







Artist's impressions of the new entrance to Newton Aycliffe Library and Leisure Centre and the interior of the Library


Newton Aycliffe Rotary President Nora Scott this week faced

Work has already taken place to refurbish the leisure centre's swimming pool area and upgrade the changing rooms. latest phase of







<u>(B6444 HEIGHINGTON LANE, AYCLIFFE)</u> (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2016

The Council, on 29/09/16 made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, to close all vehicular traffic a 30 metre length of B6444 Heighington Lane equidistant from the centre of Heighington Station Level Crossing, Aycliffe to enable level crossing maintenance works to be undertaken. The maximum duration of the temporary closure under the Order is 18 months and is required from 08/10/16 and for the duration of the works, anticipated to be on two consecutive Saturday nights (between 7.00pm and 9.00am) and two consecutive Sunday nights (from 7.00pm to 7.00am). However, on rare occasions, alternative dates for closures may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly. **Alternative route**: to vehicular traffic from the eastern side of the closure from B6444 junction with A167 at Aycliffe Village, southerly via A167 to Coatham Mundeville Interchange (J59), south westerly along A1(M) to Burtree Interchange (J58) then northerly along A68 and A6072 to the western side of the closure, and vice versa. A local (non-HGV) diversion will be signed from of the closure, and vice versa. A local (non-HGV) diversion will be signed from the eastern side of the closure, northerly via Whinbank Road, left onto Horndale Avenue then south westerly along School Aycliffe Lane to the A6072 Roundabout inction with B6444 to the western side of the closure and vice versa.




