On October 1st an event is taking place at Locomotion, NRM Shildon to celebrate the 191st anniversary of the Stockton and Darlington Railway which will fall on September 27th. The celebration is being organised by the Friends of the Stockton and Darlington Railway, which was founded in 2013 to protect and promote this important part of world railway heritage and, hopefully, stimulate economic regeneration through heritage based tourism.

As a hugely important part of the celebrations, a Community the celebrations, a Community Sponsored Jaunt is being organised by Newton Aycliffe Rotary Club with the support of the Mayor of Shildon, Aycliffe Town Council and Locomotion, NRM Shildon, amongst others amongst others.

The aim is to use the new tarmac path installed by Durham County Council, linking Aycliffe and Shildon, alongside the railway line which follows the route of the Stockton and Darlington Railway. We hope to symbolically unite the two towns – Shildon, the 'cradle towns – Shildon, the 'cradle of the railways' and Aycliffe,

presently witnessing the re-birth of the railways with the arrival of Hitachi in the town.

The Community Sponsored Jaunt will begin at Aycliffe railway station at 2pm, with free refreshment available at Locomotion for the participants making the two mile journey along the path. The proceeds from sponsorship monies are to be shared with the NSPCC, and the participants' own nominated charities. The Mayor of Great Aycliffe, Jed Hillary, will see everyone off. As part of the overall celebrations, the mayor of Shildon, (who is chair of

the Friends of the Stockton and Darlington Railway), is organising a civic reception at Locomotion and receive the participants of the Community Sponsored Jaunt on the forecourt of the museum. Speeding motorists are being trapped by this system on Aycliffe roads. Don't expect to be stopped - you will just receive a notice in the post that you were driving over the speed limit. The purpose of Speedwatch

is to catch drivers going well above the speed limit and to send letters to them following being caught going above the limit.

This is merely educational and the letter details the time, date and location that they were seen going over the limit as a normal Speeding letter would contain, however there are no fines or points being handed out.

Leading UK road safety charity IAM RoadSmart has said the government needs to make bigger efforts in the areas of drink-drive campaigning and rehabilitation, better enforcement of driving standards and increased education on road safety if

we want to see any reduction on the stagnant road casualty statistics announced on 4th August by the Department for Transport. The charity said that after

decades of good progress, the past five years have seen a disappointing plateau which is not acceptable. Today's figures show there

has been no reduction in drink-drive deaths since 2010

- remaining at 240 deaths a year; there has been no reduction in total road deaths and a 2% increase in serious casualties in the past 12 months (to 31 March 2016). Tim Shallcross, head of technical policy at IAM RoadSmart, said: "The Government must get to grips with five years of disappointing figures now.

# Muddy Mayhem at Hardwick Park Rangers are readying one 40 man-made and natural we have available change, of the UK's top parks to abeliances

of the UK's top parks to ensure runners have a muddy good time when its annual obstacle course race returns

Muddy Mayhem has over the past four years seen thousands of thrill seekers turn out to prove they have what it takes - though as all have discovered, it is no mere walk in the park.

And with two months to go until the run – which takes place at Hardwick Park on Sunday 2 October – work is already underway to ensure that 2016's course is bigger and better than ever.

Durham County Council senior parks and countryside ranger Ross Carrick said: "From a small, very basic 2012. 2.5km event in Muddy Mayhem has grown to become something quite unique in the obstacle course run world, in that although it is only a 5km loop it is packed with nearly

challenges "We take inspiration from horse trial courses, motocross tracks, rock climbing centres, military obstacle courses, adventure playgrounds and - having personally become hooked on taking part in mud events running we incorporate the best ideas from around the country,

but with a County Durham spin. On the day runners, who must be aged 16 or over, can tackle the 5km course either once, for £35, or twice, for £40, with waves

of participants setting off between 11am and 3pm. Participants can go it alone or discover what trials Ross and his team have come up with alongside friends and colleagues - with discounts

the obstacles are getting much bigger and much more fun - or harder - depending on which way you look at it. "But I would encourage everyone to have a go at all the obstacles as you will be really surprised at what you can do. "I run a lot of these events

on my own and I sometimes come up to a 12ft wall and think, 'How am I going to get over that?' Yet I'll give it a go, and if I fail you can guarantee that there'll be someone next to me who will give me a leg up until I get over that wall. "That's the great thing about

these events, it's all about teamwork and community. whether you know people or not. '

Many of the obstacles are months in the planning, and Ross said this year will see vet more added to the already jam packed course. Ross said: "My favourite obstacle would have to be 'Don't Swallow' where runners are required to go through a four metre tunnel under one of our bridges, half submerged in water.

"Unfortunately we only have one tunnel at this bridge, so we are hoping to redevelop this obstacle for 2016 by adding some similar size pipes and putting these further around the course, in the main lake. "Our most challenging obstacle would have to be 'Steeple Chase' which is a series of climbing walls which range in size from around 4ft to 10ft, finishing

in a backward facing overhang. "And I think the most fun obstacle would have to 'Greased Lightning' which is a water slide down a long tarpaulin in the amphitheatre bowl outside the Visitor Centre. It is quite steep so you can get some speed up with a running dive.'

Places for Muddy Mayhem are selling well, with earlier time slots, between 11am and 12pm already filled up. Anyone who wants to take part is advised to sign up as soon as possible to avoid missing out For more information and to sign up visit www.durham. gov.uk/muddymayhem or call 03000 262 899.







#### THE RAINHILL TRIALS. MANCHESTER

CrossFit All Out Coach Chris Knight took part in the Rainhill Trials competition in May. The no-qualifier event is open to all, via a ballot where keen CrossFitters register and are chosen at random. The 320 athletes were given a series of WODs (workouts), allowing them to be ranked with similar level athletes in one of four subsidiary competitions, from 'elite' to 'beginner'.
