## Removal of A167 Street Lights Brings Mass Protest

### Residents' Association Open Letter to Council

Dear Sir,  
The Management Committee of the Great Aycliffe Residents' Association has requested that I write to you regarding the public consultation on the proposed removal of street lights along the A167 by Newton Aycliffe.

We are appalled that Durham County Council can even consider taking this detrimental step on a major A road in the southern part of Durham County. Insofar as Newton Aycliffe is concerned the stretch of the A167 is not rural or countryside but a major trunk road through an urban and built up area. This is usually busy with traffic not least people and bus services taking people to and from work in major catchment areas. That is why it is an A road and a major transport route in the South of Durham County, servicing one, if not the largest Industrial Estates in County Durham.

At the time Durham County Council is asking businesses to support its

County Durham Plan for jobs and growth, it makes no sense for it to remove the street-lights from the approaches to this major economic growth-point identified in the Plan - Aycliffe Business Park. We understand that a risk assessment has declared the lights can safely be removed. We strongly challenge this for many sections of the A167 near Aycliffe. The road has a path alongside it from Aycliffe Village to Framwellgate Moor, with a significant pedestrian footfall, particularly along the Newton Aycliffe section. There are also many access routes, farm tracks and lay-bys along the section from Aycliffe Village to Rushyford. Apparently the County Council's policy foresees the removal of street-lights in rural areas between

settlements. The stretch of road from Aycliffe to Croxdale does not fit anybody's perception of 'rural', and is mainly 'industrial' or 'urban'. The road runs beside or through Newton Aycliffe, Chilton, Ferryhill and Durham Gate, and does not meet anybody's idea of 'between settlements'. We are concerned with road, pedestrian and cyclists safety in the dark months of winter and in foggy and poor visibility conditions. We could possibly

## College Students Get a Taste of Army Life



D (Rifles) Coy Fifth Fusiliers gave students from Bishop Auckland College experience of the army and how it operates and will work with them over two years. They will become better leaders and much better prepared for a career in the uniformed or public services. They have been issued with hoodys and T-shirts with the D Coy college logo. They have carried out a complex exercise entitled "Operations Head Above Water" run by Thrills and Skills for Life - a local team building company, assisted by D (Rifles) Coy.

On Friday 27th February the students attended stage 2 of the exercise, where they visited the Army Reserve Centre in Woodhorn Lane taking rifle training, light drill (different to the rest of the British Army's drill, at 120 paces a minute) and team building tasks. The students were taught, how the sighting system works on an SA80 Rifle, the standard infantry weapon of the British Army and were given an introduction into its workings. They all handled the weapon and got a feel for the sights. In the Team Building tasks they had to retrieve

equipment from a simulated minefield which proved for many of them more difficult than they first imagined. Testing and improving their leadership and team work skills.

Finally the light drill was a new experience! The only regiment in the British Army to conduct this particular drill is the Rifles and as a Rifles Coy within FIFTH FUSILIERS it was taught to the students, with mixed results of success! Katy Graham, Head of Uniform and Public Services and Sport at Bishop Auckland College said "This is an excellent opportunity for students to see the army in action.

Carl Sayers a member of the course said "I enjoyed today, the team building was fun, even though we didn't achieve the task! Learning light drill is very tough and it's made me look at the army very differently, the people are much nicer and caring than I imagined, it's made me interested in joining"

Danielle Johnson (17) from Aycliffe a former student at Greenfield said "A really great opportunity - I hadn't realised reservists were so active and so capable of so much. It's really opened my eyes to the army and I'm now open to the thought of joining which I was not before"



## Centre Makes Progress Despite Setbacks

Dear Sir,  
The Scout Supporters Association based at Bluebell Way would like to thank everyone who has helped them with the refurbishment of the hall and the extension to the bar/lounge, and those who helped following the recent break-ins.

After many months of planning and building our premises have now got a fresh new look and are proving to be very popular with new and old customers. The association raise the funding needed to maintain and run the Scout Centre. Most of this funding is generated from the bar sales and hall hire

which is one of the reasons an extension to the bar was considered to be necessary. This has enabled us to increase our customer base and generate more income. For the year ending 31/12/2012 the cost of the heating, lighting, rates, water, insurance and cleaning amounted to £15,427, so you can see that a great deal of money is required.

We do not get any funding or grant aid from the Council or scouting organisations - all the money is from our supporters. The centre is run by volunteers and the scouting groups use the premises free of charge.

