M.P. to Bring New Start **Retailers to Town Centre**

Newton Avcliffe town centre could soon be home to a whole host of new start up retailers selling anything from children's ware, handmade beauty products, to pet accessories and men's clothing.

A social enterprise based south of the region have been invited by the MP for Sedgefield Phil Wilson to develop a proposal based on the pilot scheme they ran on behalf of Stockton borough council which saw 54 new retail business started in a year in Stockton on Tees.

The proposal being

The proposal being developed will support first time retailers to try out a new business idea, by giving them support, mentoring, training and easy access retail space in Newton Aycliffe Town centre.

The town centre has significant undergone improvements over the last few years. The unsightly concrete ramp and oppressive

New retailers, including Aldi and Wilko's, have opened stores and existing businesses have been encouraged to expand. There are also other high street retailers who are negotiating space within the centre and a number of the retail units have now been taken. Last year the centre won an award for the most improved town centre. Phil Wilson says "I was

particularly impressed when I heard about the scheme in Stockton and how it had helped retail development in the borough. Business and enterprise is important to me, as is having a diverse and vibrant town centre. The town centre management have been working very hard to bring in new business and turn the town centre around over the last few years and the improvements have been tremendous. Now residents want more shops and I believe this scheme will complement the town centre's growing and forthcoming offer.

It will also give local people the chance to try

out a new retail idea which could eventually become liveliehood for them. Supporting small and new business will be a priority for a forthcoming Labour government. It is important we have an economy that works for the many and as such these type of initiatives are welcomed"

The project is in early development stage but the idea is being welcomed by town councillors, residents and existing retailers.

Bryan Haladane from Freshwater said "The owners of Aycliffe Shopping Centre fully support will work closely with Phil Wilson and team to promote this effort to bring new business offers into the town centre."



Residents' Association Contact County Council Over Removal of A167 Lights

At the Public Meeting held on Thursday 19th March at St. Mary's Meeting Room at 7pm it was resolved unanimously

This meeting supports the seven Great Aycliffe County Councillors in their efforts to retain the street lights along the A167 between the A1M and Rushyford on the grounds that the removals are contrary to agreed policy and this main arterial road cannot be categorised as "rural"

The meeting further expressed the view that the removal of lights would cause danger to road users, cyclists and pedestrians and does not take into consideration the current high usage and the future expansion of housing and industry this road will feed.

Robson was delegated to ask the following public questions at County Hall. The Great Aycliffe Public

Meeting after hearing all the facts and figures, voted unanimously against the removal, and request the County Council consider rescinding their previous decision as the consultation process was deemed to be flawed.

It appears the decision to remove A167 lights was lost in the general policy to save on

in the general policy to save on the cost of lighting. It is only after it came to the notice of the general public how badly the A167 was being affected that the public outcry is now being heard by not only the residents of the Newton Aycliffe area. Other residents of settlements situated alongside the busy road are also beginning to express their displeasure at this decision. These settlements being Aycliffe village, Chilton, Ferryhill and Spennymoor. Is the Council satisfied the

policy change was understood and communicated properly to the general public?

How many members of the public were in fact consulted? When Residents' Associations call for clarification do we not deserve attention with the officer and Cabinet Councillor, responsible for the topic, attending the meeting?
On investigation and having

sight of the plans we seek clarification on the County Council's specific areas which they term "rural". Where they state lighting can be safely removed.?
The following questions were

asked by members of the Residents' Association:

As the A167 is a main arterial route through the County can the Council please define rural areas along the A167.3

Is this where there is no footfall?

Has the County Council discussed issues of Health & Safety, Road Accidents, dangers to cyclists and walkers plus potential increase in crime?

Why not turn off every other light?

Why not use alternative modern and much cheaper lighting to get the same monetary savings?

Why remove lampposts

Why remove lampposts altogether?
If the A1M is closed at our junctions the A167 becomes the alternative route has this been considered?

