

## FORMER TOOL ROOM NOW A **MODERN EVENTS VENUE**

An old industrial tool room once part of a World War II munitions factory has been transformed into modern events venue. ROF 59 activity centre has spent more than £20.000 creating a new party room at its premises on Aycliffe Business Park.

The building was home to Presswork Metals which manufactured parts for the automotive industry until it closed in 2004. In the 1940s it was part of the Royal Ordnance Factory site producing bombs and bullets for the war effort. Owners of the new ROF 59

activities complex – which includes a trampoline park, climbing walls and restaurant - have completed the conversion of the old tool to a multi-functional venue for parties.

Vera Stobbs, nal 'Aycliffe Pensioner an original Angel' who worked at the munitions factory during the war, was one of the first to sample the new party room when she celebrated her granddaughter's 40th birthday there.



## **Report from** the Front Line

### APPEALS

Over the weekend there has been a couple of dwelling burglaries in Newton Aycliffe. At wound 7.40 pm on the evening of Saturday 6th February 2016 suspects have entered a house in Welbury Grove and moved items around in the hallway before leaving empty handed. It is possible that they have been disturbed by the presence of dogs in the premises. Between midnight that same evening and 11 am in Dudley Drive there has been what we in the business call a 'sneak in' where unknown persons have entered a house that was insecure and stolen property from within - namely a purse and wallet. The purse was subsequently found near to The Burn, in the Humphrey Close area.

It is fair to assume that these crimes are connected given the similarities in circumstances and the close timeframes between both. Newton Aycliffe Police are therefore appealing for anyone who may have information that could assist the progression of the investigations to come forward anonymously if preferred, and contact us via 101 or through private messaging to the Newton Aycliffe Police Facebook

page. The common denominator in both of these crimes is that doors were left unlocked providing the perfect means for opportunist thieves to ply their trade. Whether you are at home or not please keep your doors locked.

We have also seen a slight surge in the occurrence of vehicle crime in the town – particularly overnight between Tuesday 2nd February into Wednesday 3rd February 2016. At around 11.15 pm two males were disturbed tampering with the fuel cap of a black Ford Focus on Whitworth Avenue, Aycliffe Business Park.

They made off from the scene but left behind a silver Vauxhall Corsa that was found to have been stolen from the Langley Moor area in late January. This vehicle was displaying registration plates which had been stolen from another vehicle in Linden Place earlier on Tuesday evening. The vehicle has been recovered and forensic exploration continues. Likewise, any information pertaining to these crimes is sought and the Neighbourhood Policing Team will treat any received in the strictest of confidence – our reference for these incidents is SK1600352.

## LABOUR PROTECTING YOU FROM THE TORIES

Last week, Darlington Borough Council announced a desperate suite of cuts, including closing the Library and selling off the Covered Market. Next day, Mrs Bergg wrote in the Newton News, criticising Durham County Council for removing 29 streetlamps on the C35 road to Shildon.

We thank Mrs Bergg for her comments. DCC is consulting about the removal of lights along the C35, and residents are encouraged to respond. We have already received one wellargued objection, and have objections of our own to make. **VICTIMS OF TORY CUTS** 

DCC and DBC are victims of the same government cuts to local finance. The Tory/LibDem cuts have been tougher on the poor than the rich, on the north than the south . toughest of all on Labour councils. A reasonable prediction is that, by 2020, DCC will have £300 million PER YEAR less to spend.

DCC is combatting these cuts in a number of ways. 'Backroom' functions and managerial posts have been pared. 2,000 jobs have been lost.

DCC could, as some have suggested, have used its reserves (and £13.5 million has indeed been used this year to take the edge off some difficult changes) but – in the face of a  $\pm 300$  million budget shortfall EVERY YEAR – Council balances

Instead, the Council is continuously exploring innovative solutions. DCC is using its reserves to fund invest-to-earn and spend-to-save projects (the change to LED lighting on housing estates is an example of the latter).

There is an emphasis on encouraging economic growth (of which Lumière is an example, earning last year nearly £6 million for the local tourist industry) – this is the long-term solution.

Where all else has failed, however, the Council has grasped the nettle, opted for responsible spending, and made cuts in such a way as to minimise the effect on the most vulnerable. Readers may wish to compare this to the government's welfare reforms, which rather have targeted the weak. PROTECTING AYCLIFFE

We face a Tory government in power in Westminster making horrendous cuts. Since 2013, as Newton Aycliffe councillors, we have managed to get the library moved not closed; we have retained the Customer Access Surgery; we are regenerating, not closing, the Leisure Centre; we have avoided any cuts to our Adult Day Care provision; we are on the verge of saving all three bridges in West Park: the Town Council's intervention retained the lights along the A167; et al. Meanwhile last year alone DCC invested £313,000 in the town's facilities and services through GAMP and the County Councillors' Neighbourhood Budgets.

The Council is little more than half-way through the Tory cuts, and it is unrealistic to expect that somehow Newton Aycliffe can always be immune.
