Former RAF Sgt. Receives French Legion of Honour

John Twigger (92 years) of Alnwick Grove, Woodham has been awarded the rank of Chevalier in the Legion of Honour, from the President of France, in recognition of John's part in the liberation of France during the Second World War.

John, a Sergeant in the RAF Police, was in the Normandy Landings in June 1944, aged 21. He rode a motorcycle, but one day the Ambulance Driver took ill and John was asked to take his place, but could not drive. He was given a few turns around the field with an instructor and then told to get on with the job taking wounded men to hospital.

It was during this period he met his future wife Connie who was a telephone operator in Brussels. They had a wartime romance which turned into 65 years of marriage.

He is very proud of his late wife and loves to show a letter she received from Field Marshal Montgomery, Commander of D-Day and Battle of Normandy, thanking her for her service. John was born in Sutton Coldfield and started his working life as a grocery delivery bov before becoming a salesman. He started his own business as the first person to import from Finland, Saunas holding the UK franchise for Ranta Salmi.

Among his clients were celebrities. and including Shirley Bassey and the Rothschild family

John worked until his 80th Birthday and eventually settled in Newton Aycliffe near his son's family. He is still very active and enjoys socialising with former

OUR M.P. ENCOURAGES COMMUNITY NETWORKING



Over 60 people, groups and elected members turned up to a charity and community networking event organised by Phil Wilson MP for Sedgefield, at St Aidan's Church Hall Trimdon last Saturday.

Phil is a big champion charity, voluntary community sector and but has been concerned about how austerity and funding cuts is impacting the many organisations in his constituency. His office conducted a piece of research about the sector.

The report was launched at the event and including findings such as 75% of groups were finding it harder to get funds now than before, that 81% knew where to get funding but 69% needed support in getting those funds. The report also highlighted a mismatch between the needs within communities both reported and statistically and the core activities of some of the charities and groups. It suggested that groups should look at more targeted work and develop better joint working and collaborations.

"The feedback from the event has been excellent" says Phil.

"We wanted to bring the charities and the community together. to offer them can. practical support and we also make some recommendations for how the groups might develop in the future. I think we achieved all of this and more. Many people said they would like to continue to meet so we will look at how this might be possible. I am also looking into possibly

their own areas."
Lindsay Johnston Bishop Middleham Hall, said of the event "There was a really encouraging attendance, and possibly the start of community groups combining efforts and sharing knowledge and experience. The atmosphere was good and there was a tangible feeling of all the organisations and the community groups wanting to work together, that we're



Aycliffe Company Continues First Apprentice Came its Expansion Drive

Aycliffe-based Warehousing and Distribution has invested relocating heavily in pallet distribution operation within its main site on Aycliffe Business Park. It has also taken on four new forklift drivers and three office employees as part of a restructuring which has enabled it to cope with an increase in demand.

Its overnight Palletline operation involves Stiller handling more than 1,600 pallets every day, carrying goods ranging from food stuffs and packing building cookware, cladding and sho trollies. Palletline shopping had previously been run at a leased site a mile away.

After the family-run firm moved its pallet storage facility into its new warehouse - it created room to relocate its Palletline operation. More than £1.1m has been invested in the new warehouse and relocation of its pallet distribution operation, enabling Stiller to consolidate its two main operations into its head office site which has increased efficiency and improved communication. "It has given us more room to grow and meet demand." said the firm's Commercial Manager Matthew Stiller. "Goods come off overnight, between 2am and 6am, national trunking vehicles which can take up

to 52 pallets, and they're off-loaded, sorted in the early hours of the morning when everyone is tucked up in bed, and loaded onto smaller urban delivery vehicles which can take between six and 26 pallets. Between 3pm and 6pm they bring customer's goods back, to be sorted again onto trunking vehicles and sent out to destinations across the UK overnight." Stiller has appointed three new office staff, including distribution co-ordinator Stones, Darlington, and 23-year-old distribution clerk Josh McCartin, from Newton Aycliffe.

Former business admin apprentice Ryan Bailey, who has been with Stiller for more than three years, has been promoted from transport operator to shift supervisor.