The A167 is a main arterial route through the County carrying goods services and

It seems to me that far too many of our Town Councillors are incapable of any rational or informed debate about almost any topic without resorting to slagging off one another, often through the columns of the Newton News. Time and again the issues seem to get forgotten and the personality clashes rise to the surface.

Town Councillors must understand they represent ALL of the residents of this town first and foremost and that includes the minority opinions and viewpoints. However, our Labour Party dominated Council seems to have forgotten that point and has over the last few years become something of a "clique" that will dismiss summarily any viewpoint that our independent or other Party Councillors may have. In other words, Labour does not listen.

I can well understand that it must be exasperating in the extreme for the non Labour party Council members who attend Council meetings to know that no matter what they may say or propose, the huge Labour majority renders their views irrelevant as the Labour view will always prevail even when it may not be best for our town

Councillors Impressed by Aycliffe ROF Memorial Plans

Six of Newton Avcliffe's Durham County Councillors
- Jed Hillary, John Clare,
Kate Hopper, Eddy Adam, Joan Gray and Mike Dixon - visited the former Presswork Metals factory, which is being turned into a mixed-use leisure facility by local family construction firm Finley Structures

The company's Managing Director Julie Finley showed them ambitious plans to preserve the heritage and memory of the Aycliffe Angels, who worked at the Royal Ordnance Factory during World War II. Finley Structures will name the complex ROF 59,

Much of the original brickwork as well as some

of the Presswork Metals building preserved, with the Century steelwork creating a palimpsest effect of building through the ages.

Staff working at the new ROF 59 will wear overalls, like the Aycliffe Angels. Part of an old railway line, used to transport the munitions which was uncovered during foundation works, will be incorporated into other memorabilia features and

archive photographs.
Cllr Hillary revealed how his parents - Bob and Millie Hillary - met in Aycliffe after working there during hostilities.

"It's really quite amazing," he said. "My mother and father actually met in School Aycliffe during the war, my father was stationed here with the Army guarding the place and my Mum worked here in the Ordnance Factory.

"We're steeped in history, but this area, where the Royal Ordnance Factory is an important place in the history of the country. It provided munitions during the Second World War and to actually commemorate this is really important. I don't think people realise just how big a footprint the Royal Ordnance Factory had. There are still bunkers at the other end of where Hitachi is now, and some of the old munitions factories stretch down to St Cuthbert's Way.

Cllr Clare, well known in Aycliffe as a former History teacher at Greenfield School, said: "Just looking at the said. Just looking at the building you can see history growing before your very eyes, beginning with the roofline of the Royal Ordnance Factory walls. Above that you have a brick wall from the 50s or 60s and above that you have the 21st Century steelwork - is that not exciting?

"It started off making bombs followed by post-war new town aims and the Presswork Metals factory, and now it is to be a leisure facility. Projects like this are integral to the success of Aycliffe Business Park"





John Kilcoyne (man in a shed, Brainiac) will give one of his Science shows – be amazed by science.






Solve the crime by using information within the crime scene.

2015/16 Revenue and Capital Budget

"Funding cuts and spending pressures leave the Town Council with no choice but to increase the Council Tax next year"

The Town Council has recently set it's 2015/16 Revenue and Capital Budget. The Council's finances are currently in a strong position and in the short term the outlook remains fairly positive with a balanced budget in place, savings continuing to be achieved in the current financial year, and healthy levels of reserves.

As a result, the Council will not need to make any reductions to services next year and the 2015/16 Revenue Budget was therefore prepared in a way that maintains existing levels of service.

However, the Council must also keep a close eye on what is likely to be an increasingly challenging future, and plan ahead now for the difficulties that lie ahead.

The Council is currently reliant on Council Tax Support Grant funding paid by the Government, via Durham County Council, of over a quarter of a million pounds and which amounts to nearly 20% of its Revenue Budget. It has been confirmed that this funding will be cut in the coming years by between 10% and 15% a year, and there remains a risk that it could be withdrawn altogether.

