Simpasture Layby Complaint Answered

Councillor receives explanation on the type of kerb used following complaints by vehicle owners.

Dear Cllr Adam,

I refer to your request for a response to a letter about parking opposite Simpasture Shops in Newton Aycliffe.

The original plan was to create a layby at the location. However, during the design period it was established there are British Telecom cables beneath the footpath where the layby was proposed.

For the layby to be created at this location, the BT cables would have to be lowered or

re-routed, at significant cost. It was agreed instead to leave the footpath at its current height and strengthen it so that it can withstand the impact of parked vehicles.

Existing bull-nosed kerbs were replaced with splayed kerbs to make it easier for vehicles to access the path. I hope this information is useful.

Police Commissioner's 5 year Pledge | WITH A LITTLE HE

Recently re-elected Police, Crime and Victims'
Commissioner (PCVC) Ron Hogg will today lay out his plan for the next five years.

The newly drawn up plan sets out aims and objectives for Durham Constabulary and includes how he will work with the police and other agencies, such as the council, to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour. Reflected in the plan as the key theme throughout, is Ron's commitment to supporting victims, a pledge he made as part of the election campaign earlier this year. In addition to this, the plan has three clear which are to inspire confidence in the police and the criminal justice system, to support victims and vulnerable people, and to tackle crime and keep our communities safe.

There are also eleven objectives within the plan including tackling cybercrime, reducing the harm caused by alcohol and drugs and improving road safety.

Earlier this week, the plan was put forward to the Police and Crime Panel and it will now be taken out to public consultation for a period of two months.

During this time Ron will be attending a number of public events and meetings across County Durham and Darlington and hopes to hear from, and consult with, as many people as possible.

People can also feed in their views via the PCVC's website. Ron said "It is vital my plan delivers what matters to local people so I would like as much feedback as possible. This is so it can all be taken into account

before I finalise it later this year.
"This is so important because

once finalised I will use it to set the aims and objectives for the police and the other organisations I fund and hold to account. I am confident the new plan will build upon the work that's already been done over the last few years in continuing to ensure County Durham & Darlington remains one of the safest places in the country to live and work.

Chair of the Police and Crime

Panel, Councillor Joy Allen, said: "I welcome the PCVC's new 5 year plan and his intention to consult with as many people as possible during the summer I urge everyone living and working in County Durham and Darlington to take part at one of the various engagement events or simply complete the online survey





INNOVATIVE SERVICES HELP TO IMPROVE LIVES AND KEEP PEOPLE SAFE

RESIDENTS. businesses and victims of crime have more opportunities to access services and support, than in previous years, in a report published today.

The development of a new Victim Care and Advice Service across County Durham and Darlington, a new Live Link system for victims to give evidence by video in court, without being face to face with the perpetrator, and a new Community Peer Mentors Project are just some of the initiatives of the last financial

In the latest Annual Report for 2015-16 published by Ron Hogg, the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner (PCVC) for County Durham Darlington, encourages victims of crime or anti-social behaviour to seek the support available to them. Ron said: "It was a really

successful year for instance implementing new services for victims and the vulnerable and improving engagement with communities. I have worked closely with partners and I would like to thank them for the tremendous effort they have put into helping improving the lives of our residents.

"Support has been made available for those suffering from long-term neighbour anti-social behaviour, vulnerable people can seek help from isolation

and victims of crime can get support from the recently commissioned Victim Care and Advice Service.

"My annual report also provides information about provides information about how I have spent my budget, including the £150,000 I awarded, jointly with County Durham Community Foundation, to local projects. These projects included convision to the projects of the projects These projects included services to young people, victims and offenders.

"I am also working with partners and the business community across the region to help businesses to stay protected from threats such as cyber crime."

Another successful initiative last year aimed at reducing reoffending in the community is the voluntary adult offender scheme Checkpoint, which has seen a 90 per cent success rate in its first phase.

"This scheme targets low and medium level offenders at the earliest stage of the criminal justice process" said Ron.
"As well as offering them an alternative to prosecution and giving them the opportunity to turn their lives around. this scheme also helps reduce the number of future victims of crime throughout County Durham and Darlington.'

ROAD RE-SURFACIN

I read with interest the article in Newton News regarding re-surfacing of the roads in Ashfield and although the writer seems happy with their result, I must comment on how unhappy I and several other people are about the resurfacing work carried out two weeks ago in Oakfield.

The condition of the edge of the new road outside my property in Oakfield is absolutely terrible. The actual main body of the road is ok but the edge of the new surface is a whole one inch higher than the footpath in parts.

One of my neighbours actually commented about this to the workmen on the day, asking 'since when was the road supposed to be higher than the footpath?' and the answer he received was 'we are only doing what we have been told to do'.

Unless this is fixed, there is a potentially serious accident waiting to happen. The work was supposed to be carried out over two days and as requested, people moved their vehicles ready for commencement on the Wednesday morning. However, the workmen didn't turn up until Thursday, hence the work was done in one day and it is obvious that it has

been a rushed and amateurish

Apart from the edgings being unsuitable at certain points, the road surfacing was too high at all the gutters. As a result of this on Monday this week, workmen turned up with equipment and have drilled out a six inch border around all the

gutters, and placed cones over them until they get back to fix the botch-up.

I wrote to Durham County Council who replied to my complaint saying this has been passed to the Highways Section to investigate - sooner rather than later I hope. Name & address supplied.

According to the club's founder, Mr. Heaven, doing nothing is something which does not come naturally to most people: "The problem is that people are always trying to tidy things up, or tidy things away, and in so doing they get in the way of those natural processes which provide food and shelter. Nature abhors a vacuum, and left to its own devices it will fill those gaps with plants and animals." Deciding that doing nothing was the best thing to do, Mr. Heaven then decided to do something about it. Starting with the existing hedgerows, which are now only cut every three years to provide nesting sites and winter feed for native and migrating birds, the school is inching towards a more environmentally sensitive model of grounds management, where the ethos is one of 'help only where it is

needed.' Woodham students are currently busy cataloguing its stock of wild orchids, and can boast an impressive 56, including Spotted Orchids, Northern Marsh Orchids, and two specimens of the very rare Bee Orchid.

That this is a remarkable occurrence is made more so by the fact they have not been planted, but have lain dormant

in the soil for many years. awaiting the opportunity to flower. "Nature is resilient." flower. Says Mr. Heaven. "For fifty years since the school was built, these plants have been awaiting their opportunity to reproduce. By only cutting the grass at the end of the summer, instead of all year round, we are providing a breathing space for our native species - which in-turn provides food for a variety of animals - who themselves become food for others.'

This approach, it seems, isn't only good for the environment, it is good for people too. Members of Wildlife Club are enrolled on a conservation course run by the prestigious John Muir Trust, and are currently working towards their Level 2 Award. They are also learning new skills, such as haymaking, and the school is working with a local farm to harvest their rich grasses for use as winter feed. It is, says the Wildlife Club facilitator, a win-win situation.

And what do the Wildlife Club's members think of their latest achievement? "The achievement? flowers are nice," says Award winner Allanah Milburn, "I like the fact we get to work outside, and I like the fact we get to do things, like the pond we are digging at the moment." So struck is Allanah with what she has helped to achieve she has set her heart on becoming a conservation worker. "I think people need to take more care of the world," she says, makes better people of them when they do.


