Big Bounce Opens at Aycliffe's ROF 59 Activity Centre



A huge Trampoline Park has opened in Newton Aycliffe as part of exciting new activity centre ROF 59. The all-round fun complex, which incorporates a bar and lounge at its 70,000 sq ft premises on Durham Way South, Aycliffe Business Park 'Bounce at ROF 59' incorporates a total of 75 trampolines, including free running areas and a slam dunk, completing the venue's remarkable makeover.

Almost £750,000 was spent on constructing a new steel frame for the venue and a further £400,000 has been spent fitting out the inside of the new building including a bar/lounge, named The

Bunker, and The Blitz Restaurant. ROF 59 also includes a maze of climbing walls for climbers of all abilities - including one of the biggest in the country, standing at 20 metres tall, as well as the new trampoline park. Bounce at ROF 59 costs £10.50, which includes socks, with sessions held daily. Monday and Friday 11.30am-8.30pm and Tues-Thurs and Saturdays held from 10.30am-8.30pm, with Sunday sessions 10.30am-4.30pm. It's restricted to children aged 6+, but toddlers sessions are also starting from 21st September.

Adventure Climb at ROF 59, which is four youngsters aged from four, costs £7.50 and sessions are held Mondays and Fridays (12-9pm) and Tues-Thurs (10am-9pm), Saturdays (10am-9pm) and Sundays (10am-5pm). She completed the distance in 22mins 8 seconds. Her position was 100th out of 605 girls in the 9/10yrs age group. 6000 children took part in the event with ages ranging from 3 to 16yrs.

CRICKET SCOREBOARD

Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's first team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store had a record breaking win away to Maltby 1st team by four wickets in the NYSD 2nd division.

After asking Maltby to bat first, they proceeded to rack up a huge total of 254 for 9 from their allotted 48 overs despite some good bowling from both Luke Telford (3 for 53) and Michael Howe (2 for 40).

In reply, an amazing century from man of the match John Cavanagh (sponsored by CVO Fire) helped Aycliffe to score a club record 255, which is their highest total to win a match batting second.

Cavanagh (in photo) hit 16 boundaries and was eventually dismissed for 107, his highest score for Aycliffe and he shared a superb 3rd wicket partnership of 134 with Sam Telford, who scored an equally brilliant 69. A mini collapse created some tension for Aycliffe but an unbeaten 14 from captain Chris Palmer and 11 not out from Luke Telford safely saw their team to a fifth consecutive victory from just 37.5 overs.

The second team game at home to Maltby 2nd XI was



abandoned as a draw after just 24 overs due to heavy showers making the ground unfit for any further play. Aycliffe had earlier won the toss and asked the visitors to bat first and they were struggling at 69 for 5 when the umpires stopped play. Leg spin bowler Patrick Howe (sponsored by Aycliffe NUFC Supporters Bus) took 4 for 13 and in the process passed 50 wickets for the season and was given good support from Danny Weldon, who chipped in with 1 for 15 from his seven over spell.

West Park Lakes Have Rosy Future if Kept Clean

Dear Sir,
Newton News carried a letter recently from County and Great Aycliffe Town Councillor, Eddy Adam, in which he explains the green coverage on West Park Lakes. Duckweed, he says is beneficial to the ecology of the wildlife which inhabit the lakes, apparently skimming the surface of the lakes is a hopeless task as the weed will just keep reappearing.

I would tend to agree with Eddy on this point and as Chairman of Friends of West Park thank him for his physical participation in helping to clean the lakes on Friday 28th of August.

We are all of course aware that the weed does increase in warm weather, although this being Northern Britain warm dry days are rare enough to be anticipated anyway.

Where I would differ in opinion from Eddy is that in my opinion it is not a thankless task. Prior to John D Clare, presumably under his authority as Chairman of the environment committee last year issuing an instruction for Friends Of West Park, to desist and refrain from cleaning the lakes last summer when 70% of the top lake was cleaned out by volunteers with the effect that the bottom could be seen through clear water and remains so a year later. Of course Councillor Clare did this using environment officer Steve Coopers name instead of signing the order himself.

