

60 Aycliffe Families Affected by Benefit Cap

A new, reduced cap on benefits is being rolled out from 7 November. The changes reduce the benefit cap from £500 a week to £384.62 for a couple or person with children; and from £350 to £257.69 for single adults. This is a Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) cut, not a Council cut. The change will save the government £1.4 million a year.

Claimants affected were warned by the DWP in May/ June, and again in September. 653 households in County Durham will be affected. those, 361 households (55%) are facing reductions in their housing benefit of up to £49.99 and the remaining 292 (45%) face the loss of the majority of their Housing Benefit. 33 families will be losing between £100-£150 a week. 60 of the affected families

live in Newton Aycliffe. 33 families are livin tenants. DCC's Housing Solutions welfare reform officers have been contacting tenants affected by the changes and undertaking the County Durham Triage with them, ensuring they are adequately housed, housed, maximising their income, and helping them find employment.

The Housing Providers and Housing Solutions Team will be completing Discretionary Housing Payment applications with customers where relevant

and these applications will be considered as a priority. 119 families affected in the County by the benefit cap are on the "Troubled Families" Programme; they are being offered additional support. If residents have any queries or think the cap should not apply to them they should call the DWP Benefit Cap helpline

VOLUNTEER DRIVERS

A County Durham based charity is appealing for volunteer drivers. Supportive, formerly known as the Social Resource Centre, was established in 1994 to deliver quality, people centred social care services.

At present the organisation has two primary areas of delivery - domiciliary care and volunteer driver transport. The third scheme is its health appointment car scheme to provide subsidised transport to health related establishments. To help the organisation continue to meet the needs of the communities it serves, it is now looking to recruit 150 new support drivers. The volunteer drivers transport service was established in 2010. All drivers receive training and support and a mileage allowance of 40.55p a mile from the moment they leave their front door.

Teaching Assistants Strike

Teaching Assistants at Horndale School joined others on strike over the County Council's new pay structure which will leave many to lose £1,000's a year.

They explain their jobs are essential and include speech therapy emotional support, first aid, playground duty, breakfast club, trips, phonics etc.

37 of the county's 243 schools – mainly nurseries and special schools – were closed during the walkout, with 76 informing parents that some classes would see some interruption.

DCC say it is not fair that the vast majority of teaching assistants are paid for working 37 hours a week, 52 weeks a year, but actually work only 32.5 hours a week and only during the 39 weeks of term-time. This means other council staff can work up to almost six and a half weeks more, as well as more than half a day more every week, for the same money.

LOCAL PHARMACIES **AT RISK OF CLOSURE**

Figures revealed on 2nd November show six pharmacies across Sedgefield constituency are at risk of closure as a result of the Government's proposed 12% cut to pharmacy funding. With only 22 pharmacies across the whole of the constituency, the number of pharmacies at risk of closure is high.

Having campaigned to protect community pharmacies, Phil Wilson, MP for Sedgefield was dismayed to discover the number of pharmacies at risk in his constituency He has however praised the relentless campaigning of local communities and the Labour opposition, which has resulted in up to 9 pharmacies across Sedgefield constituency continued receiving government help through the Government's Pharmacy through



AYCLIFFE LEUKAEMIA **VICTIM CAMPAIGNS** FOR BLOOD DONORS

A charity champion from Newton Aycliffe who's chemotherapy undergoing is urging people to sign up to the bone marrow register. Maths teacher Paul McGeary Maths teacner r au most was diagnosed with Acute Promvelocytic Leukaemia (APML), earlier this year, having been in remission from an initial diagnosis back in November 2014. Freeman

Hospital The is currently conducting a global search to find a match for the 34-year-old to improve his chances of a full recovery, while he continues chemotherapy treatment at James Cook hospital. Finding the perfect match could take months or years - and may never be found.

Sporting a 'Stand Up To Cancer' hoody, Paul said: "It's a massively under-subscribed database and we desperately need more people to register – not just for me, but for the many others out there who need a transplant. "We want to raise awareness of the donor register and dispel some myths that the general public has about being a donor.

"I naively assumed a donor had to be one of your nearest kin, and if I couldn't find a match then unlucky. Since this has happened, I've learned a donor could be my next door neighbour, or it could be someone on the other side of the world"

Many people are put off donating bone marrow thinking it a bone marrow extraction, but that's not the case - you simply give blood. Whilst it might not be a perfect match for me, they could be a match for someone elsewhere in the world.

"If a match is found then the donor gives more blood and that is then farmed by the experts and transplanted into the patient, so it's not as harrowing a process as people think

During his ordeal, Paul's rock has been his wife, 33-year-old Becky who, like her husband, puts on a brave face.

Every now and then those dark thoughts do creep in – that I could be a widow and Niamh could be fatherless," she says. "The whole process has completely changed our life. We just take it day to day. We can't look too far ahead and it is hard to be a wife and a mother when you don't have plans for the future.

After being diagnosed with leukaemia two years ago, Paul and Becky embarked on a fundraising campaign, dubbed "Not One Inch", which has hit a new milestone with Paul's fundraising has reached £23,000





Co. Durham Ready for Winter

With more than 42,000 tonnes of salt in stock, a fleet of vehicles on standby and hundreds of salt bins in place, County Durham is ready for winter.

Preparations for the cold weather have been underway for some time but Durham County Council's winter maintenance programme for 2016/17 is now all set.

The budget for this year's programme is £5.2 million, which will once again enable the council to treat 1,700km of roads during normal winter conditions.

Representing 45 per cent of the network, these roads are known as priority 1 are mainly A and B roads, bus routes and locations where there are known to be specific problems.

While more minor routes are not normally treated during normal winter conditions. in times of prolonged bad weather a secondary network of priority 2 routes will be treated when resources are available

Gritting is carried out by a fleet of more than 70 vehicles including 37 large power gritters, 33 trailer gritters and six snow blowers.

The council also has access to a network of local farmers who are able to help clear roads in rural areas if required.

Meanwhile, residents around the county have access to more than 2,300 salt bins to treat local roads and

pavements when needed. Cllr Brian Stephens, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, said: "With the weather now turning cold, it's important that we are ready for the drop in temperature.

"Our overall aim is to keep the county moving whatever the weather so that people can get to where they need to be and access any services they require.

This year, members of the public can track the gritters as they make their way around the county's roads using an online map. Tracking devices on-board the gritters enable the map to be updated when gritting is complete on each

'However, we appreciate that it's also just as important that we keep people up-to-date with road conditions and our gritting work. 



Support Town Football **Club in FA Vase Match**

Newton Aycliffe FC begin their Buildbase FA Vase campaign this Saturday (12 November) with a home tie at Moore Lane Last year's fantastic efforts, which saw Aycliffe reach the last 16, mean that they have been exempt until the Second Round Proper of the national competition. The game will kick off at Moore Lane at 3:00pm with admission f6 adults & f4 concessions.

Our visitors on Saturday will be Worksop Town, claimed to be the fourth oldest football club in the world. Worksop play in the Premier Division of the Northern Counties East League which is the equivalent level to the Northern League Division One

The second half was a cagey affair with both sides seeking a breakthrough but without really troubling the keepers.

Aycliffe now face an away league game at Bishop Auckland on Tuesday 6 November before turning their attention to Saturday's cup game.
