Sam Hauxwell Review: "The blistering set takes in AC/DC, Saxon, Black Sabbath, Iron Maiden, Ozzy, Scorpions, Metallica, Rainbow, Guns 'n' Roses etc... not always the usual choices but a mixed bag of METAL mayhem!!"

The Frigate is a fantastic bar to see any live act, but when Revenant come knocking at the door, it's a different experience altogether. What makes Revenant stand out from the rest is the years of experience and musicianship put into play during their live performances. Arguably one of the greatest local bands I've ever seen, they never disappoint their audience which is full of bikers and a loyal following. Revenant have a fantastic setlist, which is even enjoyed by those that wouldn't consider themselves metal fans, I personally wouldn't have ever thought of myself as a metal fan but coming from the Frigate on Saturday night, I found myself singing their setlist long after they'd finished their mind blowing performance. Black Sabbath, Rage Against the Machine and Metallica are just some of the bands they cover songs from, chewing it up into their own sound and spitting it back into the audience's ears as a kick-in-the-balls stamp on their live covers. Wherever they go Revenant create an atmosphere like no other, and it's often hard to find a band with music skills as high as theirs, with the ability to get the audience pumped and feeling like they own the world. Revenant own the current local music scene, for no other band has yet managed to reach their live music experience, it's a phenomenon that is only understood by those who have seen them, my only advice is to watch out, for when Revenant change your world".

LOCAL FAMILY'S APPEAL TO HELP DISABLED CHILDREN

Well-known local Artist John Palliser has been forced to close his studio and put his work on hold to become a full time carer in support of his wife Melanie. She has been the driving force in getting all the services in place the children need, even though she is registered disabled with hyper-mobility syndrome, scoliosis and arthritis of the spine. The couple have 4 children aged 5, 8, 13, and 17. Their 8 year old son Kain has Autism which includes sensory and communication issues. 13 year old Callum has ODD, ADHD, Dispraxia, and learning disabilities.

The organisations who help look after the children's care have concluded their current home is too small to meet their needs. Kain shares a room with his 5 year old brother and his 13 year old disabled brother which is proving detrimental to their well being. Kain also suffers from night terrors and needs a bedroom of his own that can be adapted to suit his needs where he can chill out and feel safe.

The Children's occupational services are trying to obtain a DFG Disabled facilities grant with which it is hoped will build the additional bedroom space, but this grant is not allowed to be used to pay for the land it is to be built on. With the help of Phil Wilson MP the County Council have agreed to

sell the land for about £6,000 but the family have no way of raising the cash.

Charities approached are no longer able to provide funding for land purchase. Melanie & John are working with local councillors Eddy Adams & Kate Hopper to find a charity

or loan company to fully fund the purchase so the building work can go ahead quickly as the situation is now becoming desperate.

Chairman's Medal for Community Champion

A tireless community worker, who is dedicated to supporting people in need, has been recognised for her work by being awarded a Chairman's Medal.

Susan Sadler, founder of Lifeline Community Action has been chosen by Durham County Council Chairman; Cllr John Robinson as the Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP) recipient of this year's Chairman's Medal.

Having first started encouraging a small group in her home, Susan has been the driving force behind Lifeline Community Action. Lifeline Community Action is a registered crisis intervention charity that

works across the GAMP area. In the last year they have been able to support over 2000 people. Most of the people benefiting have severe financial problems, are in financial crisis and/or in crippling debt.

Camilla Louise Shergold, who nominated Susan for the Chairman's Medal, said: 'It doesn't seem that Susan has a day off. It's not all plain sailing, she has never given up, when many others say, it's too difficult.'

The Chairman's Medal has been County Durham's top civic award since it was introduced in 2007 and Durham County Council Chairman; Cllr John Robinson will be holding a

ceremony on 13th March to present awards to 'individuals for voluntary effort or 'outstanding charitable organisations'. There will be 14 winners, representing each AAP area across the county.

Cllr Robinson, said: 'I want this presentation event to be a celebration of the achievements and effort that people of our county put in every day - a little time to reflect on the excellent work that people do for each other.'

GAMP received 19 nominations for this year's Chairman's Medal with Cllr Robinson selecting the overall winner from a shortlist of three applications. GAMP Coordinator Brian Riley, said: 'I was extremely pleased with the number and quality of the nominations that GAMP received for this year's Chairman's Medal. The final decision on who received a Medal must have been a difficult one for Cllr Robinson to make.'



Brian Riley also added: 'On behalf of GAMP, I would like to acknowledge the tremendous work that all those nominated do in our community. I would like to single out for a special mention, the other two applicants that were shortlisted for the medal, these are; John Hilton (Honest John) and the Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP).'

ELMFIELD POLITICAL ROW LESS THAN HELPFUL

Dear Sir, What is to be done with Elmfield site? Weeks after broaching the subject and having read all manner of correspondence in this publication no sensible suggestions have come forward. We are told that a covenant exists on the land promoting education yet we are informed that there is no need for another school locally.