It used to take about 35 to 40 minutes for the trucks

to come in and off-load. and drivers would often get stuck in a queue, but now Stillers have a one door in, one door out operation which has halved the amount of time it takes for drivers to get in and offload.

Stiller's latest outlay takes overall investment in the last two years to £5.6m after the firm purchased a fleet of 12 new vehicles 2014, including two two 12-tonne vehicles, urban trailers and four long double-deck trailers, and brought in five new Iveco trucks earlier this year accommodate a £5m-a-year distribution and storage deal with worldwide food packaging firm Coveris Rigid.

The Aycliffe Business Park manufacturer, which employs 55 staff and turns over £3.5m, is predominantly engaged in the automotive sector as a second tier supplier to leading manufacturers. Products it makes include dashboard makes include dashboard components and engine compartment housings for the Nissan Qashqai and Juke. The Government has set a

target of creating three million new apprenticeships by 2020 in a bid to boost skills and end youth unemployment.

In September the engineering training provider, a subsidiary of Bishop Auckland College which employs 27 staff and which elihoys 27 star and has over 350 trainees, also welcomed new apprentices from Hitachi, Cummins, Glaxo, 3M, and Cleveland Bridge. All are on engineering/ manufacturing programmes with bespoke elements required by their employer,

hydraulics, including pneumatics, fabrication and welding. Simon, 22, from Newton

Aycliffe, whose new role will include machine setting, robotics and the automation of the manufacturing process. will qualify with an Advanced Apprenticeship in Engineering Manufacture after three-anda-half years. He said: "As soon as I saw the

I've been at Formula Plastics for almost two years now - it's a fantastic company to work for and this was the perfect opportunity to grow and gain experience in the business. My goal is to become an important member of the team and secure a good future. I am extremely grateful for the opportunity to prove myself; I look forward to seeing where I can go."





Heighington Matters How to Spot & Stop Scams

Durham are being warned to be on their guard against scams.

Durham County Council's trading standards team is supporting a national campaign aimed at helping residents to spot potential scams and avoid falling victim to them.

New national figures show that more than 22,000 reports of scams were made to the Citizens' Advice Consumer Helpline in the last 12 months.

But the figures don't reflect the many more people who may have fallen victim to a scam and failed to report it. To help people in County Durham spot the warning signs, leaflets are being made available in libraries, customer access points Citizens Advice Bureaux and housing association offices with advice and information on common scams.

Joanne Waller, head of environment, health and consumer protection at Durham County Council, said: "People are seeing their money go down the drain as con artists rip them off by promising lottery wins, work on their home or a new job, only to find there is nothing at the end.

"We are warning people to be on the look out for rogues looking to make a quick buck at their expense and reminding them that scams are crimes so it is vital that they are reported."

Through the national campaign, consumers are being reminded that scams come in all shapes and sizes. including adverts, people knocking that the door, emails, letters, phone calls, texts and over the internet.

People are being warned to look out for key signs that something is a scam, such as being contacted out of the blue, being asked for money up front or being asked to keep things secret from family and friends.

People can get advice or report suspected scams by contacting the Citizens' Advice Consumer Helpline WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE BEEN SCAMMED

- Report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 to help stop it happening to others.
- Often you can't always get your money back if you've been scammed, especially if you've handed over cash.
- If you've paid for goods or services by credit card you have more protection and if you used a debit card you may be able to ask your bank for a chargeback.
- Get advice and report it to Trading Standards through the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 08454 04 05 06 or online advice at www.adviceguide.org.uk SIGNS OF A SCAM
- The call, letter, e-mail or text has come out of the blue. · You've never heard of the lottery or competition they are talking about.
- You didn't buy a ticket so can't win.
- They are asking you to send money in advance.
- They are saying you have to respond quickly, so you don't get time to think about it or ask family and friends before you decide.
- They are telling you to keep it a secret.
- They seem to be offering you something for nothing.
- · If it seems too good to be true – it probably is. PROTECT TO YOURSELF BETTER

- Never give financial information or details of vour identity, bank accounts or credit card to strangers or to the businesses that should already hold your details.

- Just say: "No Thank You." · Resist pressure to make a decision straight away.
- Never send money to someone you don't know.