Of course tinkering with duckweed will never cure the problem and only a fool would think it would, however the removal of all of the debris from the bottom of the lake does help to keep the lakes clear and has, I believe, been adequately demonstrated. As with all interested parties we at Friends of West Park eagerly await the ecological and hydrology reports as we are convinced that a free flow of water into the lakes will result in the cooling down of the temperature which in turn should restrict the multiplying of duckweed and carry any which does form out of the lake into the Burn. With a flow of water from the burn into the lakes any wildlife will be carried into the lakes ensuring a plentiful supply of those creatures which are inhabiting the lakes currently.

With Autumn just around the corner the inevitable is about to happen with tons of leaves blowing into the lakes to compound the problem of smelly gunge built up over previous years when the lakes have been left to decay into their present state under the control of Councillor Clare's Chairmanship of the Environment Committee. Instead of spitting out his juvenile dummy if he cared anything about the people residing in the area around the lakes or even citizens of the town he would hang his head in shame instead of contriving excuses.

Friends are constantly opposed of course by a couple of councillors who live nowhere near the park and seem determined to leave a legacy of a rotting green smelly pond for the residents of West Ward

Luckily for the public and local residents, Councillor Arun Chandran has taken on the role of Chairman of the Environment Committee and is championing the cause of West Park. As is the Leader of the Council Cllr Bob Fleming and most others councillors.

Already a difference can be seen with the planting of flower beds, bulbs and trees. For public amenity and enjoyment benches and bins are being placed around the park making the walkways more accessible to disabled members of the public and a place to rest for the weary who can now relax and enjoy the spectacular views.

West Park with its boating lakes and spectacular views has a rosy future and who knows if we can bring about a thorough cleaning of the boating lakes perhaps it may become rose scented too. So in conclusion cleaning the

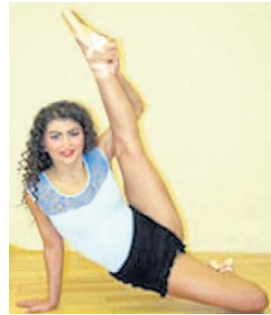

A huge thank you to all the wonderful children from Horndale Playing Fields, who joined in the search for my border terrier 'Harvey' who went missing on Sunday afternoon.

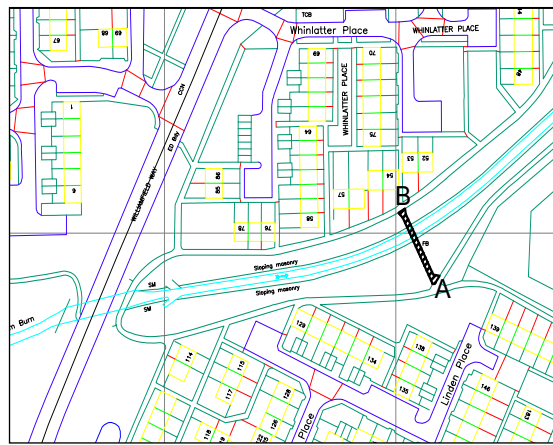
Off they went in different directions, calling his name and trying to help me. He was then found making his own way home, safe and well by fellow dog walkers who recognised him.

Life saving equipment sited at Parish Field



Heighington AFC Boys would like to say a very big, and appreciative 'Thank You' to a local family, the Gardiner's, and their charity Madathlon for all the help and support we have received in the provision of a defibrillator within our playing fields facilities.

Their fundraising efforts and their charity alone mean we are able to house, and receive necessary training for this much needed piece of lifesaving equipment and for this, as a club, we are incredibly grateful.

The defibrillator is of course available for the wider community to use and anyone interested in knowing how to use this piece of equipment is invited to join us in Heighington Village Hall on 26th and 27th September at 12 noon when the Fire and Ambulance Service will be offering full training and answering questions.

