Aycliffe Company Featured on Popular T.V. Programme



An Aycliffe steel firm has helped to construct the biggest house ever to feature on Channel 4's popular TV show Grand Designs. SCH Site Services provided the steel for the 60-metre long bungalow which left presenter Kevin McCloud almost speechless. McCloud, who has presented the show since it first aired in 1999, appeared stunned by the sheer scale of the project when he arrived to view the steel frame, which was fabricated in Newton Aycliffe and transported to the site in Sussex. SCH managing director Gary Finley said: "We ended up spending three days on site, but only because we were delayed

by the film crew. 75% of the building was erected on the first day, but then we were held up for nearly a full day waiting for the film crew to arrive. The Grand Designs project, was one of a number of interesting contracts SCH has been working on over the last year. "We've had a varied year with some interesting projects in different parts of the country," added Gary. The colourful portfolio of projects enabled SCH to record a £4.5m turnover earlier this year. Formed in 2006, SCH first operated as a crane hire company with four mobile cranes and four drivers working for local companies,

but it grew into steelwork and in 2011 recorded a turnover of £325,000. After moving into new premises in 2012, sales grew to £2.2m and then £3.43m before hitting £4.1m in 2013, £4.1m in 2014 and £4.5m this year, while staff numbers have also doubled to 40 in the last four years. As well as Sir Robert McAlpine and B&K, SCH also boast Wates Group (formerly Shepherd Construction), Robertson's North-East, Hall Construction, Peikko and Balfour Beatty among their client list. AYCLIFFE BREWERS INTRODUCE NEW BEERS

Newton Aycliffe's own craft brewery – The Steam Machine – is continuing to grow at an exciting rate. Despite the high demand, they are still finding time to innovate and experiment with a diverse range of ingredients. This month they are delighted to finally release two new beers: New Age Brown Ale 6.5% and Red IPA 6.5%.

Nick Smith, the brewery's co-founder said, "Those who drink our beers will know we take inspiration from anywhere, but with the New Age Brown it's a bit more personal. Excluding the obvious example from Newcastle, the North East has a rich tradition of strong brown ales – many of them were even stronger than ours! These beers are mostly lost to history now, and those that have survived have become far weaker as a result of rationing restrictions in both World Wars."

The new beers are the first that Steam Machine has added to its core range since they began trading in the summer of this year. "We are known for using a lot of New World hops, and the Brown will be no exception. The dark chocolate notes of British specialty malts contrast really well with the sharp tang of passion fruit from some of the best American hops. The Red IPA is also a mix of old and new – Indian Pale Ales have a legendary status in the beer world, and a history going back centuries. We've taken influence from the sweeter malt-rich IPAs of the American East Coast, but have used a traditional British yeast. Craft beer drinkers and retailers who have tried the

When asked what's next on the cards for Steam Machine, Nick said: "For December we'll have our winter special – a rich stout brewed with black molasses. It's our strongest beer yet at 10%... it's definitely one for

Aycliffe Business Park's Annual Awards Dinner

The Managing Director of Ebac, one of the region's leading manufacturing companies says there is a "real sense of growth" on Aycliffe Business Park following a number of exciting developments recently. Pamela Petty's firm Ebac, which is bringing washing machine manufacturing back to the UK, says there's a positive mood around.



She wants to see Aycliffe businesses shout about their success at this year's 'Make Your Mark' event – a black-tie awards ceremony in November.

"We're a middle-sized business and we're big and ugly enough to look after ourselves, almost wherever we're based. "SHOULD OUR MP RESIGN?"

Dear Sir,
Our Labour MP, Phil Wilson has published his survey of local businesses on their attitude to the European Union and concludes that 86% favour continued membership while 75% of those wanted change. Given that most people I talk to have a preferred change that they consider to be a RED LINE, and that at a recent visit to the European Parliament the Germans and the French both said that further Political and Fiscal integration was their Red Line [the French President going as far as to say that members who did not want more Political and Fiscal union should leave the EU] it is unlikely that any local or national businesses would agree to a change that meant increased integration to support the failing Euro. I wonder if Mr Wilson asked the respondents if they

thought Britain should join the failing Euro? If he had I bet there would have been a 99% NO response.

