Stiller's £15m Contract Brings 10 New Jobs

Aycliffe family firm Stiller Warehousing & Distribution are to create more jobs after celebrating a £15m deal with a major multinational food packaging firm Coveris Rigid UK.

The £3m-a-year deal involves Stiller managing Coveris Rigid's newly-purchased premises on Drum Industrial Estate in Chester-le-Street.

Stiller, which currently employs 115 people, will also manage distribution for Coveris, a global leader in the manufacture and distribution of packaging solutions and coated film technologies,

after it purchased the 264,000 square foot Drum Park, a building stood empty for a number of years.

Once the new facility is fully operational in April, Coveris will distribute around 30 billion units - mainly consisting of food packaging - from the site across the UK every year.

Stiller Managing Director Paul Stiller said: "This is a fantastic deal for

the company and we're absolutely delighted. We have been working with the Coveris team within a very challenging timeframe and are very proud of the work carried out by our team under the leadership of General Manager, Brian Simpson.

"We're now looking forward to operating alongside Coveris Rigid and helping them to continually improve the logistics solutions over the next five years and beyond."

Half of the unit will be used for warehousing which will be managed and operated by Stiller, and the other half utilised by Coveris' manufacturing operations.

They will be producing food packaging products and Stiller will be distributing them from the Chester-le-Street location.

Coveris Rigid Operations Manager Ian Donal said: "We have a very defragmented logistics set-up, with sites split between Scotland, Cramlington and Newton Aycliffe, and for the first time we'll be able to have everything on one site, saving a lot of money on logistics."

Out of all the tenders we received for this project, Stiller's was by far the most attractive."

Paul Stiller added: "We're now recruiting at all levels, including lorry drivers. Bringing drivers direct from Europe is something we're doing regularly, as there is a shortage of experienced drivers locally."

The Aycliffe firm has launched its own training programme to help inexperienced drivers get up to speed, some of whom have been recruited through the armed forces Career Transition Partnership Scheme.

Eight Resolutions to Make Aycliffe Better

New Year is the time when many people set goals for themselves for the coming year – here are some suggestions of resolutions citizens could make which would make 2015 a great year for the town.

1. BIG UP THE TOWN

Aycliffe is rapidly growing in regional importance, and we can all play our part by emphasising the positives. Of course we all wish to improve our town, but in public we need to sing its praises.

2. "IT'S THE ECONOMY STUPID"

There are no more government handouts – we live in a world where, if the local economy fails, we all suffer, and some of us starve. In particular Aycliffe Business Park is the key to our future; it needs to figure large in all our decisions.

3. LET'S HANG ON TO WHAT WE'VE GOT

The government is systematically reducing funding to local government, and the days when 'the council' could clear up litter, vandalism and neglect faster than it occurs are gone. We need at local level a campaign against littering and vandalism, and a joint-effort to care for the facilities we retain.

4. A VOLUNTEERING COMMUNITY

In the region, Aycliffe is envied for its large number of community centres and voluntary groups. But when I speak to the heroic volunteers who give up their time (in some cases their lives) to run these facilities, many worry that they are getting older and that there seem to be few people to follow on after them. Of course, not everyone is in a position to be able even to think of volunteering. But we need as a community to support our local community ventures, not just by attending, but – if possible – by volunteering to help.

5. DRY JANUARY

There is a national campaign to give up alcohol for January. Whilst you may think total abstinence a step too far, it is a fact that, if we could eliminate drunkenness from our social scene, we would significantly reduce vandalism, traffic accidents, violent crime, self-harm and suicides, domestic violence, child-neglect and many other social ills, since many of these problems are alcohol-fuelled.

6. SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL TEAM

Aycliffe hosts a premier division basketball team. Its football club is in the first division of the Northern League. We have successful rugby and cricket teams. Every one of them would welcome more supporters cheering them on.

7. MONEY CHANGES EVERYTHING

We have some fabulous shops and local businesses in the town centre, but we have got ourselves into a vicious circle where people do not go to the town centre because they think the retail offer is lacking, and shops are not coming to the town centre because the public spend there does not make them sufficiently profitable. If every family would resolve to buy from the town centre where it can, we would at least be doing what we can do to stimulate our town centre retail provision.

