UPDATE FROM CENTRE MANAGER



The owners of Aycliffe Town Centre are pleased to confirm that following substantial design work on securing the future of the much loved and iconic Town Centre Clock Tower we can now restart the demolition works of Churchill House, which is currently supporting the tower, and the creation of a new access point to the Town Centre from Stephenson Way. On completion of the demolition works in the summer of 2016, part of the

site will be handed over to Durham County Council for a contractor's compound in order that they might commence the alterations and extension of the Leisure Centre to create a new Library.

All the works are expected to be complete by the end of the year.

Co. Durham Votes for Devolution Proposals

Nearly 82,000 County Durham residents have taken part in a household poll asking for feedback on regional devolution proposals. Durham County Council held the poll of all electors – which had a response rate of 21.7 per cent – to help inform its decision on whether to sign up to a final North East devolution agreement.

The agreement would see more decisions made locally and £30m a year additional funding made available to help bolster the region's economy. It would also see the introduction of a regional elected mayor.

Feedback from the household poll shows that there is support for devolving some power and resources to the North East and a view that we should wait to see how further devolution could be achieved in the future.

Analysis of the results show that a clear majority (59.5 per cent) of those who took part believe that devolving some power and resources to the North East would be a step in the right direction.

Just under half of those who took part in the poll (47.8 per cent) thought that the mayor should have limited powers while 40.3 per cent of people felt the mayor should have quite a lot of power and influence.

In relation to whether the

North East should seek further devolved powers if the agreement goes ahead, 42.9 per cent preferred a cautious approach of waiting to see how things develop.

Cllr Simon Henig, leader of Durham County Council, said: "I am delighted that so many people have taken the time to tell us their views on the devolution proposals."

"The proposals would mean some significant changes and it is right that residents have had the opportunity to have their say."

"There have been concerns raised nationally about the level of public consultation regarding devolution, but in County Durham we have a strong track record of engaging with our residents on major decisions such as this."

"The fact that nearly 82,000 people in County Durham have responded to our poll shows that residents do want to have a say on issues that affect the local area."

"I would like to thank all those who have shared their views with us. They will be taken into account when we make our final decision about the devolution proposals."

The full results from the poll and an update on other issues associated with the proposed devolution agreement was reported at a meeting of the full council on Wednesday 24th February 2016.

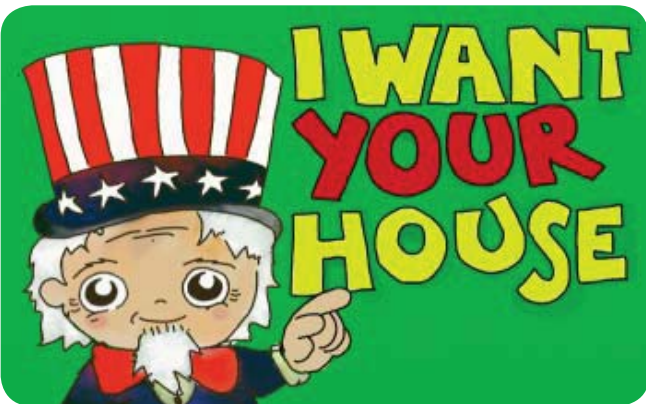

Changes at Newton Aycliffe Youth & Community Centre

Over a year ago Durham County Council invited the trustees of the Youth and Community Centre to submit an expression of interest with a view of taking over the asset of the Youth Centre building and all its liabilities. This was done in June 2014.

On the 13th January 2016 the Cabinet member for Children and Young People submitted a report to describe a Strategy for Youth Support. This is based on the review and the resulting strategy the report sought permission to consult on the following priorities:

1. A Strategy for Youth Support in County Durham.
2. Deploy Council resources according to need to deliver a Target Youth Support Service.
3. Ceasing the existing youth work support grant and the allocation of funding to each Area Action Partnership (AAP) to address local priorities linked to youth services.

The review also considered the existing stock of the six council maintained youth and community centres it is the intention, as part of this strategy, to progress options regarding the potential transfer to local community ownership under what is called

the Durham ASK programme. The purpose of this would enable the Council to realise £116,517 savings at the same time the facilities being retained in the community. The 6 centres are:- Fishburn Youth & Community Centre, Newton Aycliffe Youth & Community Centre, Peterlee Youth Centre, Seaham Youth Centre, Spennymoor Youth Centre and Stanley Youth Centre.

Should the current management groups of these centres decline the opportunity to asset transfer; alternative uses for the centres will be explored to ensure that universal services continue for young people, their families and the wider community. It is anticipated that this review will result in a £1m savings from the current youth support budget. Given the level of cuts in money from Central Government there will be less money so it is even more important that every pound is well spent.

I can now report that my Board of Trustees are fully committed to ensuring that services in Newton Aycliffe Youth and Community Centre continue and the needs of both the young people and the wider

community are met. There are however changes that need to be made to ensure that funding is available, which has resulted in changes to the way we do things, to make those savings (normally called efficiency savings).

Any malicious rumour that readers may hear are totally incorrect and we are not closing any of our services, in fact we will continue to develop and improve what is on offer now. We are just having to deliver things differently and are currently developing a partnership with Fishburn Youth and Community Centre. We need to engage with the people, and Durham County Council is inviting you to take part in a consultation about the proposals as to improving how Youth Support Services are delivered. The consultation is between now and the 27 April 2016 so we need your views. The consultation document is available online at www.durham.gov.uk/youthsupportconsult or you can pick up a copy at One Point Hub or the Youth Centre. It is important you respond to this consultation exercise and if you have any questions please call in the Centre and if I am not available one of the officers should be able to help.