What was evident from the speeches at the European Parliament was that the German Chancellor and the French President had decided on more Political and Fiscal union and that the rest had better support them! However, a new Euro-Sceptic government has been elected in Poland and other states have closed their borders to illegal migrants despite the Germans having declared a Europe wide open border policy. There may soon be no European Union for us to leave. Its undemocratic actions and institutions are being seen for what they are. The EU as it stands is undemocratic, the immigration policy has been decided (and has been thrown into turmoil) by the Germans ALONE. It was the Germans who negotiated the Euro bail out for Greece, this, despite the Greeks having signed up to cancelling similar German debts in 1953. As one Greek said recently, the Germans should not be lending Greece money, they should be paying Greece War Reparations!

As far as the in/out referendum goes, we know that the Establishment Parties want to scare us into staying in by threatening the OUT supporters with unemployment etc. This is what the Establishment did during the Scottish Independence Referendum. However, the Tories, Labour and Lib-Dems all shed crocodile tears about the demise of our steel industry and blame steel dumping by China when the true cause is the lack of a level playing field in Europe due to green taxes and European countries 'illegally' protecting their own

steel industry. Only when we are out of the European Union can we decide for ourselves how we protect our industries and jobs.

The fact is that all the political parties (except only UKIP) are scared to pull out of the European Union. They will have nobody to blame when their policies fail. They are scared to govern an Independent Great Britain; better to give Taxpayers money to the unelected European Commission (which is more corrupt than FIFA allegedly is, and cannot get any auditor to pass its annual

accounts). At least Mr Wilson has nailed his colours to the STAY IN mast [at least for the near future]. This could change under the new Labour Party leadership, indeed if he comes down on the wrong side he could risk de-selection! How undemocratic is the situation he is now in? Those who voted for him on Labour General Election Manifesto now have a right to know if he, like Jeremy Corbyn, has torn up that Manifesto. What does he now stand for? Should he not now resign?



Earlier this year, County Councillors John D Clare, Joan Gray and Mike Dixon did a walkabout on the King's Drive estate. On the estate are nine areas of red tarmac (see map), formerly play areas, now derelict, which we felt were looking tired. Three of the areas (2, 3 and 8 on the map) belong to Livin, and we are delighted to tell you that we have contacted Livin,

who are considering how they might improve their areas. Of the six areas owned by Durham County Council, there is one very large area (plot 6 on the map) which we will have to leave until another time. However, we are currently consulting with residents on our proposals:

- (a) to replace the red tarmac/gravel with grass (in areas 1, 4, 5 and 7).
 - (b) to put in a dropped-kerb to make one area (9) accessible as an overspill parking area.
- This is a fairly large scheme, which will cost £22,000 out of our Neighbourhood Improvement budgets. We believe that the work will significantly improve the aspect of the King's Drive estate. We hope that the changes will support the efforts of those who wish to make the estate an attractive area of which residents can be proud. DEVOLUTION AGREEMENT FOR THE NORTH EAST

A devolution agreement that will transform the North East economy and bring new opportunities for businesses and residents will be agreed today (Friday 23 October).

Members of the North East Combined Authority and the Government will sign the agreement to devolve significant powers, funding and responsibilities to the region.

The move will represent a major change to the way in which decisions will be made in the future about transport, investment, funding, skills training, business support, housing and strategic planning.

The North East Combined Authority and a new elected mayor – to be elected for the first time in 2017 – will take control of the new devolved powers.

CLlr Simon Henig, chair of the North East Combined Authority, said: "This is an important day for the North East. The agreement being signed today will bring significant economic benefits and opportunities for businesses and residents.

"Those living, working and doing business here in our region represent our greatest asset – and through this agreement we will invest in the people of the North East and support business to grow and thrive.

"We want to enable people to get the skills and training needed to get jobs, we want to create reliable and efficient transport networks to provide access to those jobs and we want to ensure people have good quality homes in areas they want to live in.

"We will also invest in and work with the business sector to ensure we understand and meet business needs.

"And we will work to support competition on an international stage and attract new business and investment into our region to enable our economy to grow.