The money spent on the building and renovations was raised over a number of years from donations and a few small grants which had been applied for to hopefully extend the premises on a much larger scale. Due to rising costs and some problems with the original plans the second hall which was planned could not be built. It was therefore decided to use the money to improve the existing building, and we are planning a small extension to the hall to provide additional toilets and a couple of small meeting rooms when funds allow.

Unfortunately due to the losses suffered during recent break-ins and the cost of repairing the damage, much of the money which was available to put towards this has been used so we do not know at the moment when we will be able to complete this part of the plan. We would like to thank everyone who has helped with the building in any way in particular we would like to thank Bespoke Flooring, PAR Design and Build Services Ltd, B & C Building Contractors, Wades Group, Halls Plant Hire, Lee Bates Flooring, Homeflair Blinds, New Wave Furniture (who gave us contact details for our seating), the owner of the Black Boy Pub Hetton le Hole for the seating, and the members who helped

with the carpets and seating, and Clearance Bargains for the TV. Following the break-ins we also thank Chris from C & G Cash registers, Andy Bruce Trading, Newton Aycliffe Police and last but not least Ross Wright in particular Eddie and Danny who worked all night to make new doors. We are also grateful to Newton News for all publicity given. I apologise if I've missed any one, but a big thank you to you all. Please come and visit us and help us fulfil our plans. ## County's Big Spring Clean is Back

## Rotary Club, Barclays and Boots Support Scanner Appeal

### Residents Asked to Buy Raffle Tickets

Over the last decade MRI scanning has increasingly become the preferred method used by Cardiologists and Cardiac Surgeons for diagnosing heart problems. It has considerable advantages over traditional methods, providing very detailed images of the heart, including the condition of the muscle, tissue and valves. This enables treatment to be specifically targeted, leading to significantly improved results for patients. The James Cook University Hospital in Middlesbrough currently has two MRI scanners that are available for use by all departments other than Neurology which has its own dedicated facility. In response to the continually increasing demand across the board for MRI scanning, JCUH has recently committed some £2.3M, including £0.3M from the SCHF, to replacing the oldest scanner with a new 'state of the art' machine that will be used for most of the general purpose scanning. Commissioning of the new scanner will release significantly more time for

heart scans on the second of the existing machines, for which it is more suitable than the new machine. However, its processing capacity will still be well below the 2000 per year that is recognised as desirable for the JCUH catchment area of some 1.6 million people. If heart scanning capacity is not increased to this level, the regional Cardiothoracic Centre at JCUH may lose its place in the top division of Cardiothoracic Units, with heart patients in the hospital's catchment area unable to benefit from this advanced diagnosis and treatment. There is also the likelihood that, as a consequence, it may no longer be possible to recruit and retain the best professionals. To address the above issue, the opportunity exists to refurbish and upgrade the second of the existing scanners at a cost of £0.5M to meet the required level of 2000 per year. However, because of funding shortfalls, South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust has declared that it will not be in a position to commit to this investment for the foreseeable future.

It is against this background that the SCHF, with support from JCUH, has decided to mount an appeal to raise the £0.5M that is required. Middlesbrough Erimus Rotary Club has now finalised arrangements with SCHF to organise and run a region-wide raffle with the objective of raising a substantial proportion of the funds required. It is planned that the "Loving Hearts Scanner Appeal" raffle will be launched on 13th March 2015, and tickets will be sold over a period of eleven weeks, leading up to a gala charity dinner on Saturday 20th June when the prize draw will take place. Newton Aycliffe Rotary Club is supporting the appeal and will be collecting at Boots the Chemists from 9am to 4pm and Barclays Bank from 9.30am to 2pm both on 14th March 2015. Whilst the aim is to sell raffle tickets, anyone wishing to simply make a donation may do so in either establishment on that date. Barclays Bank plc will match all ticket sales or donations on that date up to a total of £1000.

## BUSINESSES URGED TO OBJECT TO COUNCIL'S A167 LIGHTING PLANS

### Open Letter to Aycliffe Companies

Durham County Council has revealed intentions to remove street lighting from the A167, in particular the stretch that passes by Aycliffe Business Park. We understand that junctions will remain lit, but in all other areas the streetlamps will be removed. This will be done between the roundabout at St Andrew's Way (near the AIM junction 59) at the roundabout

at Cock o'the North, Durham and also, north of Durham, from the Framwellgate Moor roundabout to Chester Moor. I'm sure you are aware how passionate we are about improving Aycliffe Business Park and its surrounding area, which is why there are plans to put further signage in place over the coming months. With these aspirations in mind, it is the wrong time to make the business park area feel like the lights are out and nobody's home.

