

We Need Our Youth Club" says Teacher



An Aycliffe teacher is speaking out about Durham County Council's proposed Youth Service changes.

The Council is proposing to withdraw funding from Newton Aycliffe's Youth and Community Centre, and from the twice-weekly Youth Club held there, in order to focus services upon vulnerable and needy youngsters.

schoolteacher Peter Local Davies fears that this may damage many young people. He says: "I appreciate that the Council must make savings, but the Youth Centre is going to be even more important in the coming years as government cuts damage society, and the Youth Club is an essential part of the service offered to the needy youngsters of the town. It serves as a safe place for those needing somewhere to go, a drop-in for those in need of advice or wishing to disclose, and a safety net for those in danger of going off the rails'

"Closing the Youth Club would simply be to neglect addressable issues which will become insoluble problems later on," says Mr Davies. "I am hoping we can persuade the Council to continue to finance a Youth Worker presence at the Youth Club as part of their service to vulnerable

youngsters.' Vince Crosby, Chairman of the Youth and Community

Centre, welcomed Mr Davies's intervention. what the Board of Trustees wants too," he said. "We will take over the running of the Centre under the Durham ASK, and we expect to be able to provide a venue for the Youth Club. But we need Youth Workers to provide a specialised service for the young people who go there who are, some of them, very needy indeed."

Mr Davies explained: "The Youth Club needs our active support for the sake of our young people. When I stood recently for election to the Town Council, I told the voters that I would make youth the focus of my work. In the event, I was not elected, but that does not affect my determination to fight for the town's young people, of whom I was one once, and whom I now serve as their teacher."

Burglaries Update

There is no doubt that anyone following the Team's social media pages or having read local media will have seen of late, we have seen a troubling rise in the occurrence of house burglaries. We have not suffered any such crimes this past week within Newton Aycliffe I am happy to report however the Neighbourhood Team here and our CID colleagues have been working closely together putting various pieces of intelligence together and progressing various leads and that work has paid off.

I reported several weeks ago that a 14 year old male had been arrested on suspicion of being involved in these crimes and bailed. That tenacity didn't end there..... On the 19th March a 39 year old local male was arrested on suspicion of involvement in the burglaries - he was bailed whilst further enquiries progress regarding his suspected involvement.

And as I type this a 42 year old male - also from Newton Aycliffe, is currently in custody

undergoing questioning by local detectives having been arrested last night. Your local Neighbourhood Cops may not be flawless but we are determined!

My Thought Of The Week

would like to say that the taking of someone's liberty

– aka arresting them, is not in itself evidence of guilt. Police Officers operate in the arena of suspicion and belief. During any investigation suspicion gives us the grounds to make an arrest – subject to necessity, and subsequently interview detained persons. It may be that the outcome of the interview process eliminates a particular person from the investigation and they are released with no further action being taken. Whilst there is no doubt that to many people the removal of their liberty is a harrowing experience it is sadly a necessary evil.

Why do I refer to this you may ask? As part of our continued efforts to engage with the community and highlight our accountability to yourselves (basically, what we're doing in relation to key crimes/issues) we regularly raise awareness of arrests made and such conversations often generate debate and conversation

amongst our followers. So what am I saying? If you read a post relating to an arrest that has been made. that in itself is not evidence of someone's guilt - it is an awareness that we are working to address local issues by pursuing all lines of enquiry To close, thanks for reading and I hope you tune in again next time, as one things for certain - there's always something going on in the world of Neighbourhood

Tees Valley and Durham contributes £2.30, to get just £1 back from Europe - Lack of Regional Justice

Incredibly, while Europe contributes £213,000 to the economy of Tees Valley and Durham – at the same time Europe takes away £489,000 Tees Valley and from Durham

People from Tees Valley and Durham are effectively out according to research by Open Europe.

It is estimated that 70% of our overall contributions go to Member States, with just 25% ending up back in UK regions they originally came from with only 5% redistributed across other regions.

Of the 37 regions in Britain under the EU classification system, 35 are net contributors to structural funds, with only West Wales and Cornwall being net beneficiaries.

Regional injustice in terms of funding Europe was addressed by Gordon Brown in 2003 who said the time was

ripe to "bring regional policy back to Britain". But Brown got nowhere redressing the imbalance. The Coalition dropped the commitment as it never even made it into David

Cameron's negotiation. Over the 2007-2013 EU budgetary period, the UK contributed roughly £29.5bn to the EU's structural and cohesion funds, getting back around £8.7bn

All the regions in the North-East pay in more than they get back, as does Northern Ireland (£1.58 for every £1 it gets back). All sub-regions in Scotland are likewise net from the structural losers

EU Costs 30p a Day for a £3000 Return

From our Local M.P. Phil Wilson

The EU debate is full of mistruths and confounding information. Even those campaigning to leave can't agree on how much the UK contributes to the EU. Some will claim the figure is £14 billion whilst others will inflate it to £19 billion. Neither however, are right.

