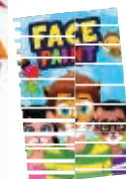

NEWTON AYCLIFFE MARKS ARMED FORCES WEEK



The Mayor of Great Aycliffe, Councillor Jed Hillary, attended the War Memorial outside St. Clare's Church on Monday, 20 June 2016 at 11 a.m. to raise a flag on behalf of the Town to mark the beginning of 'Armed

Forces Week'. The Mayor was assisted by Officers from Aycliffe Armoury and the Barnard Armoury. Standard Bearers from the Royal British Legion were present together with members and representatives from

the Club.

The outdoor Service was conducted by Revd. Elizabeth Bland from St. Clare's Church and Arthur Middleton played the bagpipes whilst the Mayor raised the flag. Veterans and members of the public attended to mark this annual occasion.

After months of campaigning Britain has voted to leave the European Union. Having passionately campaigned for a Remain vote, I, like many, am deeply disappointed by the result and concerned about the impact of this decision on our region and our country. Britain's fragile economy has already begun to feel the effects of a Brexit vote. I worry what this will mean for businesses and jobs in the North-East, especially when over half of the 11,000 jobs on the Newton Aycliffe industrial estate rely on EU trade in some way.

As the UK enters into a long period of economic uncertainty, business leaders throughout the UK are withdrawing or postponing future investment as they consider whether Britain remains the most attractive option to start or expand their business.

As the clarifications and back-tracking have begun, I fear that some voters may have based their decision on the half-baked lies and wanton mistruths of the



Vote Leave campaign.

Within hours of the result, Nigel Farage disowned a pledge to spend the £350 million we supposedly send to the EU each week on the NHS. Days later, this was followed by Iain Duncan Smith who denied promising this during the course of the campaign at all, despite this claim being emblazoned on the Vote Leave bus.

Don't forget it was this figure which was spent countless times over by the Leave campaign on anything from the NHS to agriculture to regional development. Moreover,

after months of telling voters that a vote to leave the EU would enable Britain to control immigration, Leave campaigners, such as the Conservative MEP Daniel Hannan, have now admitted that voters expecting immigration to fall significantly would be 'disappointed'.

Sadly, these misleading claims which unsurprisingly have since been removed from Vote Leave's website do little to restore voters' faith in a political system which is increasingly considered broken.

This has been a long, gruelling and divisive campaign. Yet, the British people have spoken, with the majority of voters

supporting a leave vote. However as disappointed voters may be by the result, and however regretful some may be for the way they voted, it would be disrespectful and undemocratic to simply hold the same referendum again. Now we must respect the outcome and move forward with the challenging task of negotiating Britain's exit from the EU and healing the rifts caused by the campaign. We must hold the Leave campaigners' feet to the fire for the promises they have made throughout the referendum campaign and work to secure the best possible deal, not just for the UK, but especially the North East.

Latest Greenfield Gallery Programme

This season's Gallery Programme at Greenfield Arts is now available showcasing lots of wonderful work from local and national artists of all disciplines. We begin with a showcase of the fantastic work by students studying for GCSEs in Visual Arts at Greenfield Community College, called Unfolded. It will include various art forms including sculpture, photography and graphics and is open from Tuesday 5th July to Friday 15th July 2016.

We also have Robert McManners who combines two of his passions – his art and his love of birdlife. Although illustrated realistically his birds by contrast often live in a background of fantasy as he combines traditional illustrative portrayal with a stylised graphic design technique giving a sense of fantasy to the image. This exhibition is open from Thursday 28th July to Wednesday 24th August 2016. We then move on to Derek Slater's work, from Thursday 1st September to Wednesday 21st September 2016, which involves paintings from his time spent working for British Coal, reflecting upon people's struggle in heavy industries and ecological issues. The range of his subject matter allows him to work in both a figurative and abstract style. The paintings also relate to a thought provoking aspect to what is happening on the planet and in industry.

