Durham Furniture Help Scheme moved into a small unit based at Chilton Industrial Estate in October 2004 run by four volunteers. Before this a small Scheme operated from a few small, garages in Newton Aycliffe which became too small so premises more suitable were necessary. Chris Palmer from Aycliffe was the founder and provided this service as a member of St. Mary's Church. The move to Chilton gave opportunities to take other larger units adjacent with the help of Business Durham and the County Council who understand the business and property needs. CDFHS are

CDFHS are on the verge of having facilities totally compatible to the flexible and changing nature of this steadily growing Charity.
County Durham Furniture Charity. County Durham Furniture Help Scheme was rebranded in 2014 with a new image. They

have just acquired Unit 22 with a total of 18,099 sq ft of floor space which enabling them to increase overall capacity to receive donated goods and deliver increasing amounts of affordable furniture regionally. CDFHS also provides quality work experience for the local Jobcentres and DWP contractors. The additional space will allow work in employability, advice and guidance, "Up cycling" work in furniture restoration "Shabby Chic" funded by the National Lottery is also adding staff and donations.
CDFHS offer CDFHS training

in a semi-formal setting, encouraging home based small enterprise start-ups. The increased space will help grow this significant part of CDFHS improving their external presentation by working with several arms of the County Council in partnership.
As a trusted partner in Welfare

MONKEY Project are now working jointly with all of the Counties Housing Associations to encourage tenants to come to us for furniture, volunteering or work experience opportunities. **CDFHS** contribute significantly to the County's waste reduction targets winning the County Durham

Environment Award. April saw them open a "Pop Up" shop in Chester le Street with very favourable

reviews. They are working with local community groups such as Bullion Hall to grow volunteering opportunities with the CDFHS in the north

CDFHS have started to provide new beds manufactured in the UK and bought locally at a great price. Customers can buy a brand new factory sealed bed single from £85.00 and £109.00 for a plain double or £129.00 for a more superior item. IAM Motoring Tips

look at different traffic signs to make your journey as safe as possible. Here are seven important road signs that all motorists should become familiar with.

- Triangular traffic signs with a red border warn motorists about potential hazards. Figure 1, for example, warns motorists of two-way traffic straight ahead, while figure 2 warns motorists about cattle potentially crossing in a rural area be prepared to slow down or
- Some warning signs appear as red rectangles where a reduction in speed is required (figure 3), or in white rectangles where motorists are approaching a narrow road or bend in the road (figure 4) – keep an eye out for these and slow down if necessary.
- eye out for incess and sow down in necessary.

 Circular traffic signs with a red border instruct motorists and prohibit certain types of manoeuvres. For example, figure 5 prohibits solo motorcyclists from travelling in a specific area, while figure 6 prohibits all vehicles except pedal cycles - adhere to these signs to avoid being fined.
- avoid being fined.

 Maximum speed limits are also displayed in circular traffic signs.

 Where figure 7 is displayed the national speed limit for the type of road you are travelling on applies. Where figure 8 is shown you must not exceed the displayed speed limit.
- Circular blue traffic signs give instructions about where to make a turn in the road or get in lane if there is a junction. For example, where a traffic sign similar to figure 9 is shown motorists must keep
- Rectangular boards display important information and give directions. You will often see a blue board on the motorway (figure 10), a green board on primary routes (figure 11), and a white board on non-primary routes that displays both route information and regulatory signs (figure 12). Take note of these to help you progress with your journey.
- Where traffic signs are shown similar to figure 13 and 14 motorists must adhere to the displayed instructions at all times. Both red octagon-shaped stop signs and inverted triangle give way signs are used at junctions with poor sight lines or where minor roads cross high speed major roads – stop or give way as necessary.



as very few police forces are making full use of 'Sarah's Law', the NSPCC warns today. The Child Sex Offenders

Disclosure (CSOD) scheme came into force following public outrage over the savage murder of eight-year-old Sarah Payne. It allows parents and others to ask police for details about individuals if they suspect they might harm children. Since it began in April 2011 just one in six applications for information has been successful and in Durham, the police force gave information about people who pose a risk to children in just 26% of applications.

NSPCC Freedom Information requests to police forces in England and Wales found that from 2011-2014, just 16 per cent of applications under the scheme, known as 'Sarah's Law', were successful - with vast variations in the numbers of police disclosures made across England and Wales. Between 2011-2014, 5,357 applications were made to 33 forces but only 877 applications resulted in disclosures being made. Five other forces said they had received 908 applications but about disclosure numbers.

The new figures reveal wide variation in the proportion of disclosures made by different police, indicating a post code lottery when it comes to responding to public concerns.

Warwickshire Police gave information about people who pose a risk to children in just 1% of applications (13 out of 1,084 applications). Suffolk Police disclosed information they held for around a third of applications (31 out of 93 made). Meanwhile Sussex Police. the force who investigated Sarah Payne's murder, gave out information for only of applications (14 out of 193 applications).