The UK's contribution to the EU is based on GDP which changes year on year, and once the contribution is calculated an automatic discount (called a rebate) of £5 billion is applied. In 2015, the UK's net contribution to the EU was less than £6 billion. A far cry from the £19 billion some out campaigners would have you

Breaking this down, Britain's EU membership costs only 30p per person per day. A bargain when you consider that the CBI has stated the EU is worth £3000 per household. As part of the Tees Valley and Durham, we benefit significantly from EU

membership.
Under the Youth Employment
Initiative North East, Tees Valley and Durham receive £19.8m; from the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development we get £11.5; research and development funding for universities ad SME's is expected to reach £130m; and the EU Structural funds will contribute £595.6m between 2014 and 2020.

In total, that's a staggering £756.9 million that the North East, Tees Valley and Durham will receive from the EU before 2020.

Examples of where this money has been spent are evident across the North East from the iconic Angel of the North to NetPark in Sedgefield which will receive £4,939,608 in capital from the EU's Regional Development funds. Closer to home Gestamp, and South West Durham Training Centre who have received £163,000 for their Enhanced Train to Gain project, have benefited directly from EU funding, along with many others.

People who advocate leaving want us to take back control. But is this Tory government really going to invest the same amount of money into the North East that the EU does? To be frank, the answer is no. Under this government, local authority funding in the North East is the lowest of all regions except the East Midlands. It would be fantastical to believe this government would put the same level of investment back into County Durham, where local authority spending will have been cut by £290 million

Whilst EU funding benefits the North East significantly, unimpeded access the single market brings investment, growth and jobs to the region.

Our EU membership has attracted companies Nissan and Hitachi Rail Europe to the region, and supports well over 100,000 jobs across the North East. Companies like Nissan Hitachi and Gestamp all support continued membership because they recognise the EU brings investment, growth, and jobs

Hitachi's Even Executive has said it would be "ridiculous" for the UK to leave the EU. But the EU referendum isn't just about economics. Benefits of EU membership are everywhere in everyday life. Other benefits include holiday pay, worker's rights, maternity and paternity leave, and protection for agency agency protection workers to name just a few.

The EU has brought the cost of a ten minute phone call down by 74% since 2000, and has set the maximum charge for sending a text, cutting costs for consumers by 60%

For 30 pence a day, the return we get from the EU is huge. It provides investment in our region, supports jobs, and protects our rights.

The EU provides each of us with a better quality of life, and for 30 pence a day that is definitely something worth protecting.

Two dogs have been hospitalised on drips due to dashing off and eating it before their owner realised what they were doing and one has been ich ongoing condition. The Health

Officer has been out to investigate and agrees that there is a problem but cannot act unless the person responsible is identified.

Last week a large amount of woolly stuff was left out, I presume for nesting material, and the neighbourhood warden had to come out and remove it before it blew everywhere!

We are now troubled by a murder of crows, which are normally fairly solitary birds, there can be up to forty at a time in front of our houses and the massive problem that we have with them is that they are damaging our roofs by pecking out the mortar.

don't know why this behaviour is occurring, perhaps a dietary deficiency, but last Autumn five of the residents facing the green had to pay £200 each to have their ridge tiles re-pointed. You can watch and hear them on your roof as whole chunks of mortar fall off. It is now happening again and is a huge cost to us all, the crows have begun to nest nearby and their numbers are going to multiply, increasing the problem significantly.

Apparently we are not allowed to shoot them so we are appealing to the better nature of this person to cease throwing food there. If caught the council have said they will be prosecuted. I am not against anyone feeding wildlife but please do it in your own garden, this is causing enormous and expensive problems for other residents.

Do You Know What Household Items Can be Recycled?

A campaign is to be launched to encourage even higher levels of household recycling in County Durham. The County Council has secured almost £31,000 from the Waste and Resources Action Programme (WRAP) to promote its national Recycle Now 'Good to Know' campaign locally.
The council is promoting the

six month campaign which started in February. The campaign aims to raise awareness of the different types of materials that can be

recycled from different rooms of the home in the blue lidded recycling bins and recycling boxes, including those from which WRAP believes recycling rates are lower.
Good to Know will see the

council's strategic waste team getting the message team getting the message out at school assemblies and roadshows, through social media, knocking on doors and handing out leaflets.

The campaign message will also be advertised in newspapers and on the back of buses as well as on radio. Officers will also be giving

out bin stickers and putting stickers on recyclable items in Durham's Sainsbury's store. Around half of the population already recycle and the campaign aims to encourage people to do more by

highlighting the benefits. For example, one drinks can could save enough energy to power a TV for four hours and plastic bottles can be recycled

and made into a chair.

Alan Patrickson, head of projects and business services, said: "More than six out of ten of us now describe ourselves as committed recyclers but that doesn't mean that we can't do

The Aycliffe players & management under Peter Dixon's leadership thoroughly deserved their victory & the enthusiastic celebrations enthusiastic which followed the trophy presentation showed how much the win meant
