

infested with ants. The insects were coming from nests behind the wall and were everywhere. She tried herself to get rid of the pests to no avail so in a distressed state contacted both Livin and the County Council.

Livin could do nothing and said the County Council pest control team would do the job but they had to charge in the region of £40 which had to be paid up front.

The young mother was now completely stressed as she only had money to feed herself and the child. The problem was worsening and she could not live in these

conditions. She rang Newton Press who along with the help of County Councillor John Clare tried to resolve the problem, but as it was the weekend there was no one to deal with this emergency and it would have to wait until Monday morning. The young mother was forced to leave her home and stay with her parents fearing for her child's safety

The County Council still insisted money was paid up front as there was no contingency fund to help people who had no money or who are faced with the choice of feeding themselves or paying for ants to be removed

Councillor Clare agreed with Newton News this was unacceptable and a new

policy would have to be considered to help people in these circumstances, however this would take time

and the problem was now! In the meantime the young mother still had thousands of ants scurrying around so in complete frustration with the authorities, Newton Press contacted Aycliffe Pest Control business Dave Oliver who agreed to help the mother that day and donated his services to help the young mother. The town's Rotary Club was also happy to help if needed. It would have been nice to report the Council had the same concern and

goodwill. This is not an isolated case and a few people find themselves in this awful predicament. Newton News believe there has to be a method of dealing with these stressful situations. Tenancy agreements are all well and good if the person has the means to comply, but concessions should be made when a person has no money and where a measure of compassion and consideration is required.

Newton News also believes this should have been dealt with free of charge as an environmental health issue as the infestation could have spread to nearby houses.

Newton News have also discovered that flying ants are listed in the Institute of Environmental Health as a recognised pest along with rats, cockroaches, beetles etc

The world's richest and most popular football league has kicked off again and hundreds of thousands of fans attended the first game of the new season. But I wonder how many disabled supporters were among them? Not nearly as many as wanted to, if our research is anything to go by.

work for the charity Ι Revitalise, which provides respite holidays for disabled people and carers from across the UK. Accessible excursions are an integral part of what we do, so we wanted to find what Premiership clubs were doing for their disabled fans on match days. The results made for depressing reading. We found out that all the clubs had signed up to guidelines and promised to improve their provision for disabled people over 10 years ago, but after all that time only three Premiership clubs – Arsenal,

Bournemouth and Swansea had the recommended number of spaces for wheelchair users. In our view this is quite pathetic.

We also asked disabled football fans about their own experiences and they painted a picture of poor match day experiences and feelings of exclusion. This is not good enough. Disabled supporters have a right to expect the same enjoyable, socially inclusive experience as every other fan, which is why we're calling for football clubs to up their game and provide better facilities and services for disabled fans. We don't think that's too much to ask. I'd like your readers to join me in calling for football clubs to get on the ball and do the right thing by their disabled supporters. 





# in Restorative Justice

The number of victims wishing to meet their offender to explain the impact of their actions has increased in recent months.

In response to the growing demand, Ron Hogg, Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner, has made 60 new places available for local people who would like to be trained in this approach. Restorative Justice offers victims

the chance to meet their offender to find out why the offence occurred and agree a way for amends to be made. Research shows that victims can find the process empowering and it can help restore their confidence and peace of mind after experiencing a crime. Ron said: "With a growing

number of victims wishing to take advantage of this opportunity, the need for trained practitioners to safely and effectively manage these encounters has never been higher. Under the right circumstances restorative justice can aid the healing process for victims of crime and reduce reoffending.

"I have used money allocated to me by the Ministry of Justice to fund two co-ordinators to improve the delivery of restorative justice across County Durham and Darlington. 'Individuals and communities

have already benefitted from the valued contributions our existing facilitators have made, and we're now looking to train more facilitators who are keen to support others in their community."

The accredited training will run between September and January in Durham and Darlington, and offers residents the chance to become a Restorative Justice Facilitator and gain a recognised Level 3 qualification.

As an extra incentive, funding of up to  $\pounds 500$  is being offered to would-be students of any age who can spare 3 hours a week to run these meetings for victims and offenders once their training


