health grounds. With just one year to the next Full Council elections it seems a shame to have to have another election at a cost of over £9,200 to the

Council Taxpayer. Newton News has checked on the law and if the resignation had taken place within 6 months of the next elections the seat could have remained vacant. But because it is over six months there are two choices - call a By Election by getting 10 signatures or leave the Council to simply co-opt someone for the remainder of the term.

Whoever wins the Election would only serve a year incurring a large cost and a school closure for polling, coming at the same time as the Police & Crime Commissioner elections and EU Referendum. A co-option is probably in the public interest and Labour who control the Council would co opt a Labour Party member to replace the Labour Councillor standing down.

Micro-Chip Your Dog or be Fined | Great Community Occasion

new laws mean it will be compulsory for all dogs to be microchipped

• More than one in ten dogs (14%) are currently not microchipped meaning their owners face a hefty fine of

fines totalling more than £500m, after new laws on dog ownership came into force this week

The legislation affects all dogs aged eight weeks and older in England, Wales and Scotland Northern Ireland introduced a similar law in 2012.

Recent figures suggest 1.16m dogs still aren't microchipped, despite a 70% increase in the number pets being microchipped in the last



month

"Any dog owner with an un-microchipped pet now faces a significant fine, but it is our advice to avoid this completely and comply with the law," said Dr Huw Stacey, director of clinical services at Vets4Pets

"Inserting a microchip is an easy and simple procedure, and is nothing for the owner or pet to worry about. It's only about the size of a grain of rice.

"Every microchip has a unique 15-digit code to identify the

last the lifetime of the pet.
"The details are stored on one of seven microchip databases and are accessible to relevant professionals, including vets,

dog wardens and the police.

"The importance of a microchip shouldn't be underestimated. It can be the difference between a lost dog being returned to their owner or simply being lost forever. It is also designed to encourage responsible dog ownership."
Petlog, the UK's largest

Petlog, the UK's largest lost and found database for microchipped pets, which is managed by the Kennel Club, found that more than 60,000 dogs were reported missing over a ten year period and 75% of dogs were reunited thanks to their microchip.
But pets will only be reunited

with their owners if they keep their contact details up-to-date "Pet owners need to treat their pet's microchip information with the utmost importance, if the contact details are not updated, the task of returning a pet to its owner becomes almost impossible. Moving house, changing a mobile number or changing an email address are commons ways a lost pet can lose permanent contact with its owner." says Caroline Kisko, Kennel Club

Secretary.
Local authorities and welfare charities spend around £57 million per year on kenneling costs, but more than 50% of stray dogs cannot be returned because their owners cannot be identified.

this approximately 6,000 dogs are put down each year because their owner cannot be found. Figures from Northern Ireland suggest microchipping has had a positive impact, since being introduced four years ago, with the number of stray

dogs being reduced.

Support for People in Hardship in the North East

Despite the Treasury's pledge of no further welfare cuts, a number of significant benefit changes are already in place under this Parliament, with many due to start this April. The national charity Turn2us is encouraging people in financial hardship in the North East to check how they could be affected by the changes and see what other support could be available.

As announced in the Summer Budget 2015, April will see the start of a four-year freeze to working-age benefits and tax credits. Whilst not a direct cut, the freeze essentially erodes the value of the benefits, and for those already on tight household budgets, there is a risk it will add to the pressure of meeting everyday costs. Pensioner, disability, carer and maternity benefits are excluded from the freeze.

There will also be changes to tax credits and Universal Credit

Despite government's U-turn on tax credit cuts last November, there will still be a reduction in the tax credit 'income disregard' amount a claimant's income can increase in-year without seeing a reduction in tax credit entitlement – from £5,000 to £2.500

This brings the income disregard back to the same level as when tax credits were first introduced, and according to the Treasury, it is estimated that 800,000 people will see their tax credit entitlement reduced by an average of £200-£300 per year as a result. The Universal Credit Work

Allowance – the amount you can earn without your benefit being affected – will also be reduced. It will come down to £2,304 for those with housing costs, and £4,764 for those without, and will be removed altogether for non-disabled claimants without children, meaning the benefit will be reduced as soon as they start

earning.
Other welfare changes are set to take place from April

- the same month that sees the introduction of a National Living Wage and a Single Tier Pension. The Turn2us website – www.turn2us.org. uk - features a benefit changes timetable with further details on all of the changes so that people can see how and when they might be affected.