The Madathlon event was born from an idea to raise £10,000 to purchase some much needed equipment for the ICU at James Cook University Hospital, Middlesbrough, in memory of Claire Gardiner, who passed away there very suddenly at the age of 30, in December 2012.

The event saw a group of Claire's family and friends take on a series of challenges: the National Three Peaks Walk, followed by the Coast to Coast Cycle Ride and finishing with the Great North Swim, all over three consecutive weekends in June 2013.

Since then the charity was formed and named itself after the event which started it, to make 'The Madathlon' an annual challenge to help people and charities in our area. Madathlon also organise other fundraising events throughout the year.

Since the first event, the team have raised over £35,000 which has been used to supply lifesaving equipment in the local area. This year funds raised are being used to supply

public access defibrillators, like the one recently installed at Heighington. These machines are the only treatment for cardiac arrest, which takes the lives of 250 people per day in the UK. Chances of survival increase from 5% to 70% if treatment can be given within a few minutes and many more deaths can be prevented by providing these lifesaving machines, which can also be used, without training, by anyone. It will not deliver a shock to a casualty unless it is needed.

North East Devolution Proposals Submitted

Formal proposals for a devolution deal designed to drive economic growth and bring jobs and investment to the North East have been submitted to Government.

The North East Combined Authority (NECA) has set out its proposals for devolution in a document submitted to the Treasury for consideration as part of the autumn spending review.

Key points included in the proposals are ambitious plans for:

- The North East to be recognised as the UK's regional export lead by

attracting targeted investors and by building on the area's existing strengths and assets.

- Investment in the area's workforce - enabling people to develop their skills in line with the needs of local business, improving their employment opportunities and raising aspirations and expectations.

- A long-term programme of investment to generate market confidence and stability and maximise investment opportunities.

- Fiscal devolution to ensure a level playing field in terms of costs faced by business in the North East and to allow

for the local retention and reinvestment of the proceeds of additional growth in the area.

- The creation of an integrated and upgraded local transport system across the North East with devolved responsibility for all aspects of capital and revenue funding, underpinned by long-term investment in infrastructure improvements.

- The reform of public services, to address growing spending and demand pressures, by empowering communities and reducing dependency.

- Devolution to councils and communities to ensure the diverse nature of the North East and its distinct places and people are taken into account in decision making.

Cllr Simon Henig, chair of the North East Combined Authority, said: "We are working to secure the means by which we can build a stronger economy, generate more and better jobs, improve transport links and skills training throughout the North East. We

want to ensure that everyone living and working in our area can take advantage of the new opportunities that will exist and can share in the area's increased prosperity.

"With the submission of our formal expression of interest for our proposals to be considered as part of the spending review in November, we have taken a step further towards achieving our ambitions. There is still a great deal more work to be done and we are continuing discussions in order to further develop our proposals. "As we move forward, we will speak to the business sector, trade unions, the voluntary and community sector, residents and other interested parties so that their views can be taken into account."

FA CUP HISTORY FOR NEWTON AYCLIFFE FC

A goal either side of half time gave Aycliffe victory in their first ever appearance in the First Qualifying Round of the a Emirates FA Cup.

The win came against a Brighouse side who play one league higher than the Newtonians. Their reward will be to play in the next round on the 26 September. The draw takes place on Monday 14 September.

Aycliffe started brightly against Brighouse with Matty Moffat winning a

corner after 5 mins. Dennis Knight's low cross was met by Alex Kitchen whose shot was cleared.

Brighouse almost took the lead 3 mins later but keeper James Winter pulled off the first of many great saves he needed to make during the game. Brighouse fought back and Winter was forced into action pulling off a fantastic double save after 67 minutes.

The home side continued to press and had two goals disallowed for offside. Winter made two more great saves in the last five minutes but Aycliffe held out to earn their greatest victory in their 50 year history.

Whatever else this season brings Aycliffe's loyal supporters they will long remember this fantastic win achieved thanks to the hard work of the whole team.

Aycliffe now return to league action with a home game against Sunderland RCA next Saturday 19 September. Admission is £6 for adults and £4 concessions with under 12's going free.
