On Monday 5th October 2015 carrier bag charging began in England, similar to the charging already in place in Scotland, Wales & Northern Ireland like other large Tesco,

retailers, are now required by law to charge a minimum of 5p for every carrier bag used by a customer. Proceeds generated from sales of the bags will be given to good causes, as set out by Defra. The money raised from the

5p bag charge will be used to pay for a large number of local projects to improve green spaces in communities across the UK. Projects will include building new pocket parks, sports facilities, woodland walks and community and gardens It's your money so where

the money goes locally is up to you, you'll have the opportunity to decide where it is spent, by nominating your favourite local charity or community group. This money is set to make a huge difference to local communities across the UK by ensuring that green spaces can be enjoyed by all.

Six projects will receive funding in each of 428 regions annually, which means that over two thousand different projects will receive funding from the bag charge after just one year. The amount of funding available for individual local

projects will range from $\pounds 8,000$ to $\pounds 12,000$.

the Beveridge Arcade shop along with her husband Paul, changing the name to Petals & Pets, and building a solid reputation as florists. Petals and Pets survived there for 20 years, struggling

through tough times and a declining town centre trade which saw many shops close. On Monday October 5th Bridie and Paul opened their new shop in the town's Thames Centre no longer selling pets accessories. PETALS



Finley Structures of Avcliffe saw turnover jump to £16.4m by the end of March this year up by £3.1m on 2014. During that time, the steel fabrication firm has also taken on eight new employees - boosting staff numbers to 68 - while working contracts

on high-profile across the region. Finley Structures fabricated and erected 2,000 tonnes of steel which makes up the frame for Hitachi Rail Europe's new £82m train-assembling factory on Aycliffe Business Park The firm has also worked on

a 2,300-tonne project at the Victoria Gate shopping centre in Leeds - a deal worth close to £4m

During the 2014-15 financial year, they also built Nissan's new Leaf factory, the Sports Village in Middlesbrough and a 300-tonne frame for the £38m National Biologics Centre in Darlington. In addition, Finleys completed a 500-tonne project for Teesside University and a 620-tonne contract for

the University of Sheffield's Advanced Manufacturing and Research Centre to round-up a busy year. Its sister company, nearby SCH Site Services which employs 36 people, continues

to perform strongly, while Finley's also launched the ROF 59 activity centre. at Aycliffe Business Park which employs another 15 full-time and 15 part-time staff. Joint managing director Julie Finley says it's been a hugely

positive and progressive period for the firm. "The construction industry continues to have its challenges but it has been an exceptional year for the Finley group," she said.

The financial performance for the year end March 2015 has been largely down to the two large, contracts in Hitachi for Shepherd Construction and Victoria Gate for Sir Robert


Oberlin Filter is owned by a private, family-run business, based in the USA, with another production facility in Germany.
