Town's Rotary Club Install Defibrillator in Tesco's

Vital Lifesaving Equipment for Public Use

The Rotary Club is spearheading a campaign for better access to emergency treatment for heart attacks and sudden cardiac arrest in Newton Aycliffe. They are organising Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) training and have bought a Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) from their charitable funds. After taking advice from the Ambulance Service and the British Heart Foundation they are pressing on with their ambitious project. According to the British Heart Foundation, without help a person could die in minutes from a severe heart attack or a cardiac arrest. Every minute without CPR and/or Defibrillation reduces survival rate by 10%.

Tesco are always ready to help

the community, and offered to house the defibrillator in their store (saving money on vandal proof casing) and also provide training rooms as required. Being central and open almost 24/7 the Rotary Club felt it the ideal location for the defibrillator. An official handover and information event is planned for September, at the store where names can be taken for CPR training. A spokesperson for Rotary said 'We have lost 3 respected and long standing members of our club this year from heart problems. What better legacy to leave the community they served than a defibrillator which can save lives'.

More defibrillators could be provided if funds and ideal locations are found. The Rotary Club are hosting a Charity Night at the British Legion Club to boost funds on 30th October. Tickets available soon - £5 inc entertainment & supper.

War Hero from Aycliffe in Unmarked Grave for 96 Years

*Local History Society research his
life story and obtain official Headstone*

Edward Henry Pratt was born in Cockerton 1889 and married Margaret Louisa Watson in 1908, they had 3 children, Nicholas 1911, Sidney 1913 and Marjorie 1916.

He joined the 5th Battalion DLI, 25th October 1915 and was sent to France February 1916. He was shot in the leg and neck and was sent home to recover for 3 months and was sent back to France on 15th June 1916.

He received a gunshot wound to his right shoulder on 16th September 1916 and was returned home until 21st March 1917 when he was sent back to France.

The trench he was in was bombed and he was struck by heavy trench support timbers, part buried and partially paralysed.

He was discharged from the Army in May 1918 as unfit for further service and he returned home to his family living in the Orlands, Aycliffe Village. He died from his wounds in Greenbank Hospital Darlington on 15th September 1918 and due to the family's poverty was buried in an unmarked grave in Darlington West Cemetery. Sadly his widow died 4 years later and the children were sent initially to live with Aunts and Uncles and they grew up not knowing the story of their parents.

He lay forgotten until Aycliffe Village Local History Society researched his war record and traced not only his grave but living grandchildren in Darlington who knew nothing about their grandfather or grandmother. The Society persuaded the Commonwealth War Graves Commission that he should have an official headstone and 16 months later it was put in position on his grave. A special Dedication Service is being organised as the least that can be done to honour a local man who suffered terrible injuries and died for his country.



He was then forgotten for 96 years until members of the Local History group unearthed his story.

New Pre-School Class Starts at Woodham

Parents love the sessions as much as the children Jen from Stockton said in a review about Wigglets "Wigglets is wonderful! Marie magically transforms the class into themed fun for child and mum. Her enthusiasm, never ending source of props, music and movement stimulates imagination, creativity and expression. Wigglets has been an essential part of our weekly routine for over 3 years, my girls love it and I secretly cannot wait to see what music we will be dancing around the room to each week!"

All of this adds up to the ideal opportunity for the child to learn and improve so many skills both socially and physically.

I have six classes at the moment covering Sedgfield, Stockton and Darlington, I have also taken Wigglets into Surestart centres and private nurseries. I'm starting a new class on a Monday mornings at 9.30am on the 14th of September in Woodham Community Centre.

the volunteers who run the centre were so helpful and passionate about providing a good range of activities for the community it was the perfect choice for Wigglets. 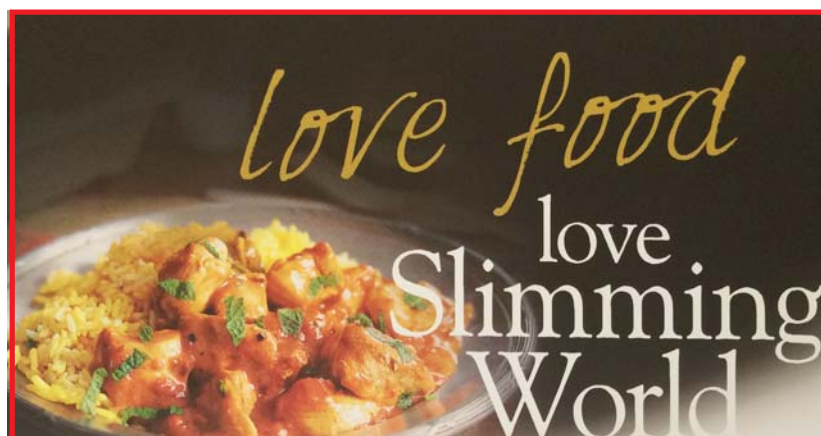

NO DECREASE IN DRINK DRIVING

The Institute of Advanced Motorists (IAM) have expressed disappointment at the findings of the latest long term review of drinking and driving data issued by the government which shows a stagnation in progress since 2010.