This year we also host the previously unseen works by the wonderful artist Norman Cornish from Thursday 29th September to Wednesday 9th November 2016. It will include his works along with the Tyne Tees TV documentary 'The Shapes of Cornish' from the early 1970s (30 mins). "I paint human beings. I paint their hopes and their shapes and their attitudes and the feelings I have when I look at them. The images come from the people. They create them. I am just the medium." Norman Cornish. This is the second time we have

been privileged enough to host his work and can't wait to see it on display.

Last but not least we host the work of Alan Clements, from Thursday 24th November to Wednesday 21st December 2016, since discovering digital photography Alan takes his camera everywhere—from Death Valley to Tokyo. This exhibition has two broad themes—the human face and textures. Faces appear in many variations from the steampunk in Whitby to the courtesan in her gown in Venice. Textures range from patterns made by rivers photographed from 3,000 feet, to the crumbling ochre-shaded walls of Venice. Each exhibition will host a preview night 6pm – 8pm the night prior open to the public, with the exception of 'Unfolded' which hosts a preview on Tuesday 5th July 6pm – 8pm. 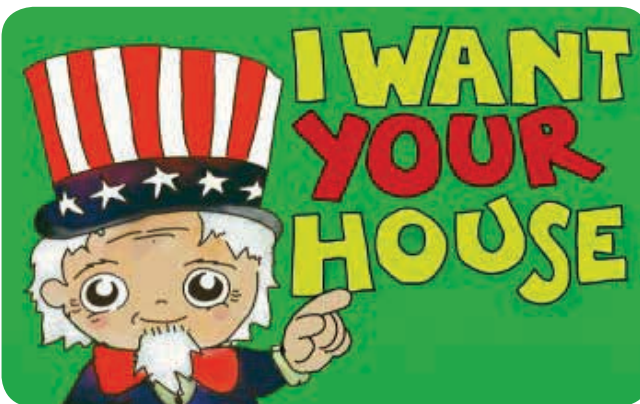

Free Cycle Stands from the Council

A pilot project offering businesses and community groups free cycle stands is being extended into 2018 following an overwhelming response.

Funded by Durham County Council and provided by social enterprise ParkThatBike, the scheme will now be extended for a further two years with the aim of providing 400 more stands for premises across the county.

The project was previously launched as a pilot scheme in December 2015 but, after installing 35 stands and generating a substantial waiting list, has now been extended. The aim of the initiative is to help boost business by offering cyclists secure parking as well as encouraging healthier and more environmentally friendly travel.

Arch's Durham Workspace at Pity Me, just outside Durham City, was one of the companies to benefit from the pilot scheme.

Katie Mason, Assistant Workspace Manager said: "The initiative was designed to improve and promote sustainable transport and economic development within the

Rotary Honours Ron Heighington Curate Celebrating 65 Years Marriage

Ordained Priest



Journalist Ron Eyley found himself making the news this week when, to his complete surprise, he was presented with a special award for outstanding service to the Rotary Club of Newton Aycliffe and Rotary International.

The Robin Watson award presentation was made by Rtn Denese Cartwright during her Presidential Lunch at Whitworth Hall Hotel.

Ron, a member of the club for just over a year, was presented with a trophy and certificate in recognition of his public relations work in support of Newton Aycliffe cancer victim Anna Swabey whose campaign to raise awareness of the need for more government funding for brain tumour research recently earned her a Rotary UK Young Citizen of the Year award and a Durham County Council Chairman's Medal.

"I couldn't believe it when the announcement was made. I feel very honoured," said Ron. Before moving to the North East, Ron was a long-serving member of the Rotary Club of Hope Valley in Derbyshire where he was a former President and Paul Harris Fellow.

Ruth Dawson is ordained a priest at the age of 71 after having her faith tested by a series of difficult family experiences. Ruth, who trained at Lindisfarne Regional Training Partnership, becomes a priest at Heighington, St Michael and Darlington, St Matthew with St Luke.

