## Council Committed to 'Gobsmacked' by Brain Tumour **Research Campaign Success**

Anna Swabey is a bright and bubbly 24-year-old with long, blonde hair that frequently falls in front of her face and masks a disarming smile and delightful laugh that reminds me of Peter Ustinov's quote about laughter being 'the most civilized music in the world'. She's an intelligent young woman with a coveted class honours degree in modern languages and European studies and who, say those in the know, was clearly destined to be a smash hit in whatever world she chose for a career. But the bouncy blonde hair, smiles and laughter that pepper our interview hide a terrible secret. Anna is dying . .

In January this year, at the age of 23, she collapsed at home and was subsequently diagnosed with a particularly aggressive grade 3 glioma anaplastic astrocytoma. Put simply, that's a brain tumour. It was said to be inoperable

and Anna was given as little as three months to live. The best possible prognosis, she was told, was that she might still be alive in three years'

sports-mad Anna, a self-confessed rugby addict, it was, not surprisingly, a shattering blow. Just a few days later, however, she travelled to London to see a consultant neurosurgeon who confirmed the diagnosis but, to everyone's surprise and Anna's great delight, offered to remove at least part of the tumour.

Anna admits that she immediately felt inspired to turn her hitherto negative experiences into positive action and to do all she could to support others with the same condition, to raise awareness of brain tumours and the reality of living with a terminal illness, and to raise as much cash as she could for brain tumour research.

Anna, from Newton Aycliffe in Durham, began to write a blog on social media. She called it 'Inside my Head' – and it took off. To date, her personal thoughts and feelings have attracted over 85,000 viewings. "I just wanted others in my position to know they were not alone," she says.

Anna also determined to raise awareness of brain tumours themselves. "They kill more people under the age of 40 than any other cancer but get only 1 per cent of the national cancer research funding budget – and that has got to change," she argues. "Any breakthrough in the near future would be too late for me but it could well benefit others in my situation.'

Not content with simply spreading the word, Anna also launched a non-stop fund-raising campaign for brain tumour research. As well as a Just Giving page on her blog, Anna and a host of friends organized, among other things, a charity ball, raffles, cake sales, sky-dives and a netball tournament. The list she reels off seems endless.

In just eight months, their efforts have raised more than £36,500 for the Brain Tumour Research Campaign, the charity chaired by Anna's neurosurgeon. Anna admits she's 'gobsmacked' but insists that even more cash is still needed By any standard, it's a

remarkable achievement especially as the past year has seen Anna undergo two major brain operations and a gruelling seven weeks of radiotherapy and chemotherapy. She is still working her way through a 12-month cycle of intensive chemotherapy but insists that she does not suffer any major day-to-day side effects.

I find it hard to believe,

especially when Anna suddenly decides to remove her long blonde wig to reveal a short crop of jet black hair, and a long, jagged scar on one side of her skull.

Whatever the truth, Anna didn't think twice about taking her bid to win a better deal for brain cancer research the powers-that-be in

London and in November, she was invited to meet the government's newly-formed Petitions Committee to air

"I miss my life that wasn't dictated by my illness but I try to hold in my tears because I know they are not going to get me anywhere. I'm more concerned about the people I shall leave behind. At the moment, I just concentrate on remaining strong and healthy," she says.

Anna will need all that health and strength next April. She's signed up to run in the 26.2 mile Paris marathon alongside18 friends. supporters family members. When she's not training for that epic run, she's out and about seeking sponsorship for running kit and out-of-pocket expenses.

December saw another major development in Anna's life. Boyfriend Andrew Bell asked Anna to marry him and she immediately said 'yes'. Wedding bells will be ringing for the couple at a venue in

North East England next October.

As I prepare to leave after the interview. I ask Anna if she has any message for her supporters. "Yes," she says. 'Tell them I'm not going to give in without a fight. . . I'm not going to roll over. . . Tell them there's so much more I have to do.

## **DLI Closure Confusion**

Dear Syd

I would like to take the opportunity to respond to Mr Alistair P G Welsh's and Mr Paul Redhead's letters in on the subject of the closure of the DLI museum.

My grandfather served in the DLI during WW1. He died at home shortly after the end of WW1 as a result of mustard gas poisoning in the trenches. My great uncle served in the DLI and lies in a Commonwealth war grave in Ypres, Belgium. My father and two uncles also served in the DLI. My father was gravely wounded in Normandy during WW2. but thankfully survived. He went on the serve as a Sergeant in 6DLI until the mid-1960s. He carried the burden of his wounds until the day he died. Both my brother and I followed in the family tradition and served in the Light Infantry. I served for 17 years, from 1977 to 1994. One thing I can assure the people of Aycliffe, and the wider County Durham, is that I do not hold any ex-Servicemen/ women in contempt, especially those who may have served in the County Regiment.