Although we are getting towards the summer months it is worth reminding you of how dark the winter months can be, with darkness often falling as early as 3pm and failing to brighten again until 10am. The A167 is one of three main north-south transport arteries in County Durham and too significant to throw in darkness and it remains a major route for ABP residents and clients.

We want Aycliffe Business Park to be the biggest industrial park in the region - why plunge the main route in and out of our business park into darkness? As the County Durham Job focuses on aspirations for jobs and growth it makes no sense to remove streetlights along the approaches to two of the major economic growth points already identified in the Plan - Aycliffe Business Park and Durham Gate. Without any objections made by our Business Park and its residents, this plan will go ahead without any further consultation. ## Benefits Won for Local People from New Rail Franchises

The North East Combined Authority has welcomed 'Invitations to Tender' for the Northern and TransPennine Express rail franchises published today, promising a better deal for passengers, additional journeys across the region and new local accountability for how services are delivered.

The neca has been working on behalf of local authorities to secure improvements to services and devolution of decision making in the new franchise specifications.

Cllr Nick Forbes, lead member for transport on the neca and leader of Newcastle City Council, said: "We have secured a commitment to replace the much-maligned Pacer train, improvements to evening and weekend services, and a requirement for substantial investment in the region's stations.

"Whoever wins the new franchise must also support community rail partnerships and join the roll-out of smart ticketing, which the Combined Authority is already bringing to bus and Metro in the North East.

"Crucially for this region, bidders for the Northern franchise will also be required to show how they will deliver a specific management unit for North East England, giving local people a say in how services are delivered. "I now challenge the shortlisted bidders for both franchises to commit to enhancements beyond the minimum requirements in the specifications, to deliver true transformation to the region's rail network and progress towards the vision set out in the neca's long-term rail strategy."

The improvements set out in the franchise specifications are a direct result of effective partnership between the Department for Transport and Rail North, a consortium of 29 local transport authorities from across the North of England of which the North East Combined Authority is a formal member.

The Combined Authority has worked with neighbouring authorities to achieve improvements including:

- **Bidders for the Northern Franchise must commit to replacing 'Pacer' trains by 2020;**
- **Services between Newcastle and Carlisle increased to two per hour;**
- **New Sunday train services between Newcastle, Cramlington and Morpeth;**
- **Upgraded hourly Sunday services between Middlesbrough, Sunderland and Newcastle;**
- **Upgraded hourly services between Bishop Auckland and Darlington, plus new Sunday services;**
- **Free wifi on Northern and TransPennine Express trains by 2020**
- **Plans for Transpennine trains to extend to Edinburgh from Newcastle.**
- **New Northern franchisee to set up Management Unit to work with the North East Combined Authority and other councils to make sure services fits local needs.**

Rail North will continue to work in partnership with the DfT throughout the bid evaluation process and will take a major role in managing the new franchises, once they begin in Spring 2016.

# Illegal Tobacco Sold from Ice Cream Van near School

An ice cream van known to park near primary schools in County Durham was raided as part of the latest crackdown on illicit tobacco sales.

Trading Standards officers from Durham County Council and police officers from Durham Constabulary searched the ice cream van at its storage location on a West Auckland farm, along with several other vehicles and a house in Bishop Auckland.

The raids were carried out on Wednesday evening (25 February) following tip offs that suspected counterfeit cigarettes were being sold from the van, which has been known to stop close to some primary schools. However, it is not known if any sales were made to children.

As a result of the raids a man and a woman were arrested and 4,560 cigarettes and 20.35kg of hand rolling tobacco was seized along with a large amount of cash. The cigarettes are believed to be 'cheap whites' made especially for the illegal market and the hand

rolling tobacco is believed to be smuggled. The estimated street value of the haul is more than £4,000.

Joanne Waller, head of environment, health and consumer protection at Durham County Council, said: "It is extremely concerning to receive information about suspected illegal tobacco being sold in the vicinity of schools. "It is important to be clear that we do not know if tobacco has been sold to any children in this instance but we would obviously never wish for young people to be exposed to this type of activity.

