Seeds from Space



Science students at Woodham Academy have received a delivery from the International Space Station thanks to a national programme of which 10,000 schools have been chosen to take part.

The scientific investigation, known as Rocket Science, is an experiment between the Royal Horticulture Society Seeds were sent to space last year and have travelled alongside Astronaut Tim Peake on-board the ISS before arriving back down to earth in March.

Students have now planted the seeds alongside seeds that have not left the planet and as the plants grow their progress will be examined to identify if any differences occur. The experiment will encourage students to think more about science and the impact of outer earth can have.

Flight engineer Peake sent his best wishes to pupils around

the country who are taking part in the experiment, in a message sent from 400 km above the planet.

He said: "This is a really exciting time for the hundreds of thousands of young people across the country who will begin their Rocket Science experiments."

"I'd like to wish everyone taking part the best of luck with their investigations and I look forward to seeing some of the results."

"It's possible that among those pupils taking part in the project are the young people who will help mankind reach the next big milestones in space exploration for the benefit of people on Earth."

"I hope the Royal Horticultural Society's Rocket Science experiment will spark curiosity and wonder amongst young people who may become the next generation of horticultural scientists."

Anna Hopeful After Government Brain Tumour Research Debate

Newton Aycliffe cancer campaigner Anna Swabey has told her supporters that the government's recent debate on a petition urging more funding for brain tumour research was 'absolutely incredible, emotional and encouraging'.

Anna was at Westminster with fiancé Andy Bell and her parents, Linda and Keith, to hear MPs debate the call to increase the amount of cash allocated annually by the government specifically for brain tumour research.

Although brain tumours are the bigger cancer killer of children and people under the age of 40, only one per cent of the national budget is allocated to research in that field.

Anna told fellow members of Newton Aycliffe Rotary Club this week: "The debate went better than I ever could have imagined. So many MPs turned up and over 30 of them contributed with such empathy and passion. Not a single MP opposed our call for an increase in funding for brain tumour research."

Twenty-four-year-old Anna, who is battling her own terminal brain tumour, has worked tirelessly to raise cash for research. She was a major force behind the campaign to gain more than 100,000 signatures for an online petition to force a government debate on boosting the government's current allocation for brain tumour research from the present £7 million to a hoped-for £35 million.

At this week's Rotary Club meeting, Anna was presented with a cheque for £500 for the Brain Tumour Research Campaign and a certificate as winner of this year's Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland UK Young Citizen of the Year award.

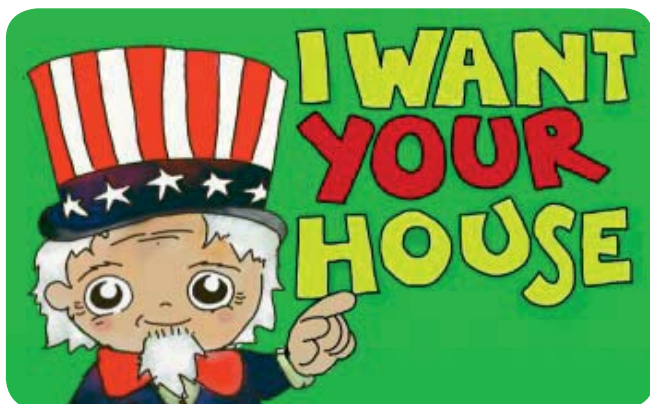
The presentation was made by Rotary District Governor Terry Long who praised

Anna's dedication, enthusiasm and inspirational achievement. The ceremony should have taken place at this year's Rotary Conference in Bournemouth but Anna was in Paris for the city marathon with her 12-strong team of sponsored runners - all of whom completed the course and raised more than £18,000 for the research charity.

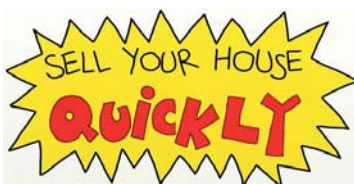
Anna has always recognized that any major breakthrough in brain tumour treatment will be too late for her to benefit, but in her latest blog writes how she sat on the train home after the Westminster debate and thought: "I am now filled with such hope for the future... such hope for those yet to be diagnosed with this cruel illness."

Rotarians in Newton Aycliffe were all fingers and thumbs at a recent meeting when they welcomed guest speaker Margaret (Mags) Bain, a local expert in sign language communication. Club members were able to try out their signing skills after some basic instruction from Mags

who owns the Silent Tea House in premises shared with Love Thy Cupcake at Beveridge Way in the town.

Her tea room is unique in the UK and provides a service for the deaf which is available in only two other cafes anywhere in the world.

Mags greets customers with sign language and is hoping that more deaf and hard-of-hearing locals will now come along with friends and family to learn how to sign.

Every Wednesday, between 6pm and 9pm, she organizes a coffee evening where for a modest £5 per person, she provides hot drinks and nibbles while teaching customers how to learn sign language and deaf-awareness skills.