Since the start of the Tory administration in 2000, Durham County Council (DCC) has seen savage year on year cuts in funding from central Government. By 2020 these cuts will have reached £290,000,000. DCC has had to make huge savings, reducing headcount and trimming back on services. Unfortunately, all budgets have been under ongoing review, including funding for the County's museums; Beamish, Killhope, Bowes, and the

DLI.
At the December meeting of DCC, I did not vote for 'not to having a debate on the matter' of the closure of the DLI museum. I would like to explain that the constitution of the Council allows 30 minutes to discuss any notices of motion put forward by Councillors. On the day in question there were three notices of motion

on the agenda. The third of these was in relation to the DLI museum. The first of these notices of motion was to lobby the Government on their imposition of restrictions of unions and union members, a matter of national importance. A proposition was made on the floor of the Council to the floor of the Council to suspend standing orders to allow longer time for debate. I voted against this proposition. In doing so, I was mindful that a public Overview and Scrutiny Board meeting was subsidied the following day scheduled the following day to discuss the future of the DLI museum and the DLI collection. Any member of the public and/or press can ask questions of the Council

at such public meetings. I attended the scrutiny meeting the following day and asked a number of searching questions. During the meeting, a number of things became apparent:

- In recent years the DLI collection has outgrown its home and storage space is critically restricted.
- Visitor numbers are reducing. Although many people have visited the DLI museum, not that many have been more than once.
- Colonel Ramsbotham, Chair of the Trustees of the DLI collection, and Army Museums Ogilby Trust, welcome the propositions that have been put forward the future of the collection and this is seen as

an opportunity to revitalise and be fit for the future. The plans include a display area în the Palace Green Library and interactive, living displays in venues such as the Gala Theatre, where a much wider story can be told.

- A larger storage base has been found at the former Rothmans site in Spennymoor.
  • There is no intention to
- split the collection up.

   Whilst the existing building will close, a new chapter in the history and story of the Regiment will

begin.
• Communication on the subject of the DLI museum has been poor. Press releases on the subject have been edited, and in some cases, totally ignored. Sadly, this has fuelled contempt and criticism in some quarters.

At the scrutiny meeting, a suggestion was made to create a lasting memorial on the Aykley Heads site. I have expressed an interest in being involved in any such project. Personally, I believe a memorial wall, similar to those at the National Arboretum, would be a very fitting tribute, bearing the names of the fallen of the **Durham Light Infantry and** antecedent Regiments, the Light Infantry and the Rifles, since the end of WW2. ### NEW PLAN FOR ADULT DAY CARE WORK EXPERIENCE Broadband

adult day services are to be put before councillors. Members of Durham County Council's Cabinet will be asked to agree a reorganisation of services that would result in the closure of 12 centres by September 2016.

The proposals reflect significant changes to the way in which people choose day services, which has led to drop in demand for traditional councilrun centres, as well as the need 2016/17.

Five centres from across the county would be retained in order to continue to offer specialist services to people with complex needs. Around 101 people would currently fall into this category.

The five centres which would be used to deliver specialist day services would be Durham Pathways, Pity Me; Spennymoor Pathways, Newton Aycliffe Pathways, Aycliffe Leisure Centre; Peterlee Pathways; and Stanley Pathways, Louisa Leisure

Centre.
The 12 day services which would close are in Consett, Chester-le-Street, Crook Bishop Auckland, Annfield Plain, Spennymoor, Barnard Castle; Peterlee and Stanhope. All people who use the existing centres, their carers and staff at the centres have been consulted on the proposals and their feedback is included in the report to Cabinet.

If the proposals are agreed those who use the 12 centres which will close would be supported in finding alternative provision to meet their needs in the independent and/or voluntary sector.

Many people, particularly younger adults, are already choosing these types of services. The growth in Direct Payments, which enables Payments, which enables people to choose individual solutions to their own care needs, has also resulted in lower demand for traditional councilrun centres.

Cllr Lucy Hovvels, Cabinet member for adult and health

Council, said: "It is importan for us to recognise that increasingly people want to take more control over their own services and choose those which best meet their individual needs.

"Many younger people in particular are already choosing services in the community and independent sector, although we appreciate that there is still a need for the council to provide specialist services for people with complex needs.
"We also understand that for

some people change can be very difficult and we have spent time consulting with people and their carers so that we can understand their views and help to find the right way forward for each individual.

We would continue to work with people and carers to help them understand their different options. We would look to organise taster sessions to help people make the right and, where necessary, would help to arrange gradual introductions to new services.' Cabinet will discuss the proposals when they meet on January 13th at 10am at County Hall.