Drinking and driving data from 1979-2014 shows there were an estimated 8,320 drink-drive casualties in 2014 in Britain, up from 8,270 in 2013. This is the first increase in casualties since 2002 (1). More importantly drink-drive related deaths have remained unchanged since 2010.

Neil Greig, IAM director of policy and research, said: "While good progress has been made over the years, we are very concerned that we may have reached a plateau and are not making much progress in further reducing alcohol related crashes.

"The new government has a great opportunity to set the

agenda right at the start of the new administration and top of their list should be a consultation on reducing the

drink drive limit in England and Wales to align with Scotland and most of the rest of Europe."

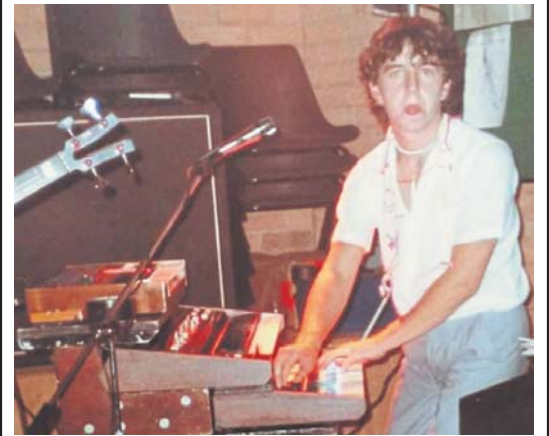

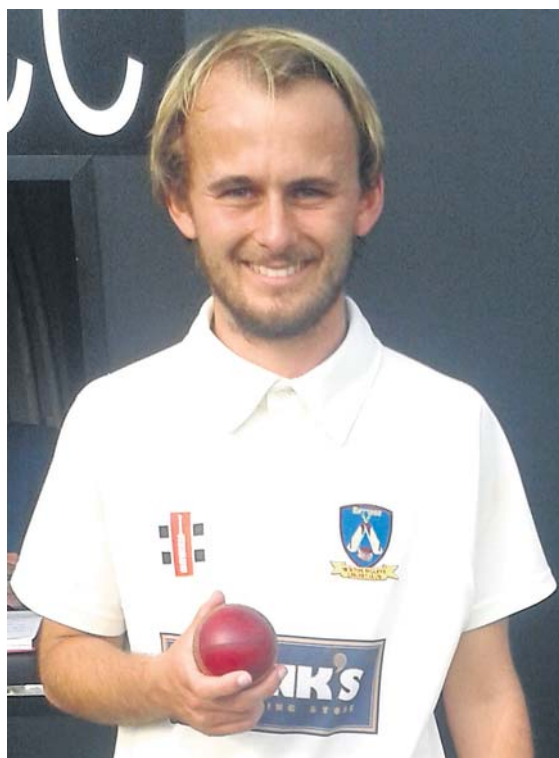

Aycliffe Bowler Takes all Ten Wickets for 4 Runs

Holds Record in League's 122 year History

Saturday 22nd of August will live long in the memory for Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's Jack Slatcher as he became the first Aycliffe player to take all ten wickets in the same game when the 2nd team beat Yarm 2nds in the NYSD 3rd Division. His record breaking feat was completed in just 33 balls as he finished with the astonishing figures of 5 overs, 3 maidens, 10 wickets for just 4 runs. Although yet to be confirmed, it appears that the talented 20 year old swing bowler's figures were the best in the 122 year history of the NYSD League.

What is even more remarkable was that Jack (sponsored by Mr & Mrs



Greaves) only started playing cricket last season, but has quickly established himself as a competent opening bowler and is currently the leading wicket taker in the NYSD 3rd division. His total wickets for this season currently stands at 57, which is also an Aycliffe club record for the most wickets in a season by a 2nd team bowler. The game itself also produced other records

as Newton Aycliffe won by a 2nd team club record victory margin of 193 runs. Yarm won the toss and asked the home-side to bat first as Aycliffe scored an impregnable 226 for 6 from their 50 overs. Captain Adam Gittins top scored with an unbeaten 73 and in the process set a new 2nd team record for the most runs in a season with his total now currently standing at 518. Other contributions came from John Wardle (43), Patrick Howe (32), Joe Haines (21) and Danny Weldon 21 not out. Thanks to Slatcher's amazing bowling, Yarm in reply were very quickly skittled for just 33 after 10.3 overs. Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks The Flooring Store, achieved their fourth straight win over Darlington RA 1st XI this season, this time with a comfortable five wicket away victory in the NYSD 2nd division. The home side were bowled out for 178 after 49 overs thanks to good bowling from both John Cavanagh (3 for 46) and Luke Telford (4 for 49). In reply openers Tom Young, who scored 45 and John Cavanagh (sponsored by CVO Fire) with 37, got Aycliffe to a solid start with a first wicket partnership of 69.
