Speakers Impress Aycliffe Rotary Club

Rotarians in Newton Aycliffe heard how life for students at Woodham Academy was not simply about gaining good academic results.

Headteacher Christine Forsyth said that it was equally important to give young people the right values in such areas as good behaviour and good manners to prepare them for future life in the community.

In an impressive review of recent developments at the Academy, Mrs Forsyth (pictured left with Rotary Club President Nora Scott) revealed how one third of the students were now involved in some form of sport and how this had led to a marked improvement



in academic results.

The aim of the Academy, she said, was 'Achievement for All' Mrs Forsyth was introduced by Rtn Syd Howarth and thanked by Rtn John Snowball.

The club recently welcomed as guest speaker Mr John Elliott, chairman of Ebac (the acronym stands for Excellent Bishop Auckland Company) which began life in 1973 building industrial dehumidifiers and then developed the UK's first mass-produced domestic dehumidifier. It subsequently introduced a range of refrigerators and freezers and more recently a successful range of washing machines which are now much in demand in the American market.

After moving to Aycliffe EBAC now stand for "Even Better Aycliffe company". Both Mrs Forsyth and Mr. Elliott were described by members as 'truly motivational speakers'

Greenfield Kept Calm During Scary Incident

Dear Syd, I would like to go on record thanking the Headmaster David Priestley and all the staff at Greenfield School, for the professional and caring way they handled the incident that took place outside the school on October 5th, when two youths were seen to be brandishing an air rifle.

They should be commended for taking the decision to keep the pupils safe and secure within their classrooms, away from any potential harm outside the school gates, until the Police arrived.

As a parent of two girls who attend the school, I am told the environment was calm and lessons were taking place as normal, throughout the "lock down" period.

Newton News spoke to Greenfield Community College and the following reply has been submitted by David Priestley, Executive Headteacher:

"As you can imagine it was really important to keep everyone safe and calm while the police undertook their investigations and dealt with the matter. We feel that the situation was handled in an appropriate and robust way and are hugely grateful to both the staff and pupils for their calm and sensible approach. As soon as we were able we shared the information that we had by texting the majority of the parents to explain the situation with letters being sent to those not on our automated system."

Unfortunately the most concerning and disturbing part of this episode, took place outside the school on Thursday October 6th, when a clearly misinformed parent, for his own mystifying reasons decided that instead of asking for a private meeting with the School to air his view, he would instead stand outside the school as pupils were leaving for the day and hurl abusive, threatening language and behaviour at the Headmaster in full view of pupils and parents. I do hope that on reflection this individual will issue an apology to pupils and the School for any upset his frightening and needless behaviour caused.


Despite valiant efforts by two players, Paul Ryans (NARUFC) and Gareth Hockey (HRUFC) to revive him, and later by the Emergency Services, Paramedics and the medical team from the Great North Air Ambulance Service, Terry never re-gained consciousness. Terry, 48, joined Aycliffe in the early 2000's as a sprightly thirty year old and played for over five seasons.

He was out of the game at Aycliffe for a spell due to illness, but returned again in 2015 with his two sons Matt and Jack. The boys had spent some time in Darlington playing junior rugby.

Terry had heard about the start of second team rugby at Aycliffe and wanted to offer his guidance and experience. He also wanted to play rugby with his two sons whom he was immensely proud. Aycliffe were delighted with his return. This was a tragedy in its truest sense - a father of five losing his life whilst playing rugby, the game he loved. Terry was a very popular player, a family man, a man with morals and high standards, always smiling, always approachable. He was always last to the game and last on the pitch. The warm up was superfluous to Terry's game plan and a hot drink was his pre-match preparation. Yet once the game started he played the game with zest and enthusiasm, never losing the will to win.

Terry had a calming, almost laid back, demeanour off the pitch. He loved a cup of tea and a natter... no alcohol for Terry.