PD Ports to Handle Hitachi Rail Car Imports Destined for Durham

North East-based PD Ports has announced that it is to handle the majority of Hitachi Transport System Europe's (HTSE) rail car imports, which are destined for manufacturing facility based in Newton Aycliffe, County Durham.

The train body shells are coming into Teesport, owned by PD Ports, via a new service direct from Japan. Some body shells are also being brought into the Port by road, where they will be stored prior to onward transportation by road vehicles to the facility.

The service, which started in September 2015, saw global shipping provider "K" Line's newly announced 7500-unit Ro-Ro vessels ship the body shells from the Port of Tokuyama-Kudamatsu, Japan to Teesport. The journey covered some 12,000 nautical miles over 35 days; the equivalent of travelling from John O'Groats to Land's End more than 16 times.

Once at Teesport, the body shells are towed from the vessel in a specific order and then manoeuvred using bespoke lifting equipment designed by PD Ports in partnership with HTSE. The body shells, which measure 26 metres in length, are then placed onto vehicles before being transported to a secure storage area at the Port. Each vessel will carry five or nine car trains with a maximum of 18 body shells imported per shipment.

Geoff Lippitt, PD Ports' business development director, said: "To be an integral part of the Hitachi supply chain is a role we are very proud to undertake. The importance of Hitachi Rail in the wider economic context of the North-East is of tremendous significance and will provide a much needed boost to the region."

Police & Employers Combat Crimes Against Businesses

A landmark Agreement to work together to combat crime against businesses has been signed by the North East's three Police and Crime Commissioners, and the Institute of Directors.

The Agreement says that businesses and the Police will work together to:

- share information that will highlight trends in crime
- explore how to investigate fraud jointly
- provide comprehensive advice to businesses about preventing crime
- engage employees in combatting crime

Speaking at a joint PCC/IOD event in Durham this week, Ron Hogg, Police and Crime Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington said "This Agreement will really help the Police support businesses in the fight against crime, and we hope that other organisations which represent businesses will also become involved in this joint-programme of work". Barry Coppinger, Police and Crime Commissioner for Cleveland added "Business

crime is often seen as a victimless crime, which it isn't. The signing of this agreement is therefore important to prevent and combat crime from occurring. The use of reporting tools such as Action Fraud UK, the national fraud and internet

crime reporting centre is an example of what can be used to support businesses experiencing fraud". Vera Baird, Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria, said: "Businesses have a responsibility to recognise and support victims of crime such as hate crime and domestic abuse. It's a phrase regularly used - 'domestic abuse is everyone's business' and research shows that 75% of domestic abuse victims are targeted at the workplace. Employers are therefore in a position where they can provide tremendous help and support by adopting our workplace policy and training domestic abuse champions to raise awareness, spot the signs and help those in need." A joint working group will be established to develop and implement new practices that will reduce the risks of crime.

(LONG TENS WAY, NEWTON AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2016

The Council, on 26.02.16 made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, to close to all vehicular traffic a 260m length of Long Tens Way that extends northwards from its junction with the access to Unit 2 to the access to the Excel Centre; and also a 40m length of Grindon Way that extends eastwards from its junction with Long Tens Way, Newton Aycliffe to enable new drainage installation works to be undertaken. However, on rare occasions, alternative dates for closures may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly. **Alternative route:** from the southern side of the closure from Long Tens Way, easterly along Grindon Way, northerly on St Andrews Way and westerly on Heighington Lane to the northern side of the closure, and vice versa.

Paralympian Visits Greenfield

Craig McCann, a Paralympian athlete in wheelchair fencing and a British National Champion Paracyclist, came into school to work with Mr Butterworth's year 10 GCSE PE class last week. The Paralympian's visit, who is hoping to make the 2016 Rio Paralympic Games, coincided with an initiative, Sky Sports Living for Sport, that Greenfield Community College are loyal advocates of that uses sport as a tool to motivate and inspire 11-16 year olds.

Most Businesses Wish to Stay in the EU

Dear Sir,
Further to a recent correspondent I would like to clarify the origin of the statistic of 'over 80%' used by the MP Phil Wilson regarding local businesses who want the UK to remain in the EU.

Last summer Mr Wilson carried out a survey across Aycliffe Business Park, NetPark in Sedgfield and the industrial estate in Chilton in a bid to find out the opinions of businesses in his constituency towards the EU, and the potential impact of withdrawal.

The results of this survey, which was sent to over 200 businesses, revealed 86% of respondents favoured remaining in the EU (which is the statistic Mr Wilson is quoted as using).

Mr Wilson's quote is therefore factual and can be substantiated by the results of the research he conducted.

This clear support by local businesses of EU membership however, isn't confined to one survey.

The North East Chamber of Commerce recently revealed that 63% of businesses across the region want to remain in the EU, with only 29.3% planning to vote leave in June.

Moreover, the EEF released a report which stated only 5% of manufacturers backed leaving the EU. The independent research shows that 61% of manufacturers want to stay in the EU, and 82% believe it does not make sense for the UK to cut itself from its major market and consider the UK to have a key role in helping the EU deliver greater value and efficiency.

Over the coming weeks and months Phil will further outline his position on Europe, dispelling the myths and misconceptions that are being put forward by those advocating for the UK to leave the EU.
