What makes Revenant stand out from the rest is the years of experience and musicianship put into play during their live performances. LOCAL FAMILY'S APPEAL TO HELP DISABLED CHILDREN

Well-known local Artist John Palliser has been forced to close his studio and put his work on hold to become a full time carer in support of his wife Melanie. She has been the driving force in getting all the services in place the children need, even though she is registered disabled with hypermobility syndrome, scoliosis and arthritis of the spine. The couple have 4 children aged 5, 8, 13, and 17. Their 8 year old son Kain has Autism which includes sensory and communication issues. 13 year old Callum has ODD, ADHD, learning Dispraxia, and disabilities

The organisations who help look after the children's care have concluded their current home is too small to meet their needs. Kain shares a room with his 5 year old brother and his 13 year old disabled brother which is proving detrimental to their well being. Kain also suffers from night terrors and needs a bedroom of his own that can be adapted to suit his needs where he can chill out and feel safe.

The Children's occupational services are trying to obtain a DFG Disabled facilities grant with which it is hoped will build the additional bedroom space, but this grant is not allowed to be used to pay for the land it is to be built on. With the help of Phil Wilson MP the County Council have agreed to

The Council proposes to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32 & 35 & Pt IV of Sch. 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect being: (A) Walworth School, Bluebell Way –remove the existing School Keep Clears outside the school and a School Keep Clear at the new pedestrian entrance introduced. (B) Byerley Park Primary School, Staintondale – extend the existing School Keep Clears at its junction with the school and No Waiting At Any Time introduced on both sides from the existing School Keep Clears south eastwards to its junction and including its junction with Greenfield Way. (C) Alan Gray Court/Carers Way and including its junction with Greenfield Way. (C) Alan Gray Court/Carers Way -introduce No Waiting At Any Time on both sides with its junction with Burn Lane, west side from its junction with Alan Gray Court northwards to its access with PCC. East side around its junction with the access road into the shopping centre. Both sides of the access road into the shopping centre. (D) Newton Aycliffe Industrial Estate, Howden Road, Groat Avenue and Groat Drive – extend the waiting restrictions south by 47m. Remove the existing restriction in front of the parking layby on Groat Avenue. Howden Road, Groat Avenue and Groat Drive - the existing No Waiting 7am-6pm has been removed and replaced with a No Waiting At Any Time restriction. All other existing restrictions applicable on the following roads. Great First Year for Friends of West Park Greenfield College Go Solar THANK YOU

Two solar panel systems have recently been fitted to Greenfield Community College, Newton Aycliffe educational bringing opportunities and renewable power to the school

Greenfield's Executive David Headteacher Priestley said: "As a school we decided to look at solar PV panels for a number of reasons. Firstly it allows us to reduce our energy cost which means we can redirect the saving to buy additional resources for students, but it also means we can enhance our students understanding of renewable power, energy use and the need to reduce carbon emissions with reallife contextual learning.

"We have a role to play in our community to help students understand how long-term global challenges, like climate change and protecting our environment, are affected by personal, local and national initiatives and that by using power generated by the sun, we are playing our part in contributing to

change for the better.' The solar PV systems are owned and will be managed, maintained and run by Engynious Clean Power (UK). In total over panels will provide 400 106kWp which is expected to generate nearly 25% of the school's daytime electricity demand and save the school around 78 tonnes of carbon every year. The lower price of the energy generated by the solar power will mean that the school should see savings in the first year of £3,500 which will over rise as mains supplied electricity prices increase. UK director Engynious Gregor Loukidis said:





A wider pool of foster carers enables fostering services to be able to match the needs of each child more closely with the skills that each foster carer brings, and to find the right home for each child, first time. Make sure you read the terms and conditions of the retailer before purchasing, or if

you are the unfortunate victim of a recurring payment scam, contact your bank or card provider to stop the payments if the merchant refuses Rights when paying by card If you have purchased an item at an individual price of £100