The website also features a free Benefits Calculator that will reflect the latest welfare changes from April so that anyone can check their latest benefits entitlements Alison Taylor, Director of Operations said: "The welfare benefits system has been the subject of huge debate over the past few weeks, and it's likely that these latest changes will bring further confusion and concern. "We would urge anyone who is worried about their situation to visit our website where they can find further information on the changes and check their current benefits entitlements. Anyone who thinks they might see a reduction in their income as a result of the changes can check if they're entitled to any extra help through our Benefits Calculator, and also use our Grants Search to see if they might be eligible for a charity

grant or other support."
Turn2us works with charities and organisations across the UK to help reach more people in financial hardship. The charity will be running a programme of work funded by Comic Relief in the North East of England to help alleviate poverty in the area.

Over the next 3 years, the charity will run a number of workshops to support staff and volunteers working for charities and local community groups in how to use the Turn2us Benefits Calculator. Grants Search and other online help to support their service users in financial need.

The charity estimates the workshops will result in 50,000 people in hardship being supported. To find out more, please visit or contact training@turn2us.org.uk.

The Turn2us workshops are a core part of the charity's work and each year aims to train intermediaries who support some of the most vulnerable groups in the UK.



Youth Centre Changes

Newton Aycliffe Youth & Community Centre have recently employed a Centre Manager, Rebecca Metcalfe and she took up the role on Monday 4th April 2016.

Rebecca's role will be to manage the Centre and everything will now go through Beki (as she is affectionately known).

Vince Crosby, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, said, "things needed to change as we move towards Asset Transfer from Durham County Council and the aim was to create the position of Centre Manager. The process was not taken lightly and the board paid for an external consultant to conduct a full staff review. It was not an option to stay the same with DCC having to shed £1m from the youth service and this is not negotiable".

The full impact of these cuts is not yet known but our aim is to keep the youth service operating as normally as is possible, and it was for that reason we had to carry out the staffing review and make some members of staff redundant. Those members of staff that we have had to lose were valued members of staff, and the whole process of redundancy has been quite emotional. Again we quite emotional. Again we engaged our HR qualified Trustee to see that the Centre adhered to set guidelines through the process. will miss the people we have lost and wish them luck and good fortune in their next

endeavours

It was also important that we got the right person for the job and to that end the services of a trustee who is qualified, and works in HR, along with two external managers including the Manager of Tesco, to whom we are extremely grateful.

The Board of Trustees has also been reduced and the new trustees have been voted on by a democratic vote. It is recognised that the board needed to become more professional, hence the need to reduce our membership base and make changes.

living nearby, or walking past, they are not only an unpleasant nuisance, but also a danger to health. The smoke and fumes they produce can cause lung problems, including COPD and lung cancer, and even if you go indoors they can still filter in.

I thought the 'Clean Air Acts', from the 1950s onwards, were meant to do away with dangerous smoke and fumes, so I was flabbergasted to discover (from the DCC website) that Aycliffe is not in a 'Smoke Control Area', which means these chimneys are permitted.

However, if the fumes are causing a nuisance, usually because the chimney has been wrongly installed, or the wrong fuel is used, the Environmental Health Dept. of DCC can act.

If anyone else is concerned about this, the Environmental Health Department can be contacted by phone, letter or via the DCC website. They will ask you to keep a diary of dates and times of the nuisance.

Meanwhile, shouldn't DCC be thinking again about Aycliffe's 'Smoke Control Area' status?

CAR PARK IMPROVEMENT WILL AID BISHOP

AUCKLAND AS TOURIST ATTRACTION

For its part, the Auckland Castle Trust has installed new signage and launched a free to use volunteer led 'car to castle' shuttle service from 1 April for visitors with mobility problems wanting to reach the former palace home of England's only Prince Bishops.