"We know that most smokers start when they are children and every year 207,000 under 18s take up the habit, including nearly 9,000 in the North East alone. A recent survey of smokers in the region found the average age at which they start was just 15.

"Working alongside our partners in the County Durham Tobacco Control Alliance we are committed to breaking the cycle of addiction and

exposure to tobacco in every community so that fewer people are affected by this deadly habit.

"One of the alliance's ambitions is that by 2030, smoking prevalence in the county is reduced to five per cent, and this is driven by a vision to make children the future focus for protection."

Wednesday's raid was the latest in a series of joint operations between Trading Standards and police with more than with more than 53,600 illicit cigarettes and 1,249 pouches of illicit tobacco having been seized in the county since April 2014.

Anyone convicted of supplying counterfeit tobacco could face up to 10 years in prison as well as unlimited fines and their assets may be seized via proceeds of crime action.

The Department for Transport has announced a range of improvements to local rail services on the busy Darlington to Bishop Auckland railway line.

The improvements from part of a much wider package that will see rail services transformed right across the north and brought into the 21st century. Local rail users can look forward to the current 2 hourly service to Bishop Auckland being increased to hourly, more Sunday trains and newer rolling stock with the current fleet of aging 'pacer' trains finally being replaced by modern, more comfortable carriages.

The improvements have been included in the new Northern franchise which is due to start March 2016 with most timetable improvements due to be in place by 2019. The franchise sets out the minimum level of service that must be provided, so local rail passengers can confidently expect the improvements will be delivered.

Charlie Walton, the Chairman of the Bishop Line community rail partnership said. 'This is



fantastic news for local rail users; we have been talking to the Department for Transport for many years now about the need to improve local train services in the north and they have finally listened to us.

'Patronage on our local rail line has increased sharply over recent years and we need more trains to deal with the extra passengers. The Bishop Auckland to Darlington rail line plays an important role in regenerating the economies of County Durham, Darlington and the wider North East, helping people get to work, to the shops and to education, and tourism, opportunities, so this is great news for our local economy as well.'

Local rail users have long complained about the ageing rolling stock used on the

Bishop Auckland line. These 'pacer' trains which date from the early 1980s are jokingly referred to as cattle trucks by long suffering rail commuters and are used on local rail services right across the north of England. The new franchise will see these old trains phased out and replaced by a fleet of modern trains over the life of the new franchise.

Charlie went on to say that 'We have long called for the removal of pacer trains from our railway lines here in the north, we don't believe this rolling stock would never be tolerated in London and the South East and is certainly not good enough for us here in the North East, we're delighted that we will soon be seeing them replaced with modern, more comfortable rolling stock.

## Protest over Proposal to Remove A167 Lighting

Dear Mr Reed,  
On behalf of ACORN Residents' Association based in the central area of Newton Aycliffe, we would like to add our voices to the protest which is swiftly growing in opposition to the Durham County Council plan advocating the removal of lighting alongside the A167. As a group we believe ACORN is a positive supporter of our County Council but in this particular case the perceived risk to life is believed to be considerable alongside a busy highway which services many settlements in southwest Durham and therefore would

advise extreme caution. Scenarios likely to increase concern in the Newton Aycliffe area include:

- **Poor visibility for pedestrians and cyclists.**
- **Access to Newton Aycliffe and its adjacent industrial estate from the Copelaw site and Gretna Green/Premier Inn complex.**
- **Apparently under the County Durham Plan up to 900 homes are expected to be erected alongside the A167. Clearly if this is to be the case, football and cycle traffic crossing a major road in virtual darkness could result in a tragedy.**
- **Increase in traffic flow resulting from the Hitachi site and 'just in time supply traffic' to other successful sites operating from the Business Park are essential to the economy and employment in our county with good quality road access vital to the continued success of our Town.**

The thought process behind this scheme is presumably a saving of money and I can well understand from a fiscal viewpoint that line of thinking, however the safety of residents must take precedence.

Coming at a time when planning is taking place for Lumiere which must have a substantial cost for the ratepayers of County Durham, this latest cost saving measure strikes me as ironic in the extreme, and I look forward to you shedding a little "light" on the matter. Hopefully at a public meeting.

It can cost three times more to raise a disabled child than a non disabled child and our latest research has found that more than a quarter of families with disabled children

have additional expenses of over £300 every month.