"This agreement marks the start of a new way of working in the North East which should not only benefit our regional economy but that of the whole country."

The agreement will see:

- Up to £1.5bn pumped into a new North East Investment Fund. This will be targeted towards boosting economic growth and supporting the region to compete in international markets. It will include an initial funding allocation of £30m a year over 30 years.

- The creation of an Employment and Skills Board to manage an overhaul of post-16 skills training and employment support in order to get more people into work, increase productivity, improve the life chances of young people and address the skill shortages experienced by North East employers.

- From 2017, a new devolved approach to business support, which will simplify and strengthen the support available for business growth, innovation and global trade in the North East in order to deliver the ambition set out in the North East Strategic Economic Plan to create 100,000 jobs.

- The establishment, in partnership with the NHS, of a Commission for Health and Social Care Integration. This will look at the potential for further integration of health services – including acute and primary care, community services, mental health services, social care and public health – in order to strengthen services, improve outcomes and reduce health inequalities.

- An ambitious target to increase the number of new homes in the region. This will include the creation of a North East Land Board to identify potentially suitable locations for housing or economic development and the devolution of some statutory planning powers.

- Devolved responsibility for the region's transport budget along with responsibility for transport delivery, including infrastructure improvements and the development of smart ticketing across public transport networks in the area.

The agreement is a first step in a progressive process of devolution, which paves the way for opportunities for further devolved powers and responsibilities to the North East.

Final agreement remains subject to the Government's spending review and the legislative process and is also conditional upon further public consultation and the agreement of the seven local councils which make up the combined authority.

Chancellor George Osborne said: "This announcement shows that our revolutionary plans for devolution are gathering an unstoppable momentum.

"The civic leaders of the North East have worked incredibly hard to reach this point and as a result today we are signing this historic agreement which will give the area significant new powers and investment.

"Once again the Northern Powerhouse is leading the way in our ambition to take power out of London and give it to the people who know their areas best."

Northern Powerhouse Minister James Wharton said: "Our long-term economic plan seeks to rebalance growth and build a Northern Powerhouse. By ending the 'one size fits all' approach of the past, we are giving local people the powers they need to boost jobs and skills.

"Today's deal means the North East is leading the way, with significant new powers and nearly £1billion of Government investment over the next three decades.

"This will enable the region to compete nationally and on the international stage. I look forward to seeing how a future Mayor and combined authority work with the business community to make their ambitions a reality."

On behalf of all of the NHS Clinical Commissioning Groups in the region, the North East and Cumbria CCG Forum welcomed the opportunity to explore improving health outcomes of patients and reducing health inequalities by considering greater integration, deeper collaboration and devolution across the North East Combined Authority area.

Dr David Hambleton, chair of the NECCCG Forum said: "Linking with the broader plans for devolution of power to the North East Combined Authority area, we are keen to explore how the NHS can play its part in shaping our future locally"

WOODHAM STUDENTS REACH FOR THE STARS



Have you ever caught yourself gazing at the stars or wondering what goes on amongst the planets in space? You're not the only one, as astronomy has become a hot topic more recently surrounding the discovery of yet more planets and planned trips to space becoming a reality.

One school recognising the interest in astrophysics is Woodham Academy which is introducing the option to study Astronomy as part of its More Able Academy.

The school has identified that an increasing number of students are focussing their attention on science and will now offer its students the chance to study the topic alongside their other GCSEs.



National Planning Policy Framework & County Plan

Dear Sir
Readers will by now have received the latest consultation questionnaire on the Great Aycliffe Neighbourhood Plan (GANP). I am one of the very few volunteer residents who have participated in the 'thematic group' meetings taking feedback from the initial questionnaires to the present stage.

The process has taken an inordinate amount of Council officer, councillor and public time, and has no doubt cost the taxpayer a lot of money. Although I have been impressed with the quality and commitment of the people involved, and I think there is some value in the GANP, it has become abundantly clear that by far the more important documents for the town are the National Planning Policy Framework and County Plan.

