Election Doorstep Questions

Phil Wilson, the Labour Phil Wilson, the Labour parliamentary candidate for Sedgefield, shares his views on some of the important questions he's heard on the doorstep during the election campaign so far.

campaign so far. **Will Labour cut the deficit?** The Conservatives said they would get rid of the deficit by 2015, but instead they have left a debt of £75billion. They have borrowed more in 5 years than Labour did in 13. They cannot say how they will raise additional funding for the NHS. They have promised over £7billion in tax cuts but again can't say where they will get the money. All they've promised is more extreme cuts. Labour's manifesto has no proposal for any new spending paid for by additional borrowing. We will help more people into better paid jobs which will lead to increased tax revenues and lower social security spending. We will make cuts where

necessary in a fair way. What is Labour's plan to tackle immigration? Over 99% of the constituency's

population are white British so immigration should not be a significant concern locally. I understand though the national concern. There are more British people living in other parts of the EU than Europeans living here. However, immigration still needs to be controlled. Labour will ensure that people coming here from other countries will not be able to claim benefits until they have contributed to our society and paid taxes for at least two years. Labour will make it illegal for employers to undercut wages by exploiting workers and we will ban agencies from recruiting only from abroad. Labour will also require that

large firms seeking to recruit people from outside of Europe offer a local apprenticeship. And we will make sure our borders are strong with a 1000 extra border and enforcement staff paid for by US-style visa

reforms. What will Labour a government do about bus services?

Buses are the lifeline of our local towns and villages.

The lack of bus services is an issue in the constituency from Thornley to Ferryhill, from Wingate to Chilton, from Trimdon to Middleton St George and all points in between. Under the Tories, over 2,000 bus routes have gone, including many locally and bus fares have increased 5 times faster than wages. Labour will give communities more control over the way buses are operated so they can decide routes and set fares.

What will you do about rogue private landlords and helping first time buyers?

Approaching 20% of houses in the constituency are private lets. Most private landlords look after their properties. A minority do not, and cause problems for local residents. I've been to many community meetings as MP where private landlords are brought up as an issue. Labour will drive up standards by introducing a self-funded national register of landlords, and making it easier for local authorities to introduce licensing schemes and ensure tough sanctions. Labour will also give councils the power to double council tax on properties left empty.

Labour's sixth campaign pledge is to create the biggest house building programme for a generation with a priority for first-time buyers. We'll cut their stamp duty to zero for homes worth under £300,000 and secure three-year rents

capped by inflation. What are your views on unsustainable housing housing development in the area?

There is a need for housing but it must be done in a sustainable way that recognises the ability of an existing community to cope. That is why I was opposed to plans to build 2000 houses at Sedgefield village. 2000 is far too many. However Sedgefield needs some houses and I will work with the local community and the county council to work out the best locations. A similar issues has arisen in Middleton St George where, if all the housing applications go through, a 1,000 houses could be built over the coming years. I have been fighting on behalf of the residents to stop over development including presenting a petition to parliament and taking representatives from the village meet with government to ministers.

Gestamp Tallent's Two New Presses Ready for Production This Month Erected in Purpose-Built Extension

Work to complete plant 1 extension has gathered pace Folk Song arrangements. Accompanied by chamber musician and conductor, James over the first quarter of 2015. Since the return to work in the New year Gestamp Tallent has seen the installation of a new 35ton overhead crane, the Fagor 4000T transfer press and Arisa 1500T progression press complete with a short form coil line. Both presses are now in their final

commissioning stages. Work commenced on Fagor Press as soon as staff arrived back at work after the Christmas break with the installation of the scrap conveyor in the pit. This needed to be installed before the press arrived and went ahead with no problems.

The Fagor engineers arrived on site shortly after and started with the press install. The first items they installed were the pads in the pit that the press sits on. Then the various press items arrived on 15 wagons over a period of 3 days which logistically caused the team a few problems as storage space was at a premium as Howard Russell were still on site finishing off the building construction.

The decision was taken to store some items off site until they were required. The main body the press (beds, crowns and slides) arrived at Teesport on January 27th. Gestamp personnel were lucky enough to see the various items been taken off the ship and put onto special transport to be

delivered to site. The heaviest items weighing 90 tonnes! The press then started to be built from the floor up in various stages using a mega-lift until the crowns were placed on the top. This took approximately 3 weeks which was very impressive. The destack feeder and all of the auxiliary items were then installed around the press. Commissioning of the press started mid-March and is still continuing. So far the press has passed

all of its dimensional and run checks and the destack feeder is just finishing its commissioning phase. Commissioning of the transfer system has just started which is expected to take 2-4 weeks. After that tools will be introduced to the press and training for operator and





With the press currently being on plan the company expect the press to begin production at the end of May. Once in production this will be the largest capacity transfer press within the plant. From the initial designs, the specification was based on the Komatsu (K1) press so parts

to be manufactured can now be run in both presses. After the scrap conveyor was installed for the Fagor press work commenced on the installation of the Arisa conveyor which went ahead with no problems. In January a team from Gestamp press attended the shop acceptance buy off at Arisa's

premises in Spain. Shortly after this the press was decommissioned and shipped to Avcliffe. This time the parts arrived via 11 wagons. Three special transport wagons brought the bed crown and slide from Southampton where the ship docked.

The first parts arrived at the beginning of March. and the main components of the press were assembled in just over




