Marathon Man Runs 505 Miles for Charity

A Nobia UK factory worker is raising funds for a North East hospice by running almost the full length of the country in May 2015.

Planet Leisure on Aycliffe Business Park are also helping Marc to reach his target and are organising a few events in aid of St Teresa's Hospice as well as being a collection point for Marc's sponsors.

Marc Ellis has been training for 18 months to tackle a gruelling 505-mile journey - equivalent to 19 marathons - from Land's End to Darlington calling at 16 Magnet showrooms on route. The 42-year-old expects it will take almost the full month to complete the route and he hopes his efforts will help him raise £50,000 for St Teresa's Hospice in Darlington.

Mr Ellis had always intended to take on the challenge for a worthy cause, and decided to raise money for St Teresa's after suggestions from friends led him to visit the hospice. He said: "When I visited the children's area of the hospice, and saw the pictures they drew on the wall, I walked out a different person. "When I'm struggling, I'll remember a picture I saw of the sun there, and that will get me through it."

Mr Ellis, who is a factory supervisor at Darlington's Nobia UK Factory, was a keen runner during his school years but it wasn't until 2010 that he decided to get back into the hobby. Two years later he competed in the 2012 London Marathon to raise awareness for kidney disease and since then he has run five marathons and is well into his training regime, having ran 200 miles last month. He said: "You get out what you put in, and persistence and diet are key. My first run was one mile, and I struggled with that. Now I can do 70 miles a week and my aim is to complete the challenge in 30 days."

Mr Ellis is well aware that blisters will be an unwelcome companion for most of the journey, but he is looking forward to the final leg of the run on High Row in Darlington town centre, where his friends and family will be cheering him on. There is one problem that Mr Ellis was not quite prepared for though: "I can't stop losing weight - I burnt off 8,000

Pathfinder Susan Sadler honoured for her special 'home help'. Susan can best be described as a pathfinder and most definitely a community champion.

After starting up a small group at her home, to help people who had found themselves in unfortunate circumstances, Susan founded the charity - Lifeline Community Action - which is based in Newton Aycliffe. Susan's charity has gone on to help well over 3,000 people and families suffering from poverty, ill health, unemployment and isolation.

And for all of her sterling work, Susan was nominated by Camilla Louise Shergold and put forward for consideration by Great Aycliffe & Middridge Area Action Partnership, for the Chairman's Medal which she received from the Chairman of Durham County Council, Cllr John Robnison, JP, at a special ceremony at County Hall. Following very much a Christian ethos, Susan's helped instil this to the volunteers who always give a warm welcome and encouragement to those

arriving through their doors, many who are quite often in very desperate and crisis torn situation.

Helping Hands - which is part of the project - offers emergency food and basic goods parcels, while the drop-in centre provides a haven for those requiring much required support, advice and assistance to help with their varying and critical needs.

Not just content with helping out, Susan's introduced 'developing people' to help those coming through her doors to find work, improving physical health and learning practical life skills so they become more independent and resilient.

Speaking after the County Hall event, Cllr Robnison, said: "Susan's the inspiration and driving force behind all this work and 'saved' many an individual or family from hitting rock-bottom and at times the depths of despair.

"The Chairman's Medal was introduced to honour people such as Susan and she is a very worthy recipient of the Chairman's Medal."

Will Aycliffe Introduce Smoke-free Play Areas?

Visitors to a County Durham park are asked not to smoke when in or near the children's play area from today.

The outdoor play area at Riverside Park, in Chester-le-Street, is the first of 178 owned by Durham County Council to become a smoke-free zone.

The authority is introducing the voluntary no-smoking code as part of its work as a member of the Smoke-free County Durham Tobacco Control Alliance to reduce the harm caused by tobacco.

Signs will be placed in and around each play area asking adults to abide by the code. Evidence suggests that by reducing children's exposure to smoking and making it less socially acceptable, children are less likely to take up the habit themselves.

