Youth Centre Members Enjoy Pizza & Politics with MP Phil

The NAASA youth group at Newton Aycliffe Youth and Community Centre were joined by Sedgefield MP Phil Wilson, for pizza and to discuss the importance of voting.

In total 30 young people attended the Newton Aycliffe and Shildon Alive Friday evening youth group, to listen and speak with Mr Wilson. The group attracts those in their teens up to 19 years old, meaning some of those who attended could cast their first vote in the EU referendum this June.

The rushed introduction of Individual Voter Registration, a year earlier than planned, has however wiped many people, particularly the young



and disadvantaged, from the register. The Electoral Commission has stated that 770,000 names were removed from the register when the transition period to individual voter register ended. In Sedgefield constituency alone, at least 500 people were removed from the register. Phil Wilson however, has made it clear that he will work hard to ensure young people in his constituency are not denied a voice, "Young people are the

future of this town and they deserve to have their say." Vince Crosby Chairman of the Board of Trustees said, "My Trustees are fully behind getting young people involved in the way they can understand how both laws are made and how to engage with the MP and I would like to thank Phil for taking the time out. Young people having previously met with the local Councillors are becoming more involved." During the pizza and politics session, he listened to the concerns of the young people and answered numerous questions on a range of issues, with one teen quizzing the MP on changes regarding e-cigarette legislation. Others told Phil how important the youth centre is to them, and expressed their concerns over potential changes to the youth service in County Durham; a direct result of the disproportionate cuts the government is placing upon Durham County Council, with the toll of government austerity costing the council £290 million between 2010 and 2020.

Phil Wilson said "What evenings like this show is that young people care about their communities, and they want their voice heard. The teens and the staff at NAASA are a credit to the town and to the constituency."

"I want young people to have their say, it is not about whether they vote for me, it is about enabling them to exercise their fundamental right to vote". After Mr Wilson had finished speaking, those 16 or over were able to register to vote. Overall the evening was a great success, with 16 pizzas consumed, and more young people now on the electoral register, able to have their voice heard. To register to vote, please visit:

LOCAL DOCTOR WINS NATIONAL AWARD

A Darlington hospital consultant has been named the first ever winner of a national award for his investigation into the risks people with food allergies face from restaurant and take-away meals. Dr. Tushar Banerjee, consultant paediatrician at County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust, has been selected by Imperial College, London, to receive the Jill Warner Award, which will be given annually to the research project considered to have the most impact on the care of people with allergies. Dr. Banerjee, said, "My research revealed that people with food allergies were at significant risk of accidental exposure when eating take-away and restaurant food, largely due to the lack of

knowledge of people working in these venues. Around 15 people die from the most serious form of food allergies in the UK every year and hospital admissions for food allergies have increased 500 per cent since 1990. "These are preventable deaths and having identified the risks through my research, I worked with Darlington Borough Council and addressed two awareness-raising meetings for large and small-scale caterers in the town. We also made them aware of a European Union directive, introduced in late 2014, requiring restaurants to highlight ingredients causing allergic reactions, such as milk, eggs, fish and most dangerous, peanuts, on menus." "Winning this award came as a total surprise and I am particularly pleased as it means my research findings being shared even more widely than I hoped." Dr. Bannerjee runs a multi-disciplinary food allergy clinic at Darlington Memorial Hospital where patients can be seen by a dietician, gastroenterologist, dermatologist, respiratory clinician and a specialist allergy nurse.





Aycliffe Firm Cited as National Inspiration

A local charity is celebrating receiving funding to help create a new IT suite. The Hub of Wishes, located at Silverdale Place in Newton Aycliffe is a day service provider that supports adults over 18 years of age who have mental health issues. At their Hub of Wishes community building the charity delivers a range of activities, which help promote social inclusion and allows their service users to build friendships. Currently, the charity runs an art therapy group, walking group, lunch club, bingo, day trips, healthy living/eating courses, gardening and alternative therapy sessions. All these activities allow the centre users to improve their basic skills and build confidence to assist them in their recovery. The funding secured through

"North Better off Out of EU" 3M Among the World's "Most Ethical"

Dear Sir,
Angela Bergg states that she is a true Northerner and wants to remain in the EU because the undemocratic EU gives the North East more back in funding per capita than the North East taxpayers contribute. If this is indeed the case, presumably successive British Governments have allowed this to happen. However, come BREXIT there will be more British tax payer's money available to spend in the North! It's a no brainer!

Why pay the EU £15 billion per year just so that they can distribute the remainder of our EU contribution? It must be better and more democratic just to LEAVE the EU and spend all our own taxes where the electorate want them to be spent. Yes, Mrs Bergg, there is a North / South divide but remaining in the EU will only perpetuate it.

When I first moved to the North East (more than 40 years ago) I thought that the North East voted Labour because it was poor. After the New Labour era I have come to realise that the North East is poor because it predominantly votes labour! During our membership of the EEC, and latterly the EU, we have not only lost over a million jobs but we have lost great industries: Coal, Steel, Shipbuilding, Aluminium; with Farming and Fisheries

being at great risk due to our continued membership of the EU.