8. 'DO' POLITICS

Proper politics is an informed debate about the decisions, rules and institutions which frame our lives. It will help our town move forward if people would take a greater interest and engagement in what is happening, locally as well as nationally.

Figures on increased credit card spending and a trade gap of more than £5bn are signs that UK companies should produce more goods for the domestic market, says leading Aycliffe manufacturing boss Pamela Petty.

The Managing Director of Ebac says the public's desire to buy British goods should be harnessed to create jobs and wealth in the UK.

Today's trade figures, covering imports and exports in November 2014, show that the UK is a net importer, with the difference between imports and exports standing at £5.2bn, despite being a net exporter to non EU countries, with a £1bn surplus.

Pamela said: “The fact that spending on credit cards in the three months to Christmas was at its highest level since 2007, with banks and building societies predicting another rise in early 2015, shows the public's appetite to spend is on the increase. Whether this is down to growing confidence or greater access to credit, it indicates a period of opportunity for those who make and sell goods for the consumer market.

“As today's figures show we continue to import more than we export, in our relationship with other countries, particularly within the EU, it is time to acknowledge that the UK should be making more goods domestically. In terms of the economy, it is misguided to buy cheap from abroad, because we pay twice for the labour – once for the people who actually make the items abroad, and again in benefits payments to those who could be doing the job here.

“We have seen a real appetite for domestically-manufactured goods, with the re-launch of the Norfrost freezer range and the demand for UK-made washing machines, which will soon be coming off our production lines. This demand has led to deals with Argos and Amazon to stock the chest freezers, while there is also significant

interest from major retailers for the washing machines.

“The UK, particularly areas such as the North East, where we are based, was once known as a manufacturing powerhouse. We have the people, and we have the knowhow, to make things

DISABLED BADGE ABUSE

A County Durham woman who allowed another driver to use her disabled parking badge to get free parking in London has appeared in court.

Karen Heslop, 44, of Hillside, in Chester-le-Street, was ordered to pay a total of £550 after she admitted one offence under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Magistrates in Peterlee heard yesterday (Jan 6) that when Mrs Heslop applied to Durham County Council for the blue badge, in February 2013, she had given the registration number of the vehicle she said she would be using.

The court was told that on 11 occasions, between 23 September 2013 and 3 April 2014 fraud investigators observed the same vehicle parked in the Hammersmith and Fulham area of London. On each occasion there was no pay and display ticket inside the car but the blue badge issued to Mrs Heslop was on display. Further investigations revealed that the vehicle was registered to a woman in Newcastle and did not have a valid residents' permit to park in Fulham.

In mitigation the court heard that this was not a case where a blue badge had been obtained from the council by deception but Mrs Heslop did admit she had been deceitful in allowing the badge to be used incorrectly by another person.

Mrs Heslop was fined £200, with £330 costs, and ordered to pay a £20 victim surcharge

again; products which are as good as any on the market.

POLICE BUDGET INCREASE AVERAGES £3.16p PER HOUSEHOLD PER ANNUM

Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner Ron Hogg is seeking views from members of the community as part of his annual public consultation on the police budget. In order to help to support the budget in the face of further cuts, Mr Hogg intends to apply an increase of 1.98% to the amount of Council Tax which goes to the police service. This equates to

just £3.16 over the year, or 6p a week for a house in Band D.

Mr Hogg said: “In this continued period of austerity, all police forces across the country are facing similar challenges. I am committed to ensuring that the police have the resources they need to continue to provide an excellent service to the public.

“Durham Constabulary

has carried out excellent work to increase value for money and improve its service within constricting budgets, and it is also looking at ways to increase its own generation of income. But I must also review the amount residents contribute towards our police force. “The increase I am proposing would raise funding equivalent to keeping at least 10 police

officers on our streets. In my view, that is excellent value for money.”