Almost 500 people took part in a public consultation on the initiative last year, with 81 per cent saying they strongly agreed with the idea of smoke-free play areas.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for safer and healthier communities, said: "One of our key priorities is preventing children from becoming smokers and forming a habit that could ultimately kill them. "Children are most at risk of becoming smokers if they



grow up in communities where smoking is the norm. Making our play areas smoke-free is one way of reducing the opportunities for children to see adults smoking around them. "Although the code is voluntary, the consultation showed significant support for a ban on smoking at outdoor play areas so we hope the public will support it and help to protect the health of our children." Smoke-free play areas are among a range of measures being promoted by the County

Durham Tobacco Control Alliance in an effort to protect children from smoke-related harm.

The voluntary smoke-free code covers areas which are fenced off and which contain children's play equipment. It does not cover general parks and open spaces.

All Great Aycliffe Parks are run by our Town Council and we understand this is something they will be investigating in the future.

Hitachi Rail Win ScotRail 70 Train Contract

Edinburgh, 12 March, 2015 – Hitachi Rail Europe and Abellio are delighted to announce today that they have signed a contract for the provision and maintenance of 70 new trains for the upcoming ScotRail franchise. The trains are financed by Caledonian Rail Leasing.

46 three-car and 24 four-car AT200 EMU trains are being procured to operate along the Edinburgh-Glasgow and Stirling – Alloa –Dunblane lines and will go into service in late 2017. The contract also comprises a 10-year maintenance deal, with plans currently in place to stable and service the trains at depots in Edinburgh.

The first seven trains are scheduled to be built in Hitachi's Kasado factory in Japan, with the remaining 63 being built in their flagship Newton Aycliffe train

manufacturing facility in the UK, opening later this year.

Transport Scotland's Edinburgh Glasgow Improvement Programme (EGIP) is a crucial part of the new ScotRail franchise, and these new trains will play an important role in delivering extensive benefits for Scottish rail users and providing long term economic sustainability. The AT200 model has been designed to transform the regional commuter travel experience. With a top speed of 100 miles per hour, each car is 23 metres in length, and features cab-end and inter-vehicle gangways to facilitate the best use of passenger space. The train has a 35-year design life and is made to complement the requirements as set out and agreed with Transport Scotland.

The contract is being financed by Caledonian Rail Leasing

Ltd, a Special Purpose Vehicle created by SMBC Leasing.

Derek Mackay, Scottish Transport Minister, said: "With the new ScotRail franchise, a number of impressive infrastructure projects and these slick new trains, we are giving Scotland a railway to be proud of."

"Abellio's winning bid for the ScotRail franchise included several exciting proposals and I look forward to seeing it all take shape from their takeover of the service in just a few weeks."

"Passengers will love using these new trains, but the benefits go far beyond that. The use of electric trains on Scotland's busiest route will help reduce our carbon footprint. The improved connection can only be good for our two biggest cities. And the innovative contract has reduced the cost of the finance, as well as guaranteeing a great deal for Scotland in the longer term."

"This is real evidence of Scotland's railways being fit for the future."

Jeff Hoogesteger, Chief Executive of Abellio said: "This is an important deal for passengers and for Scotland. New trains for Scotland were a key feature in Abellio's bid for the franchise and we are excited to be pressing the button on the delivery programme. The arrival of 24 Hitachi AT200s by late 2017 and a further 46 by Dec 2018 will ensure that the full

benefits of the Edinburgh Glasgow Improvement Programme are realised for passengers; delivering faster journey times, greater capacity and higher service quality. And the effects of the investment will spread much wider than that. The new trains will be more energy efficient, and innovations in design and lightweight construction will reduce the impact of services on important infrastructure."