As well as parents, carers and guardians, any concerned member of the public can formally ask the police to tell them if someone has a record

for child sexual offences. Peter Wanless, NSPCC chief executive, said: "We are both disturbed and surprised by this wide discrepancy of figures across the country, revealing that there is a postcode lottery when it comes to how forces deal with Sarah's law.

"Families need to know if there are individuals in their area who pose a risk to

parents to make the right choices in order to protect their children, if they don't know who is a threat?

"The police need to be proactive in empowering communities to p vulnerable children. to protect wide variation in disclosure numbers doesn't breed confidence that the scheme is being understood or applied consistently and that is a concern.

While there may be very good reasons for disclosing information held to applicants, some forces seem to be too cautious which could put children at serious risk of harm. We need to see regular independent evaluation of this vital law to make sure it's working as it should.'

The figures come weeks after the NSPCC's State of the Nation report showed a dramatic increase in child sexual abuse being reported to police, with 3 offences committed every hour.



Local Artists Exhibit One in Five Lonely People PHYSICS ROADSHOW **Have No One to Turn to**

One in five people aged 60 and over who experience loneliness say they have no one to turn to, according to a new poll published today.

The Campaign to End Loneliness, who published the survey is warning that loneliness and isolation are as harmful as smoking 15 cigarettes a day and is calling on local authorities to take the lead on reducing and preventing loneliness in their local areas.

The organisation says range of support is needed to overcome the 'many triggers' of loneliness faced in older age. The Campaign states that the support needed should include transport and technology with 41 per cent of those who feel lonely saying transport is a barrier to seeing people, and half (51%) of older people polled believing the internet can help prevent loneliness.

The Campaign have launched new online guidance advising local authorities of the essential services that are needed to support older people, like local transport provided by a charity supporter of the Campaign, Supporter of the Contact the Elderly.

Maud, aged 90 from experienced loneliness and depression because she had difficulties with her mobility and struggled to leave her second floor flat. She was helped by Contact the Elderly who provide volunteers to drive older people to monthly Sunday tea parties. "I was so lonely after my best friend Margie died. I never married or had any children so I found myself completely alone, and I got very depressed. Sometimes I won't speak to another person all weekend, and Sundays

can be particularly lonely. "It's a miracle that my driver comes to my door and gives me a helping hand down the stairs, and brings me safely home again afterwards. I feel lucky to be part of Contact the Elderly and I've made so many friends.'

Laura Alcock-Ferguson, Director for the Campaign to End Loneliness, says: "It is very sad to know that one in five who feel lonely in older age have no one to turn to. Local authorities are currently making crucial decisions about their services and need to recognise the potentially devastating impact that these changes, even in areas like transport, may have on an older person's ability to stay in touch with their friends, family and neighbours.

"We need local authorities to address the many triggers of loneliness by maintaining and providing essential services that older people rely on to stay connected. This could be transport to help with shopping, support with getting online, or simply, by providing clear information about social activities happening in their area. Our new online guidance showcases many examples of committed local authorities who recognise this and we urge all Councils across the country to help prevent these devastating consequences of loneliness in later life".

Last year, Stoke-on-Trent ioined the World Health Organisation's Global Network of Age Friendly Cities and Communities in recognition of their commitment to making their City a great place in which to grow older and made ending loneliness a top priority.

Kate Edwards, Health Manager at Stoke-on-Trent City Council "Loneliness says: isolation is an important public health issue and we want to address loneliness in our local population to promote the wellbeing and quality of life of our older population in particular, which may help reduce demand on hospitals and social care services.

"The Campaign to Loneliness' online guidance is an excellent tool, reminding local authorities that there is no one cause of loneliness and no one cure. It will support our on-going commitment to working with our partners including public charities, services and local businesses to help older people maintain their social connections and independence."

A167 Roundabout

Work to improve safety and reduce congestion at a busy junction has been completed with the newly built roundabout officially opened. The £1.8m Durham County Council project involved replacing the T-junction at the intersection of the A167 and B6300 at Sunderland Bridge. next to the Honest Lawyer Hotel, with a roundabout.

The project aimed to improve safety following a number of accidents at the junction and to reduce congestion during peak times. It is hoped the improved access to the nearby Meadowfield Industrial Estate will also encourage more businesses to locate there.

The first phase of work saw 8,779 cubic meters of material imported and used to build earth embankments on the east and west of the A167 and was completed in December. Due to the nature of the soft ground next to the river the material had to be left to stand for three months to allow for settlement before the roundabout could be built. The new roundabout scheme was chosen over traffic signals as it means existing flood defences will be easier to adapt if any improvements are needed in the future.

Cllr Neil Foster, Cabinet member for economic regeneration, said: "Investing in the new roundabout means a safer and quicker journey for thousands of people every

day.
We've already received a lot of positive feedback about the project and we'd like to thank the public for their patience while we carried out this vital upgrade."

Has Mr Heaven Made a Difference at Woodham

Students Woodham Academy asked to were answer an unusual question during their recent Science Specialism Day – they had to decide whether or not one of their staff has made a difference to the school.

Mr Heaven, who started at the school on the same day as those learners who were being posed the intriguing enquiry, is well known for his passion for the natural world, and can often be observed stalking around the school grounds with camera and wellies – with members of his Wildlife Club in tow.