The Council is also facing a number of significant spending pressures including the increasing move towards the payment of a 'living wage' for council staff, increases in employers' national insurance costs from 2016, and possible further devolvement of services from Durham County Council. Unfortunately, in order to maintain services, and absorb the cuts to funding and increases in costs faced over the longer term, the Council was left with no choice but to make a small increase of 1.98% in the Town Council Tax next year.

The increase enabled the Council to offset the additional costs of the recently agreed local government pay award, the cut to the Council Tax Support Grant, and a significant fall in pre-school funding income next year, whilst maintaining some surplus resources within the Revenue Budget via the contingency sum and contribution to capital reserves to meet the significant future budget pressures faced.

This decision has not been taken lightly, particularly in light of the on-going cost of living difficulties being faced by local residents, and following on from the four year freeze in council tax delivered by the Council between 2010 and 2013.

However, by agreeing, in principle to limit the proposed rise to less than 2% next year, the increase in the Town Council Tax Bill at Valuation Band A has been limited to less than £3 per year or 5p per week.

This increase will ensure that all of the important services provided by the Town Council to the community of Great Aycliffe can be protected and maintained for at least another year.

The Senior Citizens' Excursions are one of the most popular events organised by Great Aycliffe Town Council. Each year, we organise a series of free excursions for the senior citizens (men or women aged 60 years or over) who live in our Parish. This year the Excursions will start on Monday 1st June and finish on Friday 3rd July.

The application forms and information booklets will be available from Tuesday 21st April until Wednesday 6th May from the Council Offices, Oakleaf Sports Complex, Recreation Centre (Beveridge Way) and the Library in the Town centre.

This year, residents have the choice of visiting the Lake District (Keswick), Northumberland (Hexham), Scottish Borders (Berwick), Scarborough, Blackpool or South Shields for the day with a three course meal and tea or coffee provided in a good quality venue, most with disabled facilities.

Some of the excursions have comfort breaks where tea or coffee with biscuits is provided by the Council.

The coaches provided are 49-53 seater executive coaches with toilet facilities. There is also a 53 seater executive coach with a wheelchair hoist to each destination. This ensures that even people with severe mobility problems can

enjoy a day out. The hoist can be used to assist passengers who need to travel in their wheelchair, but may be used by anyone without mobility difficulties.

Each person who qualifies is entitled to one 'trip'. To qualify you must be aged 60 or over and must have lived in the electoral parish by 1st April 2015.

In 2014, we received 1337 applications so please make sure you apply in time to get the excursion date you would like. The closing date for applications is Wednesday 6th May 2015.

Neighbourhood Plan Update

The County Durham Plan (CDP) Planning Inspector Harold Stephens has said the Durham County Council's 20-year economic blueprint, the County Durham Plan (CDP), contains proposals which are unrealistic, flawed, not justified, deliverable or environmentally acceptable and unsound. However, after reading the full report it is clear that the comments are made predominantly regarding the Durham City area and the housing allocation as well as the Drum Industrial estate and the employment allocations.



What implication will this have on the Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan?

Although this means the CDP is currently suspended work will continue on the Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan (GANP). It has meant that we have taken a step back and reviewed our progress so far to ensure that the work we have done, and will continue to do, is 'sound', 'realistic', 'achievable and deliverable' as well as 'environmentally acceptable'. This review may lead to a few minor changes for the GANP but we are not anticipating any major implications.

The first round of consultation has been complete and feedback is taking place. The Environment Thematic Group has been set up and will review the general comments made to ensure there are no gaps, nothing has been missed and will investigate



options to achieve deliverable planning policies. A Housing Thematic Group will be set up in approximately six weeks, which will complete the same processes.

Officers are currently trying to engage a company to undertake a soft retail assessment to clarify the difference between what residents have said they want during the consultation process and if there is an actual retail need from a business perspective. Unfortunately, to date, there has been no interest from the companies which have been contacted so far.

comprehension as Aycliffe was focussed on promoting growth, jobs and the biggest industrial area in the north.

The meeting at times became very rowdy indicating how very upset people were and there was a suggestion that the Council consultation process was dubious, left to website access and lost in the policy changing general street lighting.