So we have a beautiful piece of land situated adjacent to a desirable area overlooking a fantastic lakeside vista which is not being used because of political disagreement. It is hard to draw any significant conclusion from this but it does explain why it takes so long to achieve anything. If this impasse is to continue perhaps we should be looking at alternative utilisation for the land ie:

Enlarge the park to include the land and devise something educational to erect on the land such as a wildlife or botanical centre. Remove the covenant and put in a skate park, BMX track or something adventurous. Whatever the final decision it must in some way benefit the community and blend in with the surrounding area. GREENFIELD COLLEGE IS ON THE BALL!

A popular sport facility is set for a major refurbishment thanks to funding received from Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP). The well used 3G Pitch at Greenfield Community College opened in 2004 and has over 50,000 visits a year; however, as a result of the high demand the current 8-a-side floodlit 3G surface is now becoming worn. GAMP has allocated Area Budget funding and a contribution from the Neighbourhood Budgets of Cllrs Eddy Adam, John Clare, Mike Dixon, Joan Gray, Jed Hillary, Kate Hopper and Sarah Iveson, along with substantial match funding from Greenfield

Community College to provide a new playing surface. Greenfield Community College is a well-established site for Community Sport. Since the opening of the current football facility in 2004 a number of strong partnerships have been developed. These partners use the 3G pitch regularly, and are growing each year. Greenfield College Go Solar THANK YOU Great First Year for Friends of West Park

Two solar panel systems have recently been fitted to Greenfield Community College, Newton Aycliffe bringing educational opportunities and renewable power to the school.



Greenfield's Executive Headteacher David Priestley said: "As a school we decided to look at solar PV panels for a number of reasons. Firstly it allows us to reduce our energy cost which means we can redirect the saving to buy additional resources for students, but it also means we can enhance our students understanding of renewable power, energy use and the need to reduce carbon emissions with real-life contextual learning." "We have a role to play in our community to help students understand how long-term global challenges, like climate change and protecting our environment, are affected by personal, local and national initiatives and that by using power generated by the sun, we are playing our part in contributing to change for the better." The solar PV systems are owned and will be managed, maintained and run by Engynious Clean Power (UK). In total over 400 panels will provide 106kWp which is expected to generate nearly 25% of the school's daytime electricity demand and save the school around 78 tonnes of carbon every year. The lower price of the energy generated by the solar power will mean that the school should see savings in the first year of over £3,500 which will rise as mains supplied electricity prices increase. Engynious UK director Gregor Loukidis said:

"Our programme gives schools, which do not have capital to spend, a fantastic opportunity to reap the benefits of solar power, to look at energy supply and reduce their energy bills and their carbon footprint at the same time. This project is a long-term partnership and will deliver schools an immediate saving and long-term benefits." The ingenious programme is run in co-operation with SEEd, the national charity that encourages schools to embrace sustainability into what they do and teach. Ann Finlayson, CEO of the sustainability and environmental education charity, SEEd, said: "We can't all afford solar PV or find the time and resources to apply for it but by working with Engynious schools have an opportunity to buy solar energy more cheaply than they currently pay for electricity so it's a no risk, no cost option that helps schools develop their sustainability education." One of SEEd's network members is the local charity, OASES, which promotes sustainability and outdoor learning to schools in and around Durham. By working with Engynious, it is hoped that schools across the County will take up more opportunities to extend their environmental

education and explore the generation, use and conversation of energy.



On Friday 13th February, we celebrated the first anniversary of the opening of Room 13 at Greenfield Arts. Over the past year work in the space has gone from strength to strength as we explored SOLE and enquiry based learning.

We were honoured to be approached by Professor Sugata Mitra when he won his \$1 million TED prize to develop a self-organised learning environment (SOLE) at Greenfield. Katy Milne, Director of Arts & Creativity said: "This is where the teacher takes a step back and sits outside the room while the young people explore a big question with each other using the internet, and the results are incredible."

Since opening there have

been more than 160 SOLE sessions in the space, led by more than 30 different staff members at Greenfield Community College. The room has had international visitors from 7 different countries, and been observed and admired by educational colleagues from more than 10 other schools and organisations across the UK.

Young people from age 5 to age 16 have explored more than 20 subject areas, answering big questions and continuing to learn. Our fantastic Engineheads have led 6 SOLE sessions for teachers and staff, and shared their findings and experiences at 3 conferences. After this great first year, we are looking forward to expanding and building on the success of Room 13, exploring the SOLE research with Newcastle & Northumbria Universities, and continuing to share our findings in the global educational world.

Thank you to Professor Sugata Mitra for choosing to work with us and develop one of his 2013 TED Prize winning labs here at Greenfield. It is a privilege to be one of the seven labs across the world exploring SOLEs as part of this School in the Cloud TED Prize wish.