It does not target a specific gender, race, financial class, or age. In Newton Aycliffe where most people don't think twice about making a trip to the local food shop, there are thousands of people who face hunger every day—including senior citizens". Stories like Irene's are all too

common, there are people who are struggling financially and going hungry. The idea of senior citizens being hungry may come as a surprise to people, but it's very much a reality. People who've spent their lives working are now living through their golden years finding it difficult to get by. Limited income and savings combined with rising living costs make budgeting difficult. Bringing food and goods directly to the people who need them the most is the aim, but getting it there is no easy task. Ordering is done generally before 7am, then wagons are used to deliver the supplies. Preparations for distribution begin a week in advance. Once the goods are brought in on pallets, it takes approximately ten volunteers to load and unload, restock the shelves and make up the household packs. Thankfully, Helping Hands have been able to help over 3,000 people during 2014 but we now need more supporters to meet the demand. Rugby Team in Good Form UNBEATEN RUN FOR SPORTS CLUB

Newton Aycliffe Rugby Club came out on top after a hard fought battle in difficult conditions at Chester-le-Street. Aycliffe came into this game in 3rd place with their opponents 4th so it was never going to be an easy match. The strong cold wind made handling difficult and both teams had to play accordingly. Aycliffe's side looked strong, but flanker Drew Gibson had to fill in at centre where there was still a shortage of players. Aycliffe began well, with their backs showing pace, but Chester's defence was strong. The first score came after a 15 minutes; an Aycliffe move seemed to have ground to a

halt when the ball hit the floor, but Gibson picked up and ran powerfully forward before spinning the ball out wide to Dan Montgomery whose pace saw him outstrip the defence as he ran the ball in from 40 metres. Chester fought back and their forwards' driving play saw them inch their way up the field. Finally they powered over for a try in the corner. The score remained at 5 - 5 for the next 20 minutes as the teams turned around level. Aycliffe's forwards up a gear in the second half as they took the game to the opposition, with hooker Jamie Whelan at the forefront of much that was

good about their play, but the scoreboard stubbornly stayed at 5 - 5. Eventually, with only 15 minutes left, the forwards gained their reward when captain Deryk Cairns was able to power over from short range. Montgomery added a fine conversion to make the lead 7 points. The game was effectively won with a bizarre try. The Chester full-back, under pressure from Jeff Hodgson, completely missed the ball in his attempt to kick it into touch; Andy Littlefair quickly picked it up and calmly drew the last defender before feeding Jonny Griffith, who sped in unopposed. Montgomery added another excellent kick. Although there was time for only one more play, Aycliffe now sensed a 4th, bonus point, try. They quickly spun the ball wide and broke into Chester territory, but the final pass went to ground; Chester launched a counter-attack and, with the Aycliffe defence in tatters, crossed the line for a try. Their kicker then coolly slotted the extras to give the home side a losing bonus point of their own. The game ended with a 19 - 12 victory for the visitors. This result keeps Aycliffe in 3rd place in Durham and Northumberland Division 3, but on 17th January they host 2nd place Houghton in a must win game at Moore Lane; kick-off 2.15pm. Aycliffe Rugby is sponsored by S Cars and Whitehouse funeral services.

After last week's 4-2 home win against Witton Victoria, Newton Aycliffe Sports Club went one better this weekend with a magnificent 5-2 win against Title Favourites Darlington Rolling Mills, at Moore Lane, to make it 8 straight wins off the belt. The two teams had already met twice this season with the Sports Club losing 5-0 in the League and 4-0 in the Heart Foundation Cup, so this was always going to be a tough test for the hosts. Due to numerous absentees, manager Paul Eales was forced to change from his trusting 5-3-2 formation, to a more traditional 4-4-2 set up, with David Teder and Anth Campbell taking up the wide midfield roles. Both teams were intent in setting out their stalls early on the heavy pitch and when a free kick was awarded just outside the area on 15 minutes, it was Paul Cook who gave the hosts the lead, lofting the ball over the wall and past the stranded keeper. Free scoring Rolling Mills were finding it difficult to breakdown the tough tackling home side with Mark Craggs returning to the centre of defence not allowing anything to get past him. On the 35 minute mark, in form Chris Jones got on the score sheet after a lovely weighted pass from David Teder allowed him to break through the defence and round the keeper to slot home and make it 2-0. Then five minutes later, just moments before half time it was Connor Hughes who made it three, slotting the ball in past the keeper after good work from strike partner Jones. The Rolling Mills came out fighting in the second half and with the benefit of a strong wind they gradually began to put the home side under intense pressure with Keeper Andy Hartley having to be on guard numerous times to keep them out. A penalty was awarded for the away team on the hour mark which was slammed home to give the Darlington side some hope of getting back in the game. However, the comeback was short lived as another floating free kick from Paul Cook saw Connor Hughes leap high above anyone else, including the away keeper, to head home his second and the teams fourth on 65 mins. Andy Hartley was kept busy with the away side continuing to press and trying their luck – but the keeper was in fine form and it wasn't until the