Coal - It is now cheaper to import coal from Poland than to mine our own. If we leave the EU and Poland decides to raise its prices we can easily produce our own coal and repatriate a lot of jobs.
Steel - 35,000 steel jobs were lost under New Labour. EU 'rules' meant that we could not subsidise our steel production. Also, EU 'Green energy' targets meant that our costs of production were artificially high and uncompetitive, even within Europe!

Shipbuilding - When the Pallion Yard at Sunderland closed the emergency funding (our own tax money) received from the EU was conditional upon the most up-to-date shipyard in Europe not being used for shipbuilding! Germany and the Netherlands, in the meantime, illegally subsidised their shipbuilding.
Aluminium - Again, EU 'green energy' targets and taxes on fossil fuels meant that our production could not remain competitive.

Farming - Remember the butter, grain, and sugar mountains and the wine lakes? The Common Agricultural Policy uses our taxes to pay farmers not to farm. Our Dairy Industry is in danger due to the 'dumping' of over production

in the EU, subsidised by our taxes. Better to pay our own farmers to farm our land rather than subsidise over-production in the EU and dumping in Britain. We will have more money after leaving the EU to properly fund our farming.

Fisheries - For years we have been making criminals out of our skippers and scrapping our fishing boats so that Spanish and other EU fishing fleets could plunder our fisheries. Madness!

Mrs Bergg's 'fear campaign' is based upon the fact that she does not trust our democratically elected Government to properly and fairly distribute the monies we taxpayers currently pay to the EU. This is a perfectly rational fear for a labour supporter. Tony Blair and Gordon Brown after him, both failed to address the North / South divide. However, even if her fear is justified and a post BREXIT British Government distributes our total contribution to the EU along the lines that it is currently distributed (partly by the EU) then the fact that there will be an extra £15 billion in the kitty will mean that the North will be financially better off OUT rather than IN.

As an aside. Today I received a 'Remain' leaflet delivered by an employee of "Royal Mail". Does this mean that the Queen has gone back

on her word? Is she now allowing the 'Royal' warrant to be used by the 'Remain' campaign? Is this the level playing-field we were promised?

Perhaps, the Prime Minister, as figurehead for the 'Remain' campaign, can enlighten us upon if/and when Her Majesty decided to side with his campaign.

CRIME COMMISSIONERS FIGHT ALCOHOL ABUSE

The consequences of excessive alcohol consumption were shown in sharp relief at a major conference hosted by the North East's three Police and Crime Commissioners in Durham. Speakers at the event included: - Jon Foster, Senior Research and Policy Officer, Institute of Alcohol Studies - Professor Dorothy Newbury Birch, Professor of Alcohol and Public Health Research, Teesside University - Colin Shevills, Director of Balance - Maxine Thompson of One Punch North East - Miriam Davidson, Director of Public Health for Darlington - Kirsty Gail-Wilkinson, Public Health Portfolio Holder for Durham County Council



The conference heard the heart-breaking story of Kristian Thompson, a County Durham teenager who died in rehabilitation months after being hit by a single punch in 2010. Since then, his mother Maxine has committed every effort to an awareness campaign called One Punch North East, using the keywords 'stop, think and walk away'. Ron Hogg said "we all know what the consequences of excessive alcohol consumption can be, but only by talking to people who have suffered tragedies such as Maxine, do you really appreciate how utterly devastating they are". The Commissioners also backed calls from Colin Shevills, Director of Balance North East, the regional alcohol office, for the limit for driving with alcohol in the bloodstream to be reduced to the same level as was introduced in Scotland in 2014. The Commissioners recently backed a Private Members' Bill in the House of Lords which called for the same reduction, and have today received a letter from the Secretary of State for Transport, saying the Government 'has no plans to

change the drink driving limit in England and Wales'. Cleveland Police and Crime Commissioner Barry Copping said "This response provides no comfort to the victims of drink-driving. In Scotland the new limit has led to a 17% reduction in drink-drive offences. The three PCC's in the North East region will continue campaigning for a lower drink-drive limit to bring into line with most of the rest of Europe." Northumbria Police and Crime Commissioner, Vera Baird, announced the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners Alcohol Working Group have secured a meeting with members of the House of Lords in March, to enable these issues to be highlighted in Parliament. Speaking after the event, Vera Baird said: "There was an excellent turn-out at the conference today, and very strong support amongst the 150 delegates for the measures we are asking for. We have a clear mandate in the North East to press the Government to reduce the drink-driving limit, to introduce a minimum unit price for alcohol, and to review the licensing laws."

Funding Opportunities

Holiday Grants for Children (UK)

The Henry Smith's Charity has announced that schools and youth groups can apply between now and the 18th March 2016 to the Holiday Grant for Children Programme for activities taking place between the 1st February - 30th April 2016.

