

From Stone Age to Iron Age

Reported by Year 3 pupils from St. Mary's RC Primary School



On Thursday, 12th November Y3 pupils from St. Mary's were lucky to have a whole day to explore different areas of life from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. This was organised by Durham University Teacher Kirsty.

Our day started with an Introductory PowerPoint Introductory PowerPoint taking us through the different parts of the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. We learnt how life changed and improved as we moved through these stages. The next part of the morning gave us an opportunity to be archaeologists; we worked in pairs and were given different objects to examine. We had to sketch them, measure them and then try to guess what they could be used for.

particular animals.

average, Durham's economy is the third poorest region in the UK. A report by Lord Adonis in April 2013 identified three key

3. poor connectivity, not just of transport, but

of planning and policies.

Adonis recommended that the seven local councils should cooperate to coordinate their growth, skills and transport policies, and the 'North-East Combined Authority' (NECA) was duly set up in April 2014 to do so.

TOWARDS DEVOLUTION
At this point, NECA got bound up with e government's policy of 'devolution'. November 2014, council leaders in the Manchester area signed a devolution deal with the government. Other negotiations followed – there are currently 38 in the pipeline - and NECA came under great

Pressure to agree a similar deal.

The Devolution Deal will not be like the one proposed in 2004, with an expensive Assembly of elected representatives. Instead, under the Devolution Deal now proposed, an elected Mayor – with a Cabinet of the seven NECA Council Leaders – will be given some of the powers, functions and funding hitherto administered by government civil servants in London. Meanwhile, Durham County Council (DCC) will still deliver the day-to-

day services it currently provides. On 23 October, DCC agreed to take this Devolution Proposal forward, but insisted on a preamble which made it clear that final

public consultation". Soon after, the Council announced that – in County Durham – this would involve a poll of all electors early in the New Year. Although legally this poll cannot be advertised as 'binding', devolution is a major change to local government and we won't sign up until you've had your say; no other Authority has given residents such

A TERRIFYING DECISION

It is vital now that people learn about the Devolution Proposal, so that they know what they are voting about, because a wrong decision may ruin us.

I acknowledge the fears of some that signing

up could turn us into an ignored hinterland of Tyneside, getting nothing but the blame for

rynestic, getting nothing but the blane for inadequately-funded devolved services. Equally, however, people need to realise that there is no going back. If we do not join the Devolved Authority with the other six councils, we will spend the forseeable future administratively and economically isolated, and actually in competition against them and actually in competition against them.

Either we go IN and battle our corner against interests sometimes contrary to ours, or we stay OUT and watch the North-East move forward without us. NEXT STEPS

So what is this 'Devolution Agreement' that we are expected to understand and vote upon? Next week I will review the proposals for Business



Consultation on Police Funding Formula

Dear Sir.

I am conscious that today is the deadline for responding to the above consultation. As you will be aware my office previously submitted two responses in respect of the consultation. The first response set out my overall views regarding to proposed changes to the funding formula and my second response specifically focussed on the alcohol element of the proposed model. A common theme in both of my responses was the quality of the underpinning data which is palpably important given the resulting financial impact that it can have at individual

It has come to my attention within the last hour from colleagues in Devon Cornwall Police and Crime

Commissioner Office that an error has been identified in the explifications that have been provided to Forces. This error, as I understand it. relates to urban adversity and stems from the use of wrong data. Given that this element of the funding formula accounts for 31% of the total funding allocated, it is clearly a significant issue at both a national level and local level. The net effect of this error, based on information received from Devon and Cornwall, is a loss of £12.7m per year for Durham once the funding formula has been introduced Given that Durham receives approximately £80m in grant funding I am sure that you will agree that this represents a huge sum of money to take out of my budget which is of course in addition to expected reductions within the forthcoming comprehensive spending review. As the democratically elected representative. I am fully committed to ensuring the highest possible levels of service delivery but feel that this is being completely undermined by such large swings in funding. I have to admit to being at a complete and utter loss as to how an error of this magnitude could

this to the public. Given the impact of the funding formula on Durham, not to mention other Forces, I would advise that the current process be abandoned. I feel that this is a fair and proportionate proposal given the problems that have beset this whole consultation exercise. I would also propose that we take this opportunity to consider how best to proceed in future with identifying a new funding model as the current process appears now to have lost all credibility.