To complete this task, however, the Y8 learners would not merely be allowed to express on opinion, they would have to be able to draw a proper conclusion, using rigorous scientific data.

The Wildlife Club have been busy making the school more wildlife friendly since they were founded at the beginning of the year. They have planted Woodland Trust donated trees, put up bird boxes, installed hedgehog houses & bug hotels, and have propagated a range of wild flowers.

They have also convinced the school to adopt an environmental management model, which sees the boundary hedges cut every three years, instead of annually, and the back of the school turned into a summer meadow, which will only be cut once a year, instead of the previous nineteen times.

The hedges will now be cut in an 'A' pattern, instead of the usual vertical cut, in order

to create a wildlife corridor around the perimeter and provide smaller mammals and amphibians with a place of relative safety; and they have even convinced a local farm to take their hay when it is cut at the beginning of the next term.

The results, says Mr Heaven, are impressive, but will they stand up to the scrutiny of the school's Science Department? Mr Heaven believes so, and he points to the increased numbers of nest sites and the visitation of dragon flies as evidence of the Club's successes. These achievements, however, are not his alone - a point the Newton Aycliffe raised educator is keen to emphasise: "Come rain or come shine, you're sure to find Wildlife Club members busy about the school, recording tracks and footprints, preparing wild-flower beds, monitoring bird boxes, or checking on our new trees.' In addition, all the equipment

used by the Academy's students has, says Mr Heaven, been donated, or paid for by the Club's community

"If our Science Department deem our efforts a success it will be because it has been a collaborative effort - of students, parents and volunteers, and our friends at Wilkos and Aycliffe Rotarians.'

So why such a close scrutiny of the Club's efforts? Mr Heaven says it is all part and parcel of the school's drive to include 'practical' environmental sciences into the Academy's ethos: believe that it is a central role of this school to prepare young people for challenges which lay ahead. Being aware of threats to natural environment is one thing, but taking steps to halt, and even reverse these threats, takes us from the realm of observer into the realm of activism - and using science to monitor and record these activities, and the impact they have, is what makes all the difference."
It is with this in mind that a number of the Wildlife Club members have been enrolled on a scheme run by the

the first seven of whom have recently been awarded their Level 1 'Discovery' award.

In order to check if the school's Wildlife Club has indeed made a difference, it was decided to call in the Science Department to check their claims.

sing Y8 scientists - who study environmental sciences as part of the curriculum, data was collected comparing those parts of the school which are still managed in the traditional manner, with those managed by the Wildlife Club. If there was found to be a significant difference between the diversity of the two, then Mr Heaven's case would be proven.

And what did they find?

Well, it was discovered that those areas of grassland managed by the young conservationists do, indeed, contain significantly more species than other areas - this came as little surprise to Mr Heaven: "Although we have introduced a good number of new species to the site, the majority of what we are seeing is already here, present in the soil – they just need a chance to do what they do best.'

So, has Mr Heaven made a difference? Yes, he says, he has, but as he is himself very keen to point out it is more a matter of 'choice', and in the case of Woodham Academy a good number of staff, students, friends and relatives have chosen to take conservation's side

POOR BBQ HYGIENE CAUSES INCREASE IN FOOD POISONING

Every year 120,000 extra illnesses recorded during the British summer.1 With the weather heating up hygiene experts are concerned that our laidback approach to barbecue hygiene is a key contributor to the 5.5 million cases of food poisoning, which cause 20,000 hospitalizations and

COUNCIL'S RECYCLING CAMPAIGN EXTENDED

County Durham residents to recycle their household waste has been extended following its success.

Durham County Council launched the Bin it Right campaign in April 2014 to help inform people about what they can and can't recycle and which bin they should use.

The campaign has significantly improved the quality of the material collected from the kerbside for recycling and enabled the council to recycle, reuse or compost 43 per cent of all household waste collected in County Durham, which is in line with the national average.

And by reducing contamination levels – which can be caused by people placing non-recyclable such as food, materials, nappies and pet waste, in their recycling bin or by not washing containers out the council is saving money due to not having to pay around £100

per tonne for alternative treatment and disposal.

Following its success, the campaign will now extended until the end of March 2016

Cllr Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, at Durham County Council, said: "We've had a very positive response from people to our Bin it Right campaign and I'd like to thank residents

for their continuing efforts to ensure we recycle as much as we can.

"It is essential that all items are put in the right bin or box so good quality recyclable materials are free from contamination and can be turned into new products.

"This is not only beneficial for the environment but is also helping us to save money.

As part of the Bin it Right campaign more than 50 community events and talks have been held and more than 16,000 residents have taken time to talk to the council's recycling team about what items they can recycle and which bin they should use.

Tins, cans and aerosols, plastic bottles, pots, tubs, paper, cardboard and liquid food and drink cartons can all be placed in the blue-lidded recycling bins. Glass bottles and jars should be placed in the recycling box.

Residents are asked to wash and squash items where possible and place them loose in the recycling bin without being bagged.
