

Big Bounce Opens at Aycliffe's ROF 59 Activity Centre



A huge Trampoline Park has opened in Newton Aycliffe as part of exciting new activity centre ROF 59. The all-round fun complex, which incorporates a bar and lounge at its 70,000 sq ft premises on Durham Way South, Aycliffe Business Park 'Bounce at ROF 59' incorporates a total of 75 trampolines, including free running areas and a slam dunk, completing the venue's remarkable makeover.

Almost £750,000 was spent on constructing a new steel frame for the venue and a further £400,000 has been spent fitting out the inside of the new building including a bar/lounge, named The

Bunker, and The Blitz Restaurant. ROF 59 also includes a maze of climbing walls for climbers of all abilities -

including one of the biggest in the country, standing at 20 metres tall, as well as the new trampoline park. Bounce at ROF 59 costs £10.50, which includes

It's restricted to children aged 6+, but toddlers sessions are also starting from 21st September.



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's first team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store had a record breaking win away to Maltby 1st team by four wickets in the NYSD 2nd division

After asking Maltby to bat first, they proceeded to rack up a huge total of 254 for 9 from their allotted 48 overs despite some good bowling from both Luke Telford (3 for 53) and Michael Howe (2 for 40).

In reply, an amazing century from man of the match John Cavanagh (sponsored by CVO Fire) helped Aycliffe to score a club record 255, which is their highest total to win a match batting second.

Cavanagh (in photo) hit 16 boundaries and was eventually dismissed for 107, his highest score for Aycliffe and he shared a superb 3rd wicket partnership of 134 with Sam Telford, who scored an equally brilliant 69. A mini collapse created some tension for Avcliffe but an unbeaten 14 from captain Chris Palmer and 11 not out from Luke Telford safely saw their team to a fifth consecutive victory from just 37.5 overs. abandoned as a draw after just 24 overs due to heavy showers making the ground unfit for any further play. Aycliffe had earlier won the toss and asked the visitors to bat first and they were struggling at 69 for 5 when the umpires stopped play. Leg spin bowler Patrick Howe (sponsored by Aycliffe NUFC Supporters Bus) took 4 for 13 and in the process passed 50 wickets for the season and was given good support from Danny Weldon, who chipped in with 1 for 15 from his seven over spell.

Dear Sir, Newton News carried a letter recently from County and Great Aycliffe Town Councillor, Eddy Adam, in which he explains the green coverage on West Park Lakes. Duckweed, he says is beneficial to the ecology of the wildlife which inhabit the lakes, apparently skimming the surface of the lakes is a

hopeless task as the weed will just keep reappearing. would tend to agree with Eddy on this point and as Chairman of Friends of West Park thank him for his physical participation in helping to clean the lakes on Friday 28th of August. We are all of course aware

that the weed does increase in warm weather, although this being Northern Britain warm dry days are rare enough to be anticipated anyway. Where I would differ in

opinion from Eddy is that in my opinion it is not a

thankless task. Prior to John D Clare, presumably under his authority as Chairman of the environment committee last year issuing an instruction for Friends Of West Park, to desist and refrain from cleaning the lakes last summer when 70% of the top lake was cleaned out by volunteers with the effect that the bottom could be seen through clear water and remains so a year later. Of course Councillor Clare did this using environment officer Steve Coopers name instead of signing the order himself. course tinkering with

duckweed will never cure the problem and only a fool would think it would, however the removal of all of the debris from the bottom of the lake does help to keep the lakes clear and has, I believe, been adequately demonstrated. As with all interested parties

the lakes currently. With Autumn just around the corner the inevitable is about to happen with tons of leaves blowing into the lakes to compound the problem of smelly gunge built up over previous years when the lakes have been left to decay into their present state under the control of Councillor Clare's Chairmanship of the Environment Committee Instead of spitting out his juvenile dummy if he cared anything about the people residing in the area around the lakes or even citizens of the town he would hang his head

Friends are constantly opposed of course by a couple of councillors who live nowhere near the park and seem determined to leave a legacy of a rotting green smelly pond

Luckily for the public and Councillor Arun Chandran has taken on the role of Chairman of the Environment Committee and is championing the cause of West Park. As is the Leader of the Council Cllr Bob Fleming and most others councillors. can be seen with the planting of flower beds, bulbs and trees. For public amenity and enjoyment benches and bins are being placed around the park making the walkways more accessible to disabled members of the public and a place to rest for the weary who can now relax and enjoy the





equipment for the ICU at James Cook University to purchase some much needed Cook University Hospital, Middlesbrough, in memory of Claire Gardiner, who passed away there very suddenly at the age of 30, in December 2012. The event saw a group of Claire's family and friends take on a series of challenges: the National Three Peaks Walk, followed by the Coast to Coast Cycle Ride and finishing with the Great North Swim, all over three consecutive weekends in June 2013.

Since then the charity was formed and named itself after the event which started it, to make 'The Madathlon' an annual challenge to help people and charities in our area. Madathlon also organise other fundraising events throughout the year.

public access defibrillators like the one recently installed at Heighington. These machines are the only treatment for cardiac arrest, which takes the lives of 250 people per day in the UK. Chances of survival increase from 5% to 70% if treatment can be given within a few minutes and many more deaths can be prevented by providing these lifesaving machines, which can also be used, without training, by anyone. It will not deliver a shock to a casualty unless it is needed.