80th minute they managed to find a way past him and the battling defence, to make it 4-2. Not to be outdone though, Connor Hughes completed his fourth hatrick of the season with an easy tap in at the far post to make it 5-2 and record a memorable win which saw the Sports Club climb to the top of the table for the first time this season, a position they will be fighting to maintain over the remaining 7 league games. Next week is derby week, when NASC FC take the short trip across town to Simpasture Park to play The Huntsman in what will prove to be a very difficult tie, but one not to be missed. Support the Wildcats this Sunday at 4pm at the Leisure Centre

As the team switches from league competition to the first round of the BBL Trophy, Head Coach Lee Davie is making defence the primary focus in training for his players. The Durham Wildcats will face the Worcester Wolves this Sunday, a team whose second-best scoring offense in the league has helped them to a second place position in BBL Championship. For the BBL Trophy, however, the standings will be reset to 0-0 and the Wildcats want to use a victory in this competition over a quality Worcester side as a boost for the remainder of the season. Durham will host Worcester on Sunday 18th January at the Newton Aycliffe Leisure Centre with tipoff set for 4:00pm. While the Wolves average 85.26 points per game against Durham's ninth-best 76.89, the Wildcats have an advantage is scoring percentage. Davie's squad scores on 54.03 percent of their shots, a mark which makes Durham one of the most efficient shooting teams in the BBL. Worcester has a 49.34 shooting percentage. This normally would generate more wins for a club, but for the 7-12 Durham Wildcats, the inability to gain defensive

stops has made it difficult for the team to come away with more victories. With this in mind, Durham will emphasise defence more than ever for this weekend. "We have had issues on the defensive end that we need to improve upon," Davie said. "That's the focus all week long. We have made adjustments based on the need to generate more stops. Looking throughout the league we are the second-best shooting team in the league but we are not getting many offensive opportunities. Defensively we are not getting a lot of stops to get those extra possessions." Leading the attack for Worcester's prolific offense is Robert Thurman. The 6'10 American centre averages 18.6 points per contest and 10.9 rebounds, creating a challenge for the Wildcats. Durham's big men in John Puk and Fran Urli will combine to stop Worcester's inside presence with expectations to create scoring opportunities for themselves. Puk and Urli have started 2015 well by scoring 18 and 16 versus Bristol Flyers (4th January) and 12 and 23 points versus Surrey United (10th January). Durham's frontcourt scoring is the result of an overall improvement in offensive play. Davie said his squad has done a much better job moving the ball, creating easy shots and finding open lanes for layups since coming back from the Christmas break. If the Wildcats can stop their opposing offenses more frequently, Davie believes his squad will gain more victories down the final stretch of the season, beginning this weekend versus Worcester. CLEAR PATHS AND DRIVES WITHOUT FEAR OF BEING SUED

As amber weather-warnings are issued across many parts of the UK, personal injury lawyers have reassured homeowners that they can clear paths and driveways of snow or ice without fear of being sued. “Every single winter someone somewhere stirs the myth that Good Samaritans shouldn’t be helpful and clear snow because they will be sued if someone then falls and is injured. It’s absurd,” said solicitor John Spencer, president of not-for-profit group the Association of Personal Injury Lawyers (APIL) which campaigns on behalf of injured people.

“Excuse the pun, but let’s clear this up right now. There is a distinct difference between a simple accident and negligence which causes an injury when it comes to making a legal claim. “Whoever clears the snow or ice would have to be negligent to be liable for someone else’s injury,” said John. “For example, using hot water to melt snow which is then going to re-freeze and create a dangerous sheet of ice would be negligent, as well as foolish. Some salt or sand and a shovel will do the job safely. Use your common sense and no-one will get hurt.