Aycliffe Tough Away Trips

Just one point for Newton Aycliffe FC last week as the team faced two tough away trips. Seaham Red Star had won seven games in a row but Aycliffe managed to hold them to a draw in an entertaining game on Tuesday night. Red Star took the lead & put in a strong first half performance. However Dennis Knight equalised early in the second half & Aycliffe piled on the pressure with the home side being saved by the woodwork on more than one occasion. Saturday saw a visit to current League champions Shildon. Injuries to Scott Howes & Michael Riley led to Andy Ferrell playing at left back while central defender Alex Kitchen had to be substituted after just 15 minutes due to a head injury. Shildon looked impressive in the first half with Michael Rae scoring on 7 minutes capitalising on a scramble in the Aycliffe box. They had a further chance on 25 minutes when the centre forward headed wide. Shildon were to score twice more before halftime with two goals in two minutes. The first a lob over keeper Lewis Brass, followed quickly by a header from a corner. Shildon were dominating the play & looking



for a fourth before halftime but in added time conceded a free kick just outside the box. Knight took the kick & found the net to make the score 3-1 at the break. Shildon came close to restoring their three goal lead early in the second half but saw a double clearance off the line as Aycliffe hung on. Throughout the game Aycliffe were indebted to midfielder Brian Close who dropped back into central defence in place of Kitchen & did well to keep the home side at bay. Just after the hour Aycliffe pulled another goal back. Once again Knight was the

scorer, this time getting a head on a fine cross from Paul Garthwaite. Shildon again moved forward & forced a fine save from Brass. Aycliffe worked hard for an equaliser & came close with 20 minutes remaining when a skilful run through midfield by Zak Boagey led to a shot by John Campbell flying wide of the goal. Shildon had the last significant chance on 80 minutes, hitting the post. The game ended in unfortunate circumstances when Knight was sent off for a second yellow card following what seemed an innocuous challenge. Rugby Club Remain Unbeaten

On Saturday 8th of October the 1st XV travelled to face Hartlepool A in a friendly to fill the gap left by Seaham, who were unable to field a full squad. Hartlepool 1st XV play two leagues above Aycliffe, so given that this was their A team, most of whom would be expected to be pushing for first team contention, this was set to be a good test of Aycliffe's ability to deal with higher level teams. Despite some difficulty finding the ground, Aycliffe arrived in good time, and following a focused warm up, lined up to receive the kick. The first contact of the game set the tone for the next eighty minutes, with a solid chase forcing the Aycliffe receiver into touch. Aycliffe realised that this was going to be a real test of their abilities both as individual rugby players, and as a team. The first ten minutes saw Aycliffe dictate the pace of the game through solid defence and smart work at the breakdown. Hartlepool were clearly shocked, as they were pinned back into their own half by the more junior side.

This pressure soon told as wing Ben Walton outpaced the Hartlepool wing on the outside to dash over taking the visitors in to a five to nil lead, which was converted by fly half Alex Lineton. Aycliffe were straight back onto the front foot from the restart, again pushing Hartlepool back. Strong defence combined with physical close phases from the forwards and bruising runs from the backs further frustrated Hartlepool, and fifteen minutes after his first try, wing Ben Walton made it a brace with an almost identical try, taking the Hartlepool winger on the outside and despite fallacious calls of a forward pass from the embarrassed wing, the try stood to take Aycliffe into double figures, the conversion slotted by Lineton. The pressure was reapplied as rampaging wing James Thacker crossed for another

try, continuing his record of scoring in every fixture this season. Following this try, there was some scrappiness off the ball from the clearly frustrated Hartlepool forwards, but Aycliffe held their composure and went in nineteen points to the good. The second half saw Aycliffe return to the field with an unchanged fifteen. The game degenerated somewhat at this point, with Aycliffe allowing themselves to be dragged down to Hartlepool's level, which resulted in antagonistic scrum half Ash Bolsover being sent off the field for ten minutes. This man advantage soon told, as Aycliffe were caught out on the drift, leaving a gap in midfield which the Hartlepool 7 stormed through to score, which was converted to take Hartlepool within two tries of the visitors. Shortly after this try, a frustrated James Cocks was overly vocal toward the referee, which cost him ten minutes. With Aycliffe now down to thirteen, pack leader Niall Kelly and Captain Lineton took control of their players, demanding a higher

level of intensity to make up the two-man disadvantage. The period of play that followed summed up Aycliffe's success thus far; solid defence with smart commitment to rucks resulting in no tries for the home side. With Cocks still in the bin, wing Thacker joined a scrum on the Hartlepool five metre line to add ballast. Following a strong scrummage, the ball came loose and was pounced upon by Thacker, who charged at the line and crossed the line with four Hartlepool defenders in tow. This try was converted by Lineton, taking Aycliffe into a twenty-six to seven lead. The final minutes played out with Aycliffe showcasing more smart rugby, maintaining possession and running down the clock to victory. The game finished with a total of four tries run in by Aycliffe with the backs taking all four. Tries came from Ben Walton (2) and James Thacker (2). Three of the tries and were converted by Alex Lineton. Final score Hartlepool A 7 - 26 Newton Aycliffe 1st XV.