Lotteries — A phone call, text or email proclaims a huge lottery win - even though the receiver hasn't bought a ticket. In order collect winnings you are asked to send money to cover "processing" or "administration" costs.

Phishing — an email (or Vishing for phone calls) pretending to be from your bank asking for you to update, validate or confirm details so that scammers can access your account.

SMShing - mobile phone text messages lure vou onto fraudulent websites or invite you to call a premium rate mobile number or download malicious content via the phone or web.

Electricity meter credit people on pre-payment meters are offered cut-price electricity but end up paying for their energy twice. Criminals use cloned keys to top up energy credit illegally. You end up paying for the energy twice - first to the fraudsters and then to the company at the correct rate. Pyramid selling — This is an illegal trick where you are told you can earn money by recruiting new members to a money-making venture. In reality only a tiny minority make money, everyone else

New Consumer Rights W.I. in Celebratory Mood

are being made aware of new laws protecting them when buying goods, including digital content, as part of a national campaign.
The Consumer Rights Act

2015 gives shoppers more protection and makes it clearer and easier for them to understand their rights and buy with confidence.

act includes legislation which, for the first time, gives people the right to have faulty digital content, such as online films and games, music downloads and e-books, repaired or replaced. Durham County Council is raising awareness of the new rights as part of this year's National Consumer Week, which took place 2nd - 6th November. As is often the case Newton News received this information too late for it





Running Club News Town Karate Instructor Back from Training in Japan

As some may recall I recently wrote of an upcoming trip of a life time for a Karate practitioner. My journey to Japan and Okinawa is now engrained in my memory as one of the most fantastic experiences of my life.

The trip was arranged by Scott Langley Sensei, Head of the W.T.K.O (World Traditional Karate Organisation for Great Britain and Ireland), with 11 travelling to Tokyo and Okinawa to train with some of the world's best Karate Instructors. We started at Hakone near Mount Fuji where we took in the sites and recovered from jet lag. We stayed in a Ryokan (Inn), with its paper partitioning, tatami floors and futon beds

We immersed ourselves into the culture, eating local foods and wearing yu-kata (Japanese dressing gowns with slippers). Bathing was also a different experience, with a ritual to follow within a communal bath house, then soaking in a large and very hot bath with natural volcanic spring water. The experience was very similar to a Sauna, being both a relaxing and social event.

We visited Mount Fuji, but due to Volcanic activity, could not get as close as we

wished although it was still an impressive site. We travelled back to Tokyo, again staying in a Ryokan. We trained at Keio University, which has major historical significance in the karate world as being one of the first places that Master Funakoshi, the founder of Shotokan Karate, started teaching in Japan when he left from Okinawa.

We were welcomed by Ota Sensei, who instructed the students at the university and who was our main contact there. Ota Sensei led some of our training and introduced us to many other instructors. Our 5 days in Tokyo was over. Next was Okinawa. This was a contrast to the hustle and $bustle\ of\ modern\ Tokyo.$

Although most of the old buildings had been destroyed during the Second World War, the feel of the place was much more relaxed. Naha, where we stayed has a touristy feel, similar to Blackpool and a little bit cheesy (In a good way). The restaurants we visited we second to none and we experienced many different ways of cooking including Teppanyaki, where the food was cooked in front of you on giant hot plates by very skilled chefs, who not only cooked the food, but entertained you with their juggling skills, plus Shabu Shabu where we boiled the meats in different broths before eating, Takiniki where we barbecued marinated meats on a grill in the middle of the

table. Kanpai was the Japanese equivalent of Cheers, which we used to toast our fellow Karateka and Instructors at these social events.

Our training at Okinawa was at Senaha Sensei's private Dojo, which being a carpenter he constructed himself. He was a Goju Ryu 9th Dan Karate Master and instructed us in his traditional teaching methods. We spent two days learning breathing methods, Goju Ryu fighting drills and Kata (Selfdefence techniques put into a series of movements).

The training was over too soon, but we celebrated with a few cups of Senaha's Sensei's special homemade rice wine (Which would have blown my socks of if we were wearing them). We left Okinawa the next day and returned home, battered, exhausted, but buzzing. I cannot express enough my appreciation to our hosts in both Japan and Okinawa for their welcome and inviting us into their

dojo's.