Born in Scunthorpe, Lincolnshire, she made her career in the commercial sector, beginning as a secretary and progressing through to Administrative Management and Personnel work.

She said: "Since mid-life I have felt that there was something more I had to give, but the time never seemed to be quite right.

"Then, after retiring, I found I could no longer ignore the pull that I felt to more formal ministry, and so I commenced training to be a Reader. This opened my mind even more and made me realise my deep desire to be involved in growing Christ's body in the Church through the administering of



the sacraments.

"My first year of curacy has been the most challenging. The day after ordination, my youngest daughter told us she had breast cancer, and I began travelling down to Lincolnshire every three weeks to be there for her chemotherapy sessions. Then, in August I suffered a stroke and was hospitalised for almost six weeks.

"On my discharge, my husband, whose health has been vulnerable for a number of years, was once again unwell. The week before Christmas things improved for him and we thought that once again we were "out of the woods". Sadly, on 29 December, he suffered a massive and fatal heart attack at our home.

"A month later my son was made redundant. All this has proved immensely challenging – trying to rationalise and understand, trying to see where God was amidst all this sadness, trying to discern how I could turn this to a positive in my own life and in my ministry. Trying to embrace new life after illness and bereavement.

"This Easter was a poignant time as my own experiences and challenges made me realise even more the sacrifice Jesus made for us – how hard it is to carry the cross.

"When I had my stroke I feared that I would not be able to carry out my ministry but I realised that it was happening even whilst I was in hospital. I came closer to the suffering of others and I found that nurses and patients, on finding that I was ordained, wanted to talk to me about faith. I feared that my parishioners might feel they could not approach me with their problems because of mine, but in fact my vulnerability gave me more empathy with them and they approached me more. This was even more apparent following my bereavement.

"Thankfully, I feel that slowly I am turning my negatives into positives, with the help of being held in prayer and supported by family, Church family and very good friends. And all the time I feel that my husband is with me, supporting me in what I do." Ruth will be ordained Priest by the Bishop of Durham, The Right Reverend Paul Butler in Durham Cathedral at 5.00pm on Saturday 2nd July 2016

The system does not take into account the fact the vehicle is not even in the car park and if you make a mistake entering your reg number you will receive a ticket.

This probably breaks the Equality Act 2010, where people should not be discriminated against because of a disability, and potentially hundreds of people will have been caught out by this error in the programming of Aldi's system.

MINI POLICE ON THE BEAT

Primary School Children Join Forces

On Wednesday 6th July, Stephenson Way School will host the launch of the Mini Police project in Newton Aycliffe.

Durham Constabulary & Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership (GAMP) have joined forces to launch the Mini Police project in Newton Aycliffe. GAMP, through Area Budget Funding, has supported the introduction of Mini Police Officers in four schools: St Francis, Sugar Hill, Woodham Burn and Stephenson Way. This exciting project will see 80 Mini Police Officers being recruited from the participating schools. The programme is exclusively for Primary School children aged 9-11 years (academic years 5 & 6). The children will be chosen by the school, as the school has detailed knowledge about each child involved. The children

then volunteer to participate in a variety of events.

The events are either Community led Initiatives - projects nominated by the children, with them taking ownership in tackling local community issues e.g. Speedwatch, litter picking etc, or Force led Initiatives - planned by Durham Constabulary throughout the year, supported by the children through pro-active community engagement e.g. Bikewise, Durham Miners Gala etc. Duties can include giving out leaflets, directions, fundraising, delivering force messages in a fun way. There will also be Reward Events - Visit to HQ (including Control Centre, Armoury, and Tour of HQ building), Visit to Dog Section, NPAS Base Visit and Tea with the Chief Constable. The Mini Police launch in the GAMP area will also see the recruitment of the

750th Mini Police Officer. To commemorate this achievement, Ron Hogg, the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington, and Deputy Lieutenant Mr Simon Still will attend the launch. Additional funding to help introduce the initiative into the GAMP area has also been secured from Great Aycliffe Town Council through their Youth Council. The funding from GAMP and GATC will be used to purchase 80 Mini Police Uniforms and to help with transport costs. Brian Riley, GAMP Coordinator, said: "Children's encounters with the police can have a lasting effect on how they view and engage with them as adults." "I'm hopeful that projects like the Mini Police will help develop long term relationships between the community and the Police".