As I type this it's the first week of January and it's back to business as usual (the mince-pies are already a distant memory!).

We're experiencing some pretty horrendous weather at the moment with all of this rainfall and from a Policing perspective we are seeing a number of road traffic collisions as a result. Please take extra care when driving, don't attempt to drive through long stretches of flood water (especially where there are warning signs advising against such action!), and keep your distances from the vehicle in front. Wet road surfaces do not make for ideal driving conditions and even worse for sudden braking manoeuvers.





#### Across the county the council funds a range of activities, groups and youth centres - but where that support goes has been based on historic agreements and not where it could have the most benefit.

Now, following a review of the service, proposals are being put forward that would see money and resources targeted towards helping more young people at risk of poor outcomes who need extra help.

Overall it is hoped they would lead to improved school attendance and grades, and fewer exclusions; fewer young people not in education, employment, or training (NEET); fewer referrals to children's services: and fewer teenage pregnancies.

Carole Payne, Durham County Council's head of children's services, said: "Across County Durham there are nearly 18,000 children living in areas that are among the most deprived in the country.

"Yet currently, despite prioritising and protecting youth services for as long as possible, the service is in regular contact with only 7 per cent of all young people and 9 per cent of those in the most deprived areas. "Other authorities in the

North East have cut their budgets for youth services, in some cases by over 70 per cent, while Durham has reduced its funding by less than one fifth.

"However, with continued budget pressures we face some difficult decisions and it is important that we ensure every penny we spend has the greatest benefit

"With this in mind a review of youth services has been carried out and a series of proposals have been drafted that would see a new approach introduced to identify and help the young people and families who would gain the most from our support. "No decisions have yet been made. The results of the review will be presented to the council's cabinet on January 13 and, subject to approval, the recommendations it contains would be put out for a full 12 week public consultation beginning in February.'

In County Durham there are 17,987 13 to 19-yearolds living in households in areas that are among the top 30 per cent most

deprived in the country.
There are also 7,670 children from homes whose income is at least 60 per cent below the national average.

Only 9 per cent of young people from the least well off areas have regular contact with the council's youth service.

It is believed that – despite council having to find £1m of savings from its £8.67m One Point budget - the service can have a bigger impact by redistributing funding across the service's 10 targeting and areas. services to young people who need them most.

The consultation is also looking at the funding given to more than 50 youth projects through the Youth Work Support Grant.

Currently groups receive grants ranging from £430 to £27,768, but again this is based on what each organisation historically received and not on where needs are greatest.

In 2015/16 the budget for the Youth Work Support

The council's Cabinet Grant is £194,684, but after meeting savings targets that will be reduced to £138,000. It is proposed to reassess where grants are made, and to transfer control of this funding to the council's Area Action Partnerships, which are better placed to identify local priorities.

As well as this, discussions are already underway the possibility of over transferring youth centres in Fishburn, Newton Aycliffe, Peterlee, Seaham, Spennymoor and Stanley to community ownership through the Durham ASK programme.

No decisions have yet been made, and subject to agreement, a public consultation on the plans would run from 1 February to 27 April 2016.

Warehousing & Distribution is marking the end of a strong financial year, with turnover up 23% to £13m with the family firm investing £125,000 in five new trailers. ### **Newtonian Could** be in 2016 Olympics

Scott Carpenter 27 of Sedgefield Water Polo Club based at Newton Aycliffe Leisure Centre, who started playing the game at 5 years old, has achieved much in his Water Polo career, totally transcending the amateur game in this country.

For the past 4 years he has been a professional player in Australia with the Victoria Tigers in Melbourne and has rave reviews for his play despite being injury hit over the last two years. He led the Tigers to the National League double in 2013 and became the first foreign player to do this as captain. He was targetted by

He was targetted by Australian water polo to be fast tracked through the citizenship process in just two years instead of the usual 4/5 years, so hopefully if injuries allow he is now available to play in the 2016 Rio Olympics.

Scott was picked to play against Japan in a 3 test series in November for Australia in Sydney but was forced to withdraw due to illness.

Fortunately still not fit he was picked to play against Olympic silver medallists Italy in December when he



debut for Australia with a 10-9 win and Scott managed 2 goals.

Scott still holds all the goal-scoring records in GB for Junior and Senior polo and played over 100 times for GB. Famously despite the coaches and players desperate for him to play in the Olympics in London in 2012 for GB he was ruled out because he had based himself in Australia instead of Europe by UK Sport. Scott was also a professional player in Barcelona for a year and has turned down offers from all of Europe's top leagues because of the lucrative offer from Australia.