Schools, youth groups and not for profit organisations can apply for grants towards holidays or outings within the UK for children aged 13 and under who are from deprived areas or have a disability. Applications can be considered for holidays or outings that have the objective of providing children with a break they would not otherwise have the opportunity to experience. The maximum grant is usually £2,500 for any one trip. Grants are normally limited to a maximum of two-thirds of the total cost of a trip as the charity would expect some local partnership funding to be in place.

Recently funded projects include:

- Berridge Junior School which received £1,000 towards a day trip to the seaside for 160 school children from a disadvantaged area of Nottingham.
- Thrybergh Primary School received £2,500 Goose Green Primary towards a residential trip to an activity centre in Lancashire for a group of disadvantaged children from South Yorkshire.

Plaque to the Future




Hundreds of theatre lovers are to be reunited with personalised plaques after more than 25 years of supporting Darlington Civic Theatre.

Your Say on the Future of Transport in the North East

The North East Combined Authority (NECA) is setting the wheels in motion for plans to launch a 20 year 'Transport Manifesto' that covers both 'urban and rural' geographic areas of Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle upon Tyne, Northumberland, North Tyneside, South Tyneside and Sunderland.

The manifesto 'Our Journey' will feed into the local transport plan for the combined authority area and will set out how NECA intends to deliver on its ambition to promote affordable, attractive, reliable, safe, healthy transport choices for businesses, residents and visitors.

If you've ever been on a journey using local transport and said to yourself "I should really mention this to someone" – whether it be good or bad, then now is your chance.

The outcome of the manifesto will be beneficial to residents, businesses and visitors to the North East as transport is a vital commodity that keeps the region moving.

The consultation will look at a variety of transport options including road, rail, air and sea. The North East Combined Authority area 'Transport Facts' at a glance:

- Covers 3,200 square miles of urban & rural communities
- 2 million residents
- 4.1 million visitors a year
- 200,000 people commuting into urban centres
- 38,000 small and medium-sized enterprises
- The largest car plant in the UK by far

Newcastle City Councillor Nick Forbes, Chairman of the Transport North East Committee, said: "The aim of this Transport Manifesto is to put passengers at the heart of the North East's transport network."

"Across the region, people rightly demand a transport system that works for them, that is reliable, easy to use and affordable. Now is your chance to ensure you have a say over how we tackle the issues holding us back as a region."

"For the first time in many decades the region is coming together, as Transport North East, to set a vision. But it is not up to politicians to decide on our transport priorities; the vision of the region has to be one we all contribute to. This document will guide our way for the next two decades, from everything to our approach to Metro ticket prices to which major roads we seek to upgrade. It is the passengers, the motorists, the cyclists and other transport users who will shape this region, and their feedback on this manifesto is vital."

The Transport Manifesto will help to empower the region and reinforce its position of being a national and international force. It will allow the subject of transport to underline its importance in areas such as economic growth, the environment and health.

Durham County Cllr Neil Foster, vice chair of Transport North East Committee, said: "Having efficient and reliable transport systems in place is a crucial part of our drive for economic growth. We need to ensure that residents in both urban and rural areas, whether they travel by car, use public transport or cycle, can access services, leisure, jobs and training opportunities."

"Businesses – including those which are already based in the North East and those thinking of investing here – need to be able to have confidence in the transport networks within our region and those which connect us to national and international markets. We want people's views on these important transport plans which will help to shape our region over the next 20 years."

Another valuable feature of the Transport Manifesto is the opportunity to discuss and raise the public profile of 'Sustainable Travel' that helps to reduce carbon emissions into the environment and minimise local air pollution. Sustainable Travel represents areas of transport like walking, cycling, public transport, car sharing and taxis – where people use leg and lung power or join others on their travels.

North Tyneside Councillor John Harrison, vice chair of Transport North East Committee, said: "We strongly believe that by working together to get the correct transport infrastructure in place, the region's economy will be in a great position to prosper."

"It is important that residents and visitors to the North East are able to rely on good transport and this manifesto is a significant step forward towards reaching our goal. This is an excellent opportunity for the public to shape transport in the region and I would encourage people to have their say on the manifesto before the deadline on April 8th."

have remained steady over the last year and it is hoped the proposed improvements to the hall will make it more appealing.

The Association reported that due to the economic situation the council is undergoing serious funding cuts and as a result the village hall is going to face significant challenges ahead.





defence & comfortably placed a shot into the net.

That didn't end the drama. With the clock on 90+1 Bedlington substitute Michael Baxter found himself in space in the box & fired home.

It was with some relief shortly afterwards that Aycliffe heard the final whistle. They now travel to Ashington on Tuesday night for a league game and then move on to the Hetton Centre for their first Durham Challenge Cup final appearance in their 50 year history.

Aycliffe now have 50 points in the league. The last time they finished a season with more than that was in 2012/2013 however this year they have reached the half century with 14 games still to play.