Jon Veitch, Hitachi Rail Europe's General Manager for Scotland, said: "We are delighted to be signing this contract with Abellio today, which will see the supply of rolling stock and maintenance services for their new ScotRail franchise. This forms the start of a long-term partnership to boost passenger services in Scotland, and we will be working closely with the operator to ensure that services are kept to a very high standard across this period."

"This is also the first contract for our recently launched AT200 commuter train. With the majority of manufacturing taking place in our Newton Aycliffe factory, this is another sign of our confidence in UK manufacturing and, in line with the delivery of our Class 800 IEP trains, will boost jobs and growth in Scotland and the North East of England."

Abellio, a leading operator in the UK rail market, was named franchise operator for the ScotRail franchise on October 8, 2014.

Budding engineers have been building bridges at a County Durham training centre as part of a nationwide celebration of apprenticeships.

More than 200 students from seven schools across the county have been enjoying the appliance of science in hands-on workshops with local employers at South West Durham Training.

Nifco's general manager (engineering) Andy Dunn, a former SWDT trainee who is a big advocate of apprenticeships, gave an inspirational talk to the students about the importance of skills development.

Trevor Alley, Chief Executive of SWDT, added: "There is no better way to inspire young people than for them to meet our former trainees who have gone on to achieve great things in industry. We are very grateful to all our industry partners who have given their valuable time to meet local students this week and stress the importance of gaining skills and qualifications."



Weed Killer Sprayed on Private Property

Dear Sir
On 10th March a County Council contractor scattered weedkiller on just about every lawn and footpath in our area. This is not the usual weedkiller used by previous contractors, most will have seen them on small tractors, spraying with a wet solution in the past. This is a white powder / pellet form of weed killer which remains visible on the surface of the grass, soil and pavements for some time. The contractor with the weedkiller was recorded scattering it everywhere, on lawns and pavements and

even on private residents' property. They were seen walking past people's home dusting just about every patch of green space, even over plants. My lawn is covered in white powder as is my plants in tubs on my front lawn. Who has given these people the right to walk across private property using this weedkiller? Does the County Council know what these contractors are doing? What is this weedkiller doing to dogs and cats that lick their paws? We need some answers from the Council about this. The area concerned is Simpature and Moule Close and an officer came round this morning to explain the reason for using pellets saying it was not harmful to animals. All weed killer is harmful to animals when first applied. If all our grass and plants die we have to get back to the Council, but what if our animals take ill? We are concerned about our pets and want to know exactly what chemical they have used. The Council also said that their usual tractor weedkiller is yet to come round to do the pavements, so why use this granular weedkiller in the first place? More waste of Council tax payers money!
Brian Sowerby
Jimmy Bennett, the County Council's clean and green manager, said: "We have reassured Mr Sowerby that if any damage has been caused to his property we will repair it. In the summer we use a liquid weedkiller on footpaths and grassed open areas. During the winter, we use a granular product on grassed areas around trees and street furniture. Both products are non-toxic and bio-degradable. We have been using them for a number of years and they are widely used around the country."

Why We Needed A Rise In Council Tax

May I answer the correspondent in last week's Newton News who asked me to explain why I supported the 1.99% increase in Durham County Council's Council Tax, and why DCC are cutting services.

The answer lies in this table:

FACING THE CUTS

Column A shows the situation of DCC in 2010 – an enterprise supporting almost £1.4 billion of statutory and discretionary services to the people of County Durham. Some of those services were chargeable, giving the Council an income of £896 million from rents/ fees etc. The shortfall was covered by £199 million of Council Tax, and £292 million in government grants. The new government in 2010 changed everything. It has slashed government grants to the Council. It also withdrew 10% of the Council Tax rebate grant (for the 65,000 Council Tax payers on benefits) which has hit DCC's Council Tax yield. The government has given councils half of the local business rate, but in County Durham, which is economically weak, this does not amount to much.