One customer said this week: "The Silent Tea House is a wonderful place to relax with friends over coffee and a snack while enjoying the opportunity to learn a valuable communication skill."

Mags has been an extremely competent user of sign language from a very young age because of deafness in her family.

President Denese Cartwright couldn't resist the chance to try out her new signing skills at this week's Rotary Club meeting and received a clear thumbs-up from Mags (pictured right). Mags was introduced by Rtn Geoff Bachelor and thanked by Rtn John Burrows.

Chief fire officer Stuart Errington said: "As a fire service we have the same goals as livin with regard to keeping tenants safe and well in their homes. This document sets out how we aim to do this and it is an agreement to share information. We look forward to working closely with livin and we hope that this will be first of many agreements with other local housing providers."

livin currently manages around 8,500 homes in County Durham. Chief Executive, Colin Steel said: "For livin, the document is another step towards protecting our tenants by reducing the number of house fires and potential injuries or deaths which could occur. Promoting safer and healthier communities is of paramount importance to us".

CDDFRS and livin will also collaborate to install sprinkler systems in homes later this year. Fire service 'Safe and Wellbeing' visits replaced home fire safety checks on 15 February 2016. The visits incorporate extra elements based on lifestyle and provide support and practical help to improve health and quality of life when and where appropriate. The programme focuses on advice, information and practical help relating to:

In the past two months CDDFRS has referred more than 350 people from County Durham and the borough of Darlington to health agencies

either through the NHS, local authorities or charitable organisations.

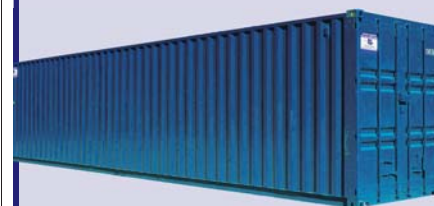



Festival of Learning Inspires Ancestry Courses

A series of courses aimed at helping people trace their family tree is being run by Durham County Council in the coming months. The courses range from

a basic introduction to ancestry for beginners through to more in-depth sessions for those already familiar with the basics. Dawn Layland, Education and Outreach Archivist at Durham County Record Office, said: "Over the last few years we have seen a resurgence in interest from people wanting to trace their family tree and with the centenary of the Battle of the Somme during the First World War soon upon us, many are looking up their ancestors who fought at that time."

The courses will be run at Durham County Record Office at County Hall and include: Family History Taster Sessions (£10 per session) which are designed as a short introduction for those who don't feel ready or are not able to attend the full beginners' course. These sessions run on Tuesday 21 June, 6pm-8pm and Thursday 23 June, 10am-12pm.

Beginners' Family History (£30 per course) a popular introduction not only to family history, but to the Record Office and the sources it has to help with tracing ancestors. This course is aimed at those who have never done any family history research before or

would like a refresher. This three week course runs from 12 - 26 May either at 10am-12pm or 6pm-8pm and includes sessions on Parish Registers & Civil Registration, The Census and Military Records.

For those already happy with basics, Branching Out (£10 per session) is an hour long talk followed by time to browse the facilities with advice and support on hand. Morning sessions from 10am-12pm include: A Closer Look at Parish Registers (Thursday 5 May), Parish Records other than registers (Thursday 16 June) and Illegitimacy, Divorce and Adoption (Thursday 7 July). Evening sessions from 6pm-8pm include: A Closer Look at Parish Registers (Tuesday 3 May), Parish Records other than registers (Monday 13 June) and Illegitimacy, Divorce and Adoption (Tuesday 5 July).

Dawn added: "These courses are a great chance not only to learn how to research your family tree but to find out more about the Record Office and the resources we have that can help."

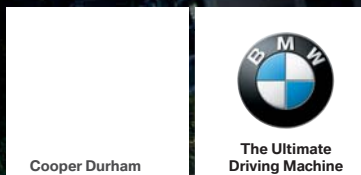

"We're always looking for more household goods and we have the skills within the team here at More Time to refurbish old furniture and white goods to bring them back to standard. The furniture and white goods are then tested and sold on to

local people who may need quality goods but prefer not to buy them in the shops." Fellow volunteer Susan said: "I want to encourage local people to get in touch if they have any furniture or white goods that they no longer want. We offer a free collection service and are happy to travel and see what people wish to donate." All the money raised from the sale of these goods goes back into the More Time service, helping local people develop new skills in retail, sales, catering and cleaning with the aim of them securing employment in the future. Nine Medals for Town Swimming Club

Swimmers from Sedgefield District 75 Swimming Club continue to push themselves and the club to new heights during another few weeks of challenging competitions. The Club had 6 swimmers competing at the Richmond Dale 'April Fools' gala at Leeds on 9th / 10th April. Despite only having only a small number of swimmers competing they came away with 9 medals between them. Matthew Bradley, who only competed on Saturday won gold medals in the 50 free and 200 IM and silvers in the 100 breast and 200 free. Niall Coulthard won silver in the 200 free and 50 fly and bronze in the 100 free. Leah Smith and Kate Tolley both medalled in the 50 back with Leah coming away with the silver medal and Kate the bronze. Katelyn Craig and Kate Carmichael also made the journey to Leeds and came away with long course personal best times in all their swims. For some of these swimmers it was their first time swimming at a 50m pool and it was a fantastic achievement for them all getting the qualifying times for a faster level meet.

