

Zach Parnaby on Xmas Eve. 2014 after numerous trips to hospitals in Darlington and Newcastle, was diagnosed a rare with terminal disease called Krabbe Leukodystrophy.

It is a rare genetic disorder of the nervous system that destroys part of the brain which produces Myelin the protective shield around nerves.

Zach was a healthy and happy little boy who despite being born 5¹/₂ weeks early had met every milestone and had just about walking. He is now unable to walk, stand sit, use his arms or hands and is fed via an NG tube.

Zach's onset of symptoms have been rapid and the family have been told to prepare for its progression to

Various species of wildflowers and herbaceous plants have been planted on roundabouts and verges as part of Durham County Council's wildflower planting scheme.

The eye-catching creations, courtesy of the council's Clean and Green teams, include annuals such as poppies and cornflowers, as well as perennial plants such as oxeye daisies and scabious.

Together they not only provide colourful displays, but are perfect habitats for pollinators such as bees and butterflies.

They have attracted acclaim from residents and visitors to the county who have been raving about how the displays have brightened up their areas.

Planting has been completed on roundabouts and verges on the A688 at Bishop Auckland and St Helen Auckland, and at Pity Me, Newton Hall, the Sniperley and Durham Park and Ride sites and at the Bishop Auckland town recreation ground.







Leadership Contest Comes to Aycliffe

DRIVERS URGED TO "BACK OFF" ON INJURY PREVENTION DAY 11 motorists have been unacceptable

handed on-the-spot fines for careless driving in County Durham and Darlington since police were awarded new powers two years ago. The figures have been obtained ahead of Injury Prevention Day on 19 August through a freedom of information request by the Association of Personal Injury Lawyers (APIL) a notfor-profit group for injured people which is campaigning to make tailgating socially

Fixed penalty fines of up to £100 were introduced for motoring offences including tailgating and hogging the middle lane of the motorway in August 2013.

"Driving too closely to the car in front, or 'tailgating', is a serious safety issue and leads to unnecessary crashes and injuries," said Jonathan Wheeler, APIL's president.

"We hope that Injury Prevention Day gets people thinking about what they can do to prevent injuries which

could be avoided. "Tailgating is incredibly anti-social, as well as dangerous, and can be really intimidating for other drivers. It's also entirely pointless as it's not going to get anyone to their destination any faster. We're asking simply for people to 'back off'.

In a recent poll of motorists, APIL found that more than half (56 per cent) do not know that the typical stopping distance when travelling at 30 miles per hour is 23 metres (75 feet) including thinking time, according to the Highway Code. This distance equates to six car lengths. National Police Chiefs

Council Lead on Roads Policing, Chief Constable Suzette Davenport, said: "Tailgating is not only a very dangerous thing for drivers to do - putting themselves and others at risk of death or serious injury in the event of a sudden halt - it is also a criminal offence, punishable at the very least by three points on your licence and a £100 fine.

"Our officers are not there to make drivers' lives a misery – they are there to protect them from harm and to ensure that the country's roads network is kept moving and kept safe.

Motorists who flout the laws of the road put themselves and those around them at risk of danger and we are determined to stop them doing so. So please – for the sake of other road users and for the sake of your own good name, please back off from tailgating."