John added that a Bill approved last week by the House of Lords which aims to remove the fear of being sued for people performing helpful acts “hits the wrong mark”. He said: “This myth about clearing paths is a perfect example of why the Social Action, Responsibility and Heroism Bill hits the wrong mark. The law is fine, but it is public understanding which isn’t right and which could prevent Good Samaritans from acting to help others. Education, not legislation, is the way to deal with misconceptions”.

Getting to Grips With Salty Roads

As the Met Office has issued yellow weather warnings of ice and snow for much of the country, roads are expected to be gritted to prevent snow from settling. The IAM’s chief examiner, Peter Rodger is offering advice to motorists to better cope with driving on road surfaces that have been recently treated. 1. If weather conditions are severe in your area you should take notice of police advice and simply don’t travel. However, in exceptional circumstances if you must go out make sure you drive safely with extra caution on icy roads. 2. Salt will often make the windscreen, headlights, number plate and rear parts of your car very dirty. Cars without headlamp washers, for example, will lose an estimated 40% of luminosity, and possibly all their focus in about 20 miles on a damp, gritted motorway. When travelling long distances it is advised that you stop regularly at service stations to clean your

windscreen and headlights with a clean cloth. Or keep a filled gallon of water in the car boot to give your lights, windows and mirrors a quick wash over – a handy investment to top up your windscreen washer reservoir when needed too. 3. When driving on a busy road avoid overtaking a gritting lorry as the road ahead may not be treated yet. If you have any doubt, don’t risk it. Never overtake a snow plough in heavy snow conditions. 4. While roads may be gritted to give you better traction some areas may not be completely treated, leaving ice patches exposed. You should therefore drive at a steady pace – ensuring the safety of you and your passengers. 5. It’s important you keep your car clean throughout the winter as the salt in grit can cause external damage such as corrosion to exposed suspension parts. Ensure you thoroughly wash underneath your car when you can to stop salt from settling.

6. Don’t forget to wash/rinse alloy wheels too; the smallest scratch can quickly become a large rust patch. Rodger said: “Preparation is the key to avoiding a dangerous situation whilst driving in snowy or icy conditions. Don’t rely on the performance of your car systems to get you out of trouble – allow time, make sure you have good visibility all round and carry the right equipment.”

Last Second Defeat by Two Points for Durham Wildcats



A last second bucket from Surrey United's Kramer Knutson sent the Wildcats home to Durham with an 80-78 defeat on 10th January. The loss drops Durham to a 7-12 record overall and the Wildcats continue to search for their first back-to-back to wins and road victory since late October. Fran Urli and Ralph Bucci kept the Wildcats in the contest with their combined seven three-pointers, most of them coming late in the game. Urli was the co-game leader in scoring with 23 points and he had eight rebounds and four assists in his strong performance Saturday night. Bucci added 13 points from

four three-pointers and one free throw. Two consecutive deep baskets from the captain gave the Wildcats their final lead of 78-76 with 1:21 left to play before Surrey United scored their final four points to secure the win. John Puk shot 6-10 from the field, earning himself 12 points. Panos Mayindombe overcame last week's ankle injury and had 10 points from a strong shooting performance 4-6 overall including nailing both of his three-point attempts. He also had four assists and a steal. Chris Jones led all players in the match with six assists in addition to his six points, four rebounds and the Wildcats' only other steal. David Buchberger and Sam Martin each had five points and Joel Madourie added four. The Wildcats trailed at halftime 37-35 but came out of the break strong with a 14-3 run to take a 49-40 lead. Surrey United answered back with their own string of buckets to later even out the score. Throughout the contest it was Surrey's ability to score in the paint which gave Lee Davie and the Wildcats struggles. Fifty-two of Surrey's 80 points came within the key, besting Durham's 30 points from that area. Overall, the Wildcats were 29-59 (49.2) shooting from the field and they were 11-12 from the free throw line. Surrey United struggled from

distance, going 2-11 from beyond the arc. Yet they shot for 58 percent from close range. Surrey United improve to 4-15 in regular season play and lifted themselves out of the bottom of the ladder. Durham remain in 8th place thanks to the Wildcats' nearest table rivals Bristol Flyers' 82-59 defeat to Leicester Riders.