During the week commencing 11th April, Hannah Featherstone represented the Sedgefield 75 at the British Championships. Amongst the best of British Swimmers Hannah started her week winning the Junior Girls 200 free also recording a personal best time in her swim of 2:02.03. She followed this with further amazing swims in 100 free (58.40), 200 IM (2.20.06) and the 400 free where her time of 4.19.93 was fast enough that she made the Target Tokyo Final, a higher level final event for those aiming for the Tokyo Olympics in 2020. This weekend it was the turn of Elisabeth Yaneske. On 22nd April 2016 Elisabeth won gold in the 800m at the Scottish Masters Short Course Championships in Aberdeen. In a time of 10:23.22 Elisabeth was 7 seconds faster than in this event last year and a minute faster than her closest competitor. These are all great achievements from swimmers who train consistently well, and continue to improve as a result of their attendance, attitude and ability.

Taxi Drivers Help Tackle Child Sexual Exploitation

Taxi drivers in County Durham are to be trained to spot tell-tale signs of sexual exploitation of children.

All Hackney carriage and private hire drivers licensed by Durham County Council are to be required to undergo Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) awareness training, after more than half of people responding to consultation supported such action.

Already 683 taxi drivers – almost 40 percent of the 1,757 drivers licenced by the council – have received CSE awareness training on a voluntary basis.

Further free training sessions have been arranged by the Durham Local Safeguarding Children Board.

In consultation on changes to the council's hackney carriage and private hire licensing policy, 56.2 percent of respondents agreed that all taxi licence applicants should be required to undergo awareness training to assist in the prevention and reporting of sexual exploitation.

As a result, all applicants will be required to undergo the training before they can be licensed and existing drivers who haven't already completed one of the training sessions will have to attend one by 1 September 2016.

Knowledge tests for new applicants will also be

changed to include questions around CSE awareness.

Cllr Brian Stephens, said: "One of the primary aims of taxi licensing is to protect and safeguard the public, especially our children and young people who are among the most vulnerable groups in society.

"By making it a requirement that all drivers undergo CSE training, we hope that we can help them spot signs of abuse and act on it accordingly." A number of other revisions have been made to the licensing policy, which was approved by full council earlier this month.

The policy has been amended to include some new requirements for both licensed vehicles and drivers to improve on existing standards and help safeguard the public.

For example drivers will be required to have their identification clearly visible to passengers and new vehicles will have to meet tougher emission standards.

The use of CCTV in all licensed vehicles will be strongly encouraged and drivers will be required to sign up to the Disclosure and Barring Service Update Scheme.

Basic numeracy testing will be introduced as part of the knowledge test while older vehicles will be required

to undergo more frequent testing. The amended policy will also see drivers have their licence suspended if they do not present their vehicle for testing at a specified time.

The consultation sought the views of members of the taxi trade, trade representatives, taxi service users and all relevant authorities and organisations.

BIGGER FINES FOR USING MOBILE PHONE WHILST DRIVING

The Institute of Advanced Motorists (IAM) has welcomed the Department for Transport opening up a public consultation on stricter penalties for using a hand-held mobile phone whilst driving. The DfT's consultation is

looking for feedback on proposals for increasing the fixed penalty notice level from £100 to £150 for all drivers.

It also invites views on increasing the penalty points from three to four points for non-HGV drivers, and three to

six points for those that hold a heavy goods vehicle (HGV) licence and commit the offence whilst driving an HGV.

Neil Greig, IAM director of policy and research said: "Forcing all drivers caught using a hand-held mobile for the first time to attend a re-education course would be a really positive step.

"For many, smartphone use has become an addiction that we can only start to cure through some form of therapy. The IAM does not object to tougher penalties but we do believe that the real deterrent is fear of being caught. That fear can only be increased by increasing the numbers of traffic police on our roads."

The DfT's report launching the consultation (reference 1) cites the IAM's survey in July 2015 on drivers taking selfies at the wheel (reference 2) The IAM found that 9% of drivers surveyed admitted taking a selfie whilst driving within the previous month – a figure that increases to 19% of 25-35 year olds.

The survey also discovered 8% of drivers admitted to driving while using a video-calling application such as FaceTime and Skype to make and receive video calls, rising to 16% among 18 to 24 year olds.

Neil added: "Technology has caused this issue and technology offers one route towards reducing the distraction effect of mobile phone use. It will not be easy to retrofit many of these solutions but the IAM is supportive of trials and pilots to show whether automatically switching off phones when moving can deliver safer roads."

Campbell's brace takes him to 22 goals this season, achieved in just 26 games. Five of his goals have come