WITNESS APPEAL

The matter in question is under investigation by local CID Officers - with support from the NPT, who are appealing for anyone who may have witnessed the altercation that took place or who may have information relevant to the enquiry to contact them via 101, quoting reference number 525 of the 25th June. Aycliffe Cricket Club News Free Junior Tennis in Newton Aycliffe

Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, were looking set for victory away at Yarm 1st XI in the NYSD 2nd division when rain brought proceedings to a halt with the homeside still 114 runs short of their victory target.

Aycliffe scored an impregnable 237 for 9 from their 50 overs with major contributions coming from in-form Michael Howe (sponsored by Keziah Benson Photography), who smashed his third half century of the season, finishing on 65, Luke Telford with a season's best 55 and 38 runs from Mark Woodhead.

Yarm were struggling at 124 for 5 after 33 overs, when the umpires called a premature end to the game because of the inclement weather.

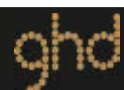

see all eighteen here: bit.ly/CDPIOV). The consultation then asks 50 questions designed to give us a chance to set the underlying principles and direction of the CDP. The CDP, as you know, will frame our local development until 2033, so it is vital we get involved. Last time, residents intervened to place Newton Aycliffe at the centre of the Council's plans, and it is important that we do so again. I would recommend people to attend the consultation event at the Youth Centre on Monday 25 July, and to consider the consultation in its entirety. However, may I draw readers' attention to FOUR issues of particular relevance to the future of Newton Aycliffe:
QUESTION 11: ECONOMY
The Plan proposes a target of 73% employment, and outlines the principles which might underlie the County's economic development (paragraphs 3.5-3.29: bit.ly/CDPIOemp). Forreast Park (the extension of Aycliffe Business Park) is specifically identified as a location for growth (paragraph 4.11), and Question 11 asks whether the CDP should focus on the most attractive economic market areas. Aycliffe people will wish to agree, stressing not only the primacy of Aycliffe Business Park and the need for the Forreast Park extension, but also that the CDP might include the flexibility to extend the Business Park even further, should the opportunity arise before 2033.
QUESTION 13: HOUSING
Question 13 gives four options as to where future housing

might be situated – do we put it mostly in Durham City, or spread it to various degrees around the County (paragraphs 3.34-3.56: bit.ly/CDPIOhou)? Some places actively do not want new houses. By contrast, a town seeking to thrive would support the 'Wider dispersal' option, which places most growth in the south of the county. I often hear it suggested that Newton Aycliffe does not feature in the Council's plans; this is our chance, should we wish, to offer to be the focus of future growth!
QUESTION 22: HIGH QUALITY HOMES
Question 22 talks about the kind of housing we want, and gives an opportunity to ask that developers be required to build bungalows, multi-generational housing etc. Here is our chance to say what kind of housing Newton Aycliffe needs as we seek to grow (paragraphs 4.39-4.49: bit.ly/CDPIOqua).
QUESTION 31: TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE
Question 31 asks if there are any places which need a new road (paragraphs 4.76-4.93 bit.ly/CDPIOroad). I will be repeating my request for a north Darlington bypass connecting Aycliffe Business Park directly to the A66, but I guess that readers will have other suggestions – not least the pressing need to upgrade the C35 to Rushyford. We must not allow the CDP to become wholly about Durham City's traffic system. You can respond to the consultation by post to FREEPOST SPATIAL POLICY, or reply online via: bit.ly/CDPIOw
