will consider its Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP) – the plan which the authority uses to manage its budget and track its savings when members meet on December 17th.

Following the Chancellor's Autumn Statement last week, the paper reveals the financial outlook remains extremely difficult and confirms that Government funding cuts will continue until at least 2018/19.

However, members will also hear that early planning and robust management will see the delivery of nearly £137m of savings by the end of this financial year.

Cabinet member for finance, Alan Napier, said: "We have done what we can to lessen the impact of these cuts on

front line services by using £10m from our reserves but there is still more than £88m to save over the next three years. The total forecasted target we must meet by the end of 2017 is now £225.4m, a difficult task in anyone's book.

"We will continue to plan ahead and manage these reductions and to turn to the public to ensure we understand their spending priorities as we face the challenges ahead."

The report will also ask for approval for the authority's council tax base which is the number of properties the authority will collect the tax from and at what level. Members will hear that due to more houses being built in the county and due to changes to the eligibility around discounts and subsidies, the council will raise an extra £1.9m from 2015/16 which can be used to help manage the impact of its budget reductions.

Durham Wildcats Take 7th Spot in the League

Durham Wildcats faced squads situated on the opposite ends of the BBL table over the weekend and came away with a win and a loss. They made the short trek across the Tyne and gave derby rivals and first place holders Newcastle Eagles their best fight on 5th December but lost 99-83.

Two days later Durham took on the co-sharers of the bottom rung of the ladder Surrey United and the Wildcats ran away to a 101-57 victory. The split weekend leaves the Wildcats with a 6-8 record. Durham take the 7th position in the league after Manchester Giants were defeated in their two games over the weekend and dropped to 8th.

At Newcastle, Head Coach Lee Davie and the Wildcats going in were confident they could compete stride for stride with the best all-around squad in the BBL. In their first face off back on 5th October the Wildcats battled tough with the rivals, even holding a 55-50 lead early in the third quarter. But the Eagles' experience allowed them to take control of the rest of the match to win 99-73.

It much the same on Friday night. Newcastle's offensive efficiency from every corner of the court proved too much for the Durham Wildcats on 5th December in the 99-83 loss.

The Wildcats were down 45-42 at halftime to the North East derby foes before the Eagles turned on the jets on the way to their 11th straight victory.

"We were right there with them again," said Davie. "We managed to score well and trade baskets against one of the best defensive teams in the BBL. In the end they were able to get defensive stops when they needed to and we could not." Chris Jones led the Wildcats with 20 points (7-11 FG, 1-4 3FG) and Panos Mayindombe added 16 with the help of 2-3 shooting from three-point range. Ralph Bucci led all rebounders with 13 and led the Wildcats in assists with four. Fran Urli had 13 points and Odiba Attah had 12.



Durham was 23-40 shooting from two-point range and were 6-19 from beyond the arc.

Against Surrey United, both offenses started off slow and inconsistent, translating into a low-scoring first quarter. Davie admitted that his squad was out of rhythm in the first term. Once the defensive pressure from Durham started to fluster Surrey United, points came in bunches for the Wildcats to help them to the 101-57 win.

"Once we got going defensively we managed to create some good shots for ourselves," Davie said. "The more and more we pressured them on defence the better we played on offence."

Mayindombe and Sam Martin both scored 19 points and Attah added 16 points. Martin came off the bench and provided Durham an offensive spark starting in the second quarter with his three-point shooting. The Yale graduate was 5-6 shooting from beyond the arc, adding also a reverse layup in the third quarter after receiving a no-look pass from Jones. Martin was 2-2 from the free

throw line. He was given an honourable mention spot on the BBL's Team of the Week.

That pass from Jones was one of his six assists on the night in addition to his eight points. Bucci had five assists and Mayindombe had four. Also scoring in double digits were Urli and David Buchberger who had 15 and 10, respectively. Urli led the Wildcats in rebounds with six and joined Martin on the BBL's Off the Bench team.

John Puk had eight points and Joel Madourie added six. Martin's 19 points was his season-best which led the way for Durham's bench production. Attah, Martin, Buchberger and Madourie combined for 51 points coming off the bench. Surrey United only had five points from their second unit. Davie found the performance of his bench very important looking forward to the rest of the season. "We are not a team with one superstar. We have nine guys and it's important that each of them contribute in their own way especially with the length of the season that we have. Everyone has a role on this team and we saw that come true today with everyone coming off the bench and contributing well."

The Wildcats shot 60 percent overall (39-65) and were 12-24 from the three-point line. They were 11-12 from the free throw line. The Wildcats welcomed back their former teammate in Kirk Crecco. Now with Surrey United, Crecco had 13 points and two assists in his return to Newton Aycliffe. Bucci, Madourie, Attah and Davie conversed with Crecco before and after the game.

"It was good seeing Crecco and we caught up before the game," Davie said. "It is great to see a guy who is a product of our system; he has his Master's degree from Durham University and has himself set up very well for his own future. It's great to see another BBL team has recognised Kirk for his talents and what he can bring to their team."

This weekend, the Wildcats will travel again to Leeds Force on 12th December in hopes to this time earn a needed road victory. On 14th December, the Wildcats will have their final home match of the 2014 calendar year when they host One Health Sheffield Sharks.

GAMP JOB PROJECT CELEBRATES 100th PERSON INTO EMPLOYMENT

A fund which finances training for unemployed people in Newton Aycliffe and Middridge to enable them to find work is celebrating supporting the 100th person into employment.

With the help of GAMP funding, Ting enrolled on a SAGE course and a course to improve both her literacy and numeracy skills, as she was conscious that she lacked formal qualifications.

Ting's children are now in full time education, which allowed Ting to progress in enhancing her employment potential. She has proven to be very active in moving forward with her newfound skills. She has gained employment as a lunch time assistant at Woodham Academy and also volunteers there, helping children with their Maths and English homework.

Ting is also undertaking a

Teacher's Assistant Course and has a placement at Vane Road Primary School. When she has completed the course, she is hoping to get a job at either Woodham Academy or Vane Road Primary School. Ting is also active in making a positive contribution to her community and teaches Chinese at the Sunday school. She thanked the National Careers Service and GAMP for their help and support in helping her move forward. Brian Riley, GAMP Coordinator, said; "This project is unique to the GAMP area and brings together a wide range of partners to address barriers to employment. We are encouraging unemployed people from Newton Aycliffe and Middridge who think they could obtain work through specific training to apply to the fund".

"We believe our proposals have wide public support, with evidence suggesting that the public's appetite for devolved funding, powers and responsibilities is greater here than in any other part of the country. We have a proven track record for working together and we believe the time is now right for significant devolution in a number of areas including employment, skills, housing and transport."

Advice for Carers

New Carers UK research has found that over two million of us will start providing care for older, sick or disabled loved ones every year and many will go without the vital advice and information they need.

With an ageing population and people living longer with disabilities, caring for a loved one is increasingly a reality for families. In fact, as our research found, 10.6 million people across the UK will take on a caring role over the next five years and £1.1 billion of Carer's Allowance goes unclaimed each year.

It's vital that anyone caring for a loved one seeks advice to ensure they are getting the services and support they are entitled to. Without help and assistance carers can find themselves facing financial hardship, health problems, emotional stress and relationship breakdown. They can be pushed to breaking point. This has serious consequences for individuals, families, employers and the UK economy as a whole.

With new rights in the Care Act coming into effect next year, carers locally need to be informed about how it will impact them.