As is stated in the current questionnaire, a lot of points raised in the initial round could not be taken forward, because the GANP must comply with these other documents. Possibly the most significant point of all is that there were a lot of comments made (despite the fact that this question wasn't even asked!) to indicate that residents do not want the town to have a lot more urban sprawl, but this is not within the remit of the GANP. In fact, there is not much that seems to be within the remit of the GANP!

It is also interesting to notice that, in response to the question 'Are there areas of land suitable for housing?', only 5 respondents mention

Copelaw, and the same number said Aycliffe Village, but we have responded by proposing to protect only Aycliffe Village from urban sprawl! However, I understand Copelaw is already earmarked for housing, whether the public likes it or not. By comparison, the Southern Club was the most popular, with 37 respondents, then Horndale Club with 22 and Elmfield School with 19. Interestingly, 19 respondents said 'none'! Copelaw ranked joint 16th! What does this tell us about the County Council's disregard for, or unawareness of, the wishes of the public?

As for the County Plan, readers may recall that the draft version, which took years to develop and cost the taxpayers a fortune, was ripped to pieces by the independent inspector, Harold Stephens, much to the displeasure of the County Council, who were adamant that they were right and he was wrong. They then instigated a judicial review (presumably at significant cost to the taxpayer) and were euphoric when this resulted essentially in a re-inspection, on the assumption the re-inspection will reach different conclusions.

Mr Stephens' report is heavy reading, but in the key point of his summary he wrote that the 'assessment of housing need' was 'too high', because of 'unrealistic assumptions about jobs growth and associated in-migration', as well as, essentially, over-optimistic calculation methods. He goes on to thoroughly and logically explain his reasons.

Mr Stephens does support

'proportionally more of the development' in larger towns such as Durham City, Bishop Auckland and Newton Aycliffe, which seems fair enough, but he also favours re-development of run down areas such as various pit villages, rather than building on green sites.

Mr Stephens refers to concerns that 'DCC has constructed an elaborate and costly consultation exercise with little evidence of willingness to respond positively to contrary views or to simplify the process to encourage genuine public engagement'.

I sympathise with those views. It seems that much more genuine effort has been made to involve the public in the GANP than with the infinitely more important and influential County Plan, and that is disappointing.

It is also disappointing that the County Council seems unable to respond appropriately to constructive criticism.







The Council, on 22/10/15 made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, to close to all vehicular traffic a 370m length of Durham Way South that extends northwards from its junction with the roundabout at Heighington Lane to and including its junctions with Cumbie Way and Welbury Way, Aycliffe Industrial Estate, Newton Aycliffe. Access to businesses will be maintained during the works. The closure is necessary to enable carriageway resurfacing works to be undertaken. The maximum duration of the temporary closure under the Order is 18 months and is required from 7.00am on 04/11/15 for 7 days. However, on rare occasions, alternative dates for closures may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly. **Alternative route:** from the northern side of the closure from Durham Way, westerly along Whitworth Avenue, southerly along Whinbank Road and Spring Road and easterly along Heighington Lane to the southern side of the closure, and vice versa.

Town Council Supports Tree Felling Notification

Dear Sir,
With regard to the article concerning trees being removed from the former police station site, I would advise that that site comes under the jurisdiction of the Police Commissioner. From The Town Council side I can assure residents that Great Aycliffe Town Council has a comprehensive Tree Management Policy in place which includes the requirement to publicise in advance in Newton News any intended work on Trees under the Town

Council's control on land that we own. Indeed only last week at our last Environment Committee meeting officers presented a list of works intended to take place (not all immediately but in stages) this was reported to Members and this list will be copied to every Council member as well as published in Newton News so that any tree works do not come as a sudden surprise to members of the public. The only exception being where the condition of trees presents

a real and present danger to the public, in which case Officers of the Council will act first and report second. Details of this are available on the Council's website and its reports, or contact the Council on 300700. I know from personal experience in the past, on the Council, how much of a shock it is to see apparently healthy trees suddenly chopped down with a big empty void left in its place it makes you angry. Hence we have what we hope is a clearly defined policy including replacement of trees actually removed where it is practicable to do so.

We did on the Town Council agree also, to ask the County Council to copy our policy of giving advance notice on tree works in the local press but that is for the County Council to decide on we cannot make them.