COMBINED AUTHORITIES BUDGET AGREED

The final elements of the North East Combined Authority budget have been agreed. Members of the authority met this week to discuss the proposed transport grant to Nexus and resources for securing inward investment. Decisions on both issues were postponed at the neca meeting on 20 January to allow further consideration to take place. Following this, members of the board have now agreed the two outstanding matters, namely:
• the approval of the transport grant to Nexus of £64.5m for the delivery of transport services in Tyne and Wear; and
• that contributions for the £70,000 base budget for inward investment are shared equally between the seven local authorities.
Members also agreed that increasing the level of support for inward investment would be considered at the next meeting. Cllr Simon Henig, chair of neca, said: "I am very pleased that these remaining budget issues have been agreed. "This will enable us to move forward and focus on delivering the transport and economic priorities needed to encourage investment in our region, promote successful businesses and bring new jobs."

7,190 children who were fostered were placed over 20 miles from their home. Without enough foster families willing and able to offer homes to these groups, some children will find themselves living a long way from family, friends and their school. It could also lead to them being split up from brothers and sisters, or being placed with a foster carer who does not have the right skills and experience to meet their specific needs. These pressures can lead to relationships breaking down, and children having to make regular moves between homes. Some young people will also be living in residential care when fostering has been identified as the best option for them. Jackie Sanders, director of public affairs at The Fostering Network, said: "Fostering can be an incredibly rewarding career and lifestyle choice for

those who do come forward, opening their hearts and homes to children and young people who need security and stability. "Fostering is also a challenging job, and when the match between foster family and child is not right, it becomes even more difficult. A wider pool of foster carers enables fostering services to be able to match the needs of each child more closely with the skills that each foster carer brings, and to find the right home for each child, first time. "However, as well as recruiting new foster carers, fostering services must look at the foster carers who are currently available to them in their local area. Where existing foster carers have space in their homes, it may be possible to retrain and support them to look after different ages of children with a variety of different needs. "Children and young people

come into care for a wide range of reasons, but all come needing professional, dedicated and compassionate support. Foster carers are remarkable people who open their homes to some of society's most disadvantaged children and young people. Fostering services approved over 7,175 new foster families in England alone in 2013/14, but recruitment remains an ongoing challenge to replace those who leave and to meet the needs of the children coming into care. "We urgently need people who have the right skills and qualities to foster to come forward and make a long lasting positive difference to the life of a child. In particular, foster carers are needed to provide homes for teenagers and children with disabilities, and to help sibling groups stay together." STAY SAFE WHEN YOU GO SHOPPING ON-LINE

As more of us regularly head online to shop, Durham County Council's Fair Trading Team has issued some top tips to raise awareness of the pitfalls and scams residents may face when internet shopping.

The advice comes after Safer Internet Day on Tuesday (February 10), which aims to promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology and buying online. Joanne Waller, head of environment, health and consumer protection with the council, said: "Online shopping can save our residents a lot of time when buying the products they want and can often provide a much-needed bargain.

"Unfortunately there are those who aim to exploit online shoppers and we want to ensure our residents are safe when buying over the internet. We hope the advice we've provided will raise awareness of the scams that may impact our residents and make sure their finances and wellbeing aren't at risk."

To help residents be safer when clicking to buy, Durham County Council's Fair Trading team have the following advice when buying online:

Reputable and secure sites
Before you type your card details into a website ensure that the site is secure. Secure

websites will have 'https' in front of the web address as well as a padlock in the address bar to show that the payment process is safe.

Beware of 'too good to be true' deals

If you find an unbelievable price for high-quality goods and luxury brands, the chances are that you won't get what you expect. The products you receive may be counterfeit and poor in quality, or you may find that you don't receive anything at all, instead finding yourself out of pocket by buying from a fake website. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is.

Recurring payment scams

When buying online, you may think you are buying a one-off item only to find that you have committed to paying monthly for years. Make sure you read the terms and conditions of the retailer before purchasing, or if you are the unfortunate victim of a recurring payment scam, contact your bank or card provider to stop the payments if the merchant refuses.

Rights when paying by card

If you have purchased an item at an individual price of £100

or more with a credit card, your credit card issuer must come to your aid and deal with your complaint if something goes wrong.

Buying goods on internet auction sites

When you buy something from an internet auction site, you are buying from a private individual or a trader, not the site. Your rights can be very

limited when buying through an auction, so be sure to use a site with a payment protection scheme which will not release your payment until you have received the goods.

Be wary of junk emails

Look out for phishing emails which detail offers or subscriptions and ask for your personal and financial information. Never go to a website from a link within an email and then enter your details, what you enter may be used for identity fraud.

Research your online retailer

If you are unsure as to the reputation of the site you are looking to buy from, ask friends, colleagues or family members to see if they have used the site previously or do some research online to see if it has been mentioned favourably on sites you already trust.