Despite this, many parents tell us they don't claim DLA because they believe their child's disability isn't severe enough, their child needs a diagnosis first before they can make a claim or they aren't eligible because their child has a learning disability, autistic spectrum disorder or behaviour problems.







We could possibly understand though not agree with the County Council replacing the Orange Sodium Lights with the Lower Energy Costing LEDS as this would still provide a degree of illumination that would facilitate a degree of safety whilst saving on energy costs. To remove the lighting altogether is in effect deliberately introducing a degree of risk to pedestrians including an increased risk of attack of a physical or sexual nature, particularly against women, and cyclists that such darkness would entail.

We must insist that Durham County Council rethink its policy on this issue and to reappraise this matter with a view to maintaining all lighting, certainly insofar as Great Aycliffe and its Business Park is concerned.

To do so would be noble in motive and far reaching in purpose. Not to do so would be highly irresponsible and we would hold the Council morally to account as I think would all residents and businesses.



# Council's "Operation Stop It" Targets Enviro-crimes

More than 100 people have been fined after committing a string of crimes against the environment. Latest figures show Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection team issued 89 fixed penalty notices for littering throughout January, as well as a further six for dog fouling, seven for untidy gardens or yards and failing to comply with litter clearing notices and one for flytipping. The team is tasked with tackling various issues, including flytipping, dog fouling, stray dogs, littering and antisocial behaviour. As well as issuing a total of 103 fines, 57 community protection warnings and 10 community protection notices were handed

out to properties with untidy gardens or yards. Wardens also removed 141 stray dogs – a reminder of the importance of making sure dogs are microchipped so they can be traced and returned to their owner if they get lost. A total of 25 reports of antisocial behaviour were investigated after being passed from police airwaves and 96 alcohol seizures from underage children were also carried out. And, as part of Operation Stop It, a multi-agency crackdown on people who dump waste, the following statistics were recorded in January:

- 596 flytipping incidents were reported and investigated – 74 of which are still ongoing investigations.
- 17 CCTV cameras were

deployed in known flytipping hotspots.

- 24 people were interviewed in relation to flytipping offences.
- 11 duty of care letters were sent to people reminding them to dispose of their waste properly.
- Eight stop and check operations were carried out to establish whether waste carriers were licenced. All but one complied.
- As part of the stop and checks, three people were asked to produce the correct documents in relation to carrying waste.
- 11 flytipping cases were progressed for prosecution with two awaiting court dates.

Stop and check exercises are carried out by neighbourhood wardens and police to make sure vehicles have a licence to carry, transport or dispose of waste.

They form part of Operation Stop It, which has also seen a number of successful prosecutions through the courts, including a recent case where a man dumped about 100 bags of rubbish from a pub. The man, from Peterlee, was ordered to pay a total of £366 by magistrates last month (February) after admitting the offence, which took place in Hetton-le-Hole.

Ian Hoult, neighbourhood protection manager at Durham County Council, said: "We're building on the momentum of our campaign to stamp out flytipping across the county and the number of people prosecuted as a result is testament to these efforts."

"We work closely with Durham Constabulary, Crimestoppers and the Environment Agency to investigate every report of flytipping and to determine whether the waste can be traced back to the owner. The use of extra CCTV cameras at flytipping hotspots throughout the county is also providing robust evidence to use when prosecuting offenders."

"Whilst education is always the first step, when it comes to environmental offences like flytipping our message is clear – we will not tolerate it and anyone who commits waste crime can expect to be fined or even hauled through the courts."

Domestic rubbish can be taken to any of the county's Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs) and bulky waste collections can be arranged through the council by calling 03000 261000. Businesses are also reminded that they must meet their duty of care in correct waste disposal by using licenced waste carriers to collect and dispose of business waste correctly.

Over the last few weeks Greenfield Community College has welcomed 'CrossFit All Out' into school to allow pupils access to an alternative method of fitness training, focusing on strength and conditioning. The visits coincided with the health related fitness topic being covered within the curriculum, and added depth and variation to the more traditional forms of exercise such as circuit training and step aerobics.

CrossFit All Out were extremely professional and provided an excellent opportunity for our pupils to challenge themselves in a typical CrossFit style session format. They run regular sessions for young people and adults based on Northfield Way in Newton Aycliffe – it was great to be able to support a local business whilst expanding the skills and knowledge of Greenfield students.