Column B of the table reveals how all of this has affected DCC. Since 2010:

- the amount of grants the Council receives has fallen by £111 million (38%)
- the amount it receives in Council Tax has fallen by £25 million. (For data geeks, this is before inflation, so 'in real terms' the reductions are much greater than 38%.) Thus the Council has been forced by the government to make unimaginably huge cuts.

MAKING THE CUTS

So far, most of these cuts have been to 'back-office' functions, and not front-line services. Nearly 2,000 people have been shed from the DCC workforce. However – just as DCC is running out of 'back-office' functions to absorb such huge cuts – the government has announced a further £86 million of cuts to the council's grant-funding over the next three years (Column C). That will mean that government grants will have fallen from £292 million in 2010 to £95 million in 2018.

I wonder if people fully appreciate what it means to cut such huge sums?

Consider the following three recent very difficult spending decisions the Council has had to make:

1. the closure of the Council's last five care homes ... saved about £¾ million pa;
2. the green waste bin charge ... will save less than £1 million pa;
3. the street light reduction /removal programme ... will save £2 million gross pa.

All these proposals have angered the public. So if these cuts have caused such reactions, what is going to happen when the Council has to set about cutting £86 million from services?

SURVIVING THE CUTS

A council by law cannot declare a deficit budget – it has to balance the books. So DCC cannot ignore the cuts in government funding. The government has found the perfect victim – DCC has to implement the government cuts, and then takes the blame for implementing them.

Column C summarises the Council's Medium-Term Financial Plan for the future. It envisages a reduction in gross activity of £66 million, 2016-2019 – the cuts will be eye-watering. You will see in the Plan that there is the presumption of a rise in income from Council Tax. Without it, the cuts will be even worse. Indeed, this year's 1.99% rise will raise £3.4 million pa – almost as much as the three recent spending cuts above – i.e. the rise will save us having to make cuts of that magnitude. That is why I voted for the rise.

I am happy to explain issues-arising if people wish to raise them. May I also stress that this is my own explanation of my own decision, and that I am not speaking on behalf of DCC.

PROPOSAL TO CHANGE SELECTION OF TOWN MAYOR QUASHED

Last week our Town Council considered the following Notice of Motion submitted by Councillor G.C. Gray.

(i) That the Council changes the way that the Mayor of Great Aycliffe Town Council is selected for nomination for election at the Annual General Meeting.

(ii) That three key issues be taken into account:

1. Time of Service to the Council.

2. Dedication to the current role that the Councillor plays within the Council.

3. Selection of the best candidate for the position.

(iii) That the three key issues should be taken into account on a politically impartial basis and scored out of 30 (10 marks for each issue) and a shortlist be produced based upon these scores and then voted upon at the Council Annual General Meeting.

The simple intention behind the proposal was for the ruling Labour group to put aside Party politics and give an Independent councillor the opportunity to serve as Mayor. The mechanism of the motion was too formal and gave the Labour group great glee in tearing it apart.

Inevitably as the debate continued the Independents gave vent to the fact that as a minority group they virtually had no say in how the Council was run.

But as pointed out by Independent Billy Blenkinsopp it was ever thus and you should expect nothing different.

Council Hewitson made an issue of this point in an address to the Council. Council Jim Atkinson remarked it was the first time he had ever heard Council Hewitson speak and it was refreshing. She replied there was no point, as all decisions were decided at a Labour Group meeting beforehand. She also said she might as well stop at home and do her council work from there, representing her ward.

She referred to the current situation where the group decided what will happen and everyone is subjected to listening to the same "boring" people formalise decisions in the Council Chamber.

Deputy Leader John Clare reacted strongly to this offensive statement reminding Councillors he was elected to the position and was carrying out his duty, boring or not.

Proposer George Gray pointed out that other Councils, including Darlington, elect opposition members to be

Mayor and said he had twice nominated an Independent to be Mayor of Aycliffe which the Labour group did not support. Observers could not help but feel how much nicer and fairer it would be if a capable Independent Councillor was given the chance to be Mayor now and again instead of

Labour councillors taking the position more than once as in the case of George Gray himself when he was a Labour Councillor.

It is a non political position and even having the power of Chairman at meetings could not overrule the absolute control Labour holds.

- The President restored 60,000 public sector workers (in the Education Sector) while Britain has created 1.85 million private sector jobs and reduced the public sector payroll by 412,000.

- The French are breaking EU rules imposed on member states.

- The unemployment rate in France in January 2015 was 10.3% in Britain it is 5.9% (and decreasing faster than any other G7 country over the past year)

- It is predicted that the British economy will soon overtake that of France to become the 2nd largest in Europe after Germany. If the British electorate wish to keep up this economic recovery they should vote for a



The North of England NDP (National Development Plan) Regional Championships took place last weekend, as Gymnastic clubs from the North competed for a place in the National Finals which are held in Stoke on Trent in May. 
Two Badminton Trophies for Aycliffe



Aycliffe Sprinter Takes 60 metre Championship

SHILDON RUNNING and Athletics club's "Sprint Squad" have enjoyed a memorable winter season as Newtonian Rachel Bennett (12 yrs old) and Kyle Walton (13 yrs old) excelled during successful Indoor campaigns. On February 1st the pair travelled to Sheffield's E.I.S arena for the North of England Indoor Championships which is contested by athletes from Derbyshire up to Northumberland and from Hull to Liverpool. Rachel won all 3 of her races in impressive style to be crowned U15 girls 60m sprint champion in a new pb and club record of 7.96s. Kyle also competed in the 60m sprint (U15b) and after coming through heats and a semi final, recorded a new pb of 7.71s (club record) in the final to take home the bronze medal.



Next on February 15th, the pair tackled the North East Counties Indoor Championships and once again found themselves amongst the medals. Rachel once again easily came through a heat and semi final to set up a titanic tussle with the U.K no.2 ranked athlete from Gateshead Harriers. In the final a devastating drive phase took Rachel clear of her rival to finish in 7.96s and add the North East counties title to her North of England crown. Kyle finished 3rd in the 60m final in a time that was just outside of his lifetime best.

Finally our dynamic duo headed once again to the E.I.S Arena in Sheffield for the English National age group Championships. Again contesting the 60m against older and more experienced

competitors the pair were never fazed. 12yr old Rachel Bennett was looking to add to both her Under 15 girls 60m Northern and North East Championship titles and showed good intentions by winning her heat in 7.96 seconds equalling her PB and club record. The semi final proved a more difficult race with a photo finish required to separate a number of athletes with Rachel producing another good performance to be given 2nd place in 7.98 seconds. In a very competitive final, Rachel started slowly but managed to recover to finish 6th in a close race which saw 4 athletes (3rd to 6th place) finish in 8.1s. Meanwhile Kyle qualified from his heat in a new pb of 6.64s, then improved his pb further to 6.60s in the semi-final to finish in an automatic qualifying position. In the final Kyle got away well only for his older and more powerful competitors to come back strongly in the final 30m. At the finish Kyle had equalled his pb to finish 6th in 6.60s. Rachel is currently ranked inside the U.K top 10 and with another year in the age group will harbour ambitions of a National title in the near future though her more immediate focus will be on the English Schools competition in July. Kyle's pb has given him a U.K ranking of no.22 and with many of the athletes ranked above him moving up to the u17 age group next year Kyle has vowed to return in 2016 with the aim of securing a national medal and climb the u.k rankings! However his more immediate aim is to qualify for the English Schools finals in July where he hopes to contest the 100m and progress as far as possible in the competition.

A club spokesman said - February has been a fantastic month for both Kyle and Rachel who are competing at the lower end of the U15 age group against older and more experienced athletes. They have exceeded all expectations in achieving the above results at 3 major indoor Championships in the space of a month. Both should be proud of their achievements and take inspiration from these exceptional performances as they now prepare to compete in the outdoor season.
